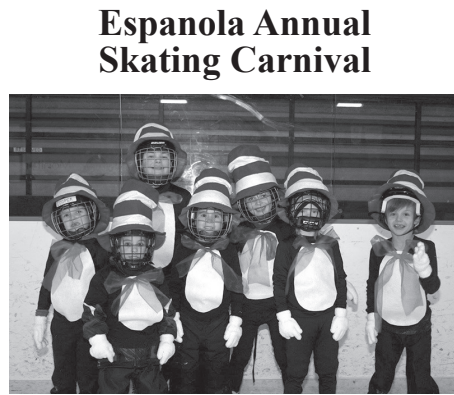

NOTICE OF A PUBLIC MEETING Concerning Applications for Consent

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers will hold a public meeting on **Wednesday, February 22, 2017 at 7:00 p.m.**, at the Township Office, 11 Birch Lake Road, Massey in order to consider proposed applications for Consent under Section 53 of the Planning Act, RSO 1990 as amended.

File No. C-17-01: The purpose of this consent application is to provide for a new lot in the Rural Zone. The property is described as May Township, Lot 1, Concession 1, Parcel 5953 and 392, #121 Cutler Lake Road. The land subject of this application is not subject of any other application under the Planning Act.

File No. C-17-02/17-03/17-04: The purpose of these consent applications is to provide for 3 new lots in the Rural Zone. The property is described as Salter Township, Section 36, Parcel 2531 and 2673, #15 Reserve Road. The land subject of these applications is not subject of any other application under the Planning Act.

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers in respect of the proposed consent, you must make a written request to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers. This will also entitle you to be advised of a possible Ontario Municipal Board Hearing. Even if you are the successful party, you should request a copy of the decision since the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers decision may be appealed to the Ontario Municipal Board by the applicant or another member of the public.

To appeal the decision to the Ontario Municipal Board, send an appeal form to the Clerk of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers outlining the reasons for the appeal. You must enclose the appeal fee of \$300.00 for each application appealed, paid by cheque, made payable to the Ontario Minister of Finance.

If a person or public body that files an appeal of a decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers in respect of the proposed consent does not make written submission to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers before it gives or refuses to give a provisional consent, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss the appeal.

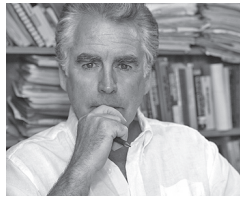

Recipe

I recently travelled down to my sister's house to attend a concert. My Brother-in-law had thoughtfully prepared a yummy meal for us to enjoy before heading out to the venue. Accompanying a delicious pasta dish was this ooey-goey, cheesy loaf of pull-apart garlic bread. If you want to impress your guests and make them delightfully happy – plunk this loaf right in the middle of your table! We quickly tore that loaf apart, devouring it, and my brother-in-law was the hero for the night. The recipe calls for sourdough, but any dense and crusty bread will work. Trust me – it will be a hit!

Cheesy PullApart Garlic Bread

- 1 sourdough boule (or other loaf of dense bread with a crusty top)
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter, melted
- 2- 4 cloves garlic, minced (depending on how garlicky you want it or how big your cloves are)
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1/2 cup shredded mozzarella cheese

DIRECTIONS

Preheat the oven to 375°F. Using a serrated knife, cut a crosshatch pattern in the bread by slicing it lengthwise and then widthwise without cutting all the way through the bottom crust. Melt the butter in a small saucepan or in the microwave then stir in the minced garlic. Brush or drizzle the garlic butter inside the bread, carefully pulling apart each section so it's distributed throughout the entire loaf. Divide the cheeses evenly throughout the bread by tucking it into each slice. Place the filled bread on a piece of foil and wrap the foil up and around the bread. Bake the bread for 15 minutes, then unfold the foil and bake the bread an additional 10 to 15 minutes until it's crisped slightly. Remove from the oven and serve immediately.
