Draft Presented For Espanola's 10 Year Recreation Plan – 41 Recommendations In All



The proposed Espanola Parks and Recreation Strategic Master provides comprehensive and sustainable multi-year framework of short (1-3 years), medium (4-6 years) and longer-term (7+ years) priorities for the development and enhancement of sport and recreation, as well as community quality of life, in the Town of Espanola.

It was presented last week at council chambers and is the first of its kind for Espanola.

Many of the recommendations, there are 41 in all, if implemented, can be expected to extend well beyond the time line of 10 years - particularly as it relates to decisions regarding capital investment and plans.

Recommendations range from extending the Al Secord Trail to more literacy

developing a Recreation and Leisure Guide for the Town. One of the most important recommendations is undertake a detailed User Fee Study to confirm the true cost of service for the delivery of recreation (facilities and programs), and in completing that study, ensuring rates are reasonable for users, but also cover all costs.

The study also suggests revamping the Red McCarthy Ball Fields to accommodate inclusive park facilities, including BMX, skateboarding and so much more; the re-establishment of a recreation committee which includes community members and more diverse program development.

And, with population and demographics changes, as well as changes in the delivery of programs and services, the study stresses it is imperative evaluate the Town's recreation delivery system - that is, identify the issues, opportunities and challenges. The draft plan put together

programs with the library to by Sierra Planning Management included consultation with the public, stakeholders, Town staff and Council as well as an analysis of Town's assets, facility revenues and expenditures, conditions facility provision standards of based on population and participation data.

The Parks and Recreation Strategic Master Plan is a municipal guidance document designed to further effective planning, budgeting implementation.

The public can review the 75-pages on the Town's website at espanola.ca from Thursday, July 13th Thursday, July 27th.

Public comments are more than welcome and will be taken into consideration before the final plan is drafted for presentation to council and the public, which could be as early as mid-August.

The survey is available on line also. The comments will be accepted until July 27th and will be used to put together the final draft for council review.


There's also the faux rich, poor people who spend as if they're crazy rich. Actor Johnny Depp who normally earns \$20 million for a really bad movie is



Caring Charity Closes Its Doors – Espanola Royal Purple Officially Disbanding After Six Decades Of Service

A bittersweet gathering took place last week in Espanola when a long-time charitable group handed out its last dollars to various organizations before officially disbanding.

The women of the Espanola Royal Purple have officially disbanded after 63 years. With only eight members, the ladies were no longer able to continue providing their charitable services to the community.

The women's group is the female arm of the Espanola Elks and was formed in Espanola back in 1954.

In its' heyday, the organization had well over 50 members, catered many functions and was well known for its delicious dishes. The ladies also assisted with various events from the popular annual Elks Canada Day Picnic to bingos and helped out the community with countless events from baby to wedding showers to memorials and award dinners.

The money they raised always went to local area people and groups, which needed the help.

As part of disbanding the group, they made several before officially donations closing the books, \$17,800 in all, including \$5,400 to the Espanola Regional Hospital Foundation (\$4,000 for the park, \$1,400 for another foundation program), \$4,000 to the Northern Cancer Foundation for the Sam Bruno PET Scan, \$3,400 to the Espanola Helping Hand Food Bank, and several smaller donations to the recent victims of house fires in Espanola, the Sunshine Quilts for Cancer, Diabetes Education Program, Autism Society, Muscular Dystrophy and Easter Seals, as well as scholarships to both Espanola High and École Franco-Ouest Secondaire.

Recipe

I love mushrooms and I love Bruschetta, combine the two and I'm a happy girl. My friend made these for our mutual friend's



Birthday party and we gobbled them up. They were so tasty that I have made them twice since. This is the original recipe as found. I have to confess that I cheat; I put the filling in immediately and grill it all together from the start. I use feta cheese and diced onion as opposed to garlic, due to personal preference, but feel free to make the bruschetta filling anyway you usually enjoy it.

Grilled Bruschetta Portobello Mushrooms

- 3 tablespoons olive oil, plus extra for greasing grill pan
- 4 large Portobello mushrooms (about 5 inches in diameter), stemmed
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 3 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, plus extra for drizzling
- 1 clove of garlic, minced or finely diced sweet onion
- Splash of balsamic vinegar
- 3 small to medium sized vine ripened tomatoes, cut into 1/2-inch pieces
- 8 oz diced feta or mozzarella cheese
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh basil leaves

Prepare the barbecue (medium-high heat).
Using a spoon, scoop out the gills of the mushroom caps and remove the stems and discard. Drizzle 3 tablespoons of olive oil over both sides of the mushrooms.
Sprinkle the mushrooms with



salt and pepper. Drizzle olive oil on grill pan to prevent mushrooms from sticking. Grill until the mushrooms are heated through and tender, about 5 minutes per side. Meanwhile, whisk the extra-virgin olive oil and garlic in a medium bowl to blend. Add the tomatoes, cheese, and basil and toss to coat. Season with salt and pepper. Divide the tomato and cheese mixture into each cap, cover and grill for about 3 minutes or until cheese has melted.
