Little NHL A Packed Event Once Again: 46th Annual Little Native Hockey League Tournament Featuring 200 Teams!

Ontario Regional Chief Isadore Day says this year's annual Little NHL tournament will continue the decades-old tradition of bringing together Ontario's First Nation communities and fostering a sense of community and friendly competition among youth.

"The Little Native Hockey League continues to be an annual March Break tradition that, for many of our youth, is the most exciting time of the year," said Ontario Regional Chief Isadore Day. "It's an exciting time for the players, parents, and families and friends, many of which travel from all over Ontario to show their love for the game of hockey and for their communities in Mississauga."

The 46th Annual Little Native Hockey League tournament, hosted by Moose Cree First Nation, kicked off Sunday night with an opening ceremonial puck drop from Moose Cree member and former NHL All-Star, Jonathan Cheechoo, who is also

this year's Honorary Chair of the tournament. Several teams from the Espanola, North Shore and Manitoulin Island take part in the tournament every year. Its roots are found on Manitoulin Island.

"As a Little NHL alumni, it was always exciting for me as a child to head to this tournament and to be able to represent my community of Moose Factory," said Honorary Chair Jonathan Cheechoo, leading up to the tournament. "Through the years I participated, I'd come to learn that through the four pillars that the Little NHL stands for: respect, education, citizenship and sportsmanship, that I carried these values with me as I moved on in my professional career as a player of hockey, and more importantly in my life as a whole."

The tournament started out as a 17-team affair in Manitoulin Island in 1971 and this year's installment welcomes a record-breaking 200 teams and over 2,500 players from all over Ontario for five days in Mississauga. The tournament will

utilize over 10 ice surfaces and approximately 40 hotels, while generating millions of dollars towards the local economy.

"Since its foundation, the Little NHL tournament and its founders have demonstrated their passion and commitment to our

communities and to our youth. Over the years, the exceptional work of the organizers and the tireless volunteers has helped mold our young athletes into exceptional human beings both on and off the ice," said Ontario Regional Chief Isadore Day.

Vale Shutting Down Stobie Mine - Closing Sudbury Mine Later This Year Could Affect 230 Workers

In a simple to the point Friday morning press release, mining giant Vale has announced that it plans to close Stobie Mine later this year, which could affect 230 jobs in Sudbury.

The company said it was a "necessary decision but a sad one," citing low metal prices as one of the reasons for the shut down.

Vale also said it was running out of quality ore, and recent seismic activity prevented miners from working below the 3,000 foot level.

The closure will likely lead to job cuts, but the company said it will try to minimize the impact on workers.

No date has been set for the closure.

Stobie Mine began life as an open pit mine in 1890 and the underground mine was dug in 1914.

Over the years it produced 375 million tonnes of nickel and copper ore.

Stobie and the neighbouring Frood Mine have been the most productive mines in the history of the Sudbury basin.

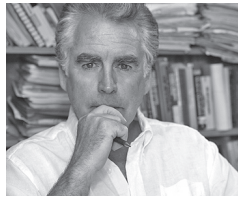

Espanola Man's Trial On Sex Charges Underway In Sudbury Supreme Court:

Social Media Used For Contact For Sexual Favours, Drugs And Alcohol

The trial of Paul McColeman, 45, of Espanola got underway on Monday, March 13th in Sudbury Supreme Court of Justice with Judge Patricia Hennessy presiding.

McColeman is facing 36 charges including communication for the purpose of child prostitution, luring children, sexual exploitation and indecent exposure involving an alleged 17 male minors from 2006 to late June 2014 in Espanola.

He was initially arrested July 10, 2014, by Espanola Police and charged with 70 offences involving young boys. Those charges were amended to 75 charges involving 19 boys following the preliminary hearing held in Espanola last year, but were amended once again following a meeting of the Crown and the Defence in late February of this year.

After getting bail, McColeman was re-arrested in late August 2014 and charged with breaching his recognizance. In December 2014, he was acquitted of the two alleged breaches and released again on bail with strict conditions.

As of press time, the court heard on Monday, March 13th that from 2006 to July 2014, about 20 pre-teen and teenage Espanola boys became aware of, or dealt with, Jennifer Johnstone, Hyperchick or Treber Boucher. While the first two individuals would allegedly suggest "dares" involving acts of a sexual nature, the third allegedly would line up meetings with men for sexual acts, according to the Sudbury Star.

In both cases, alcohol, drugs such as marijuana or Percocets, or even cash would be paid for the sex acts. All three personas,

the Crown alleges, were actually Paul McColeman.

Cyber crime work, Assistant Crown Attorney Philip Zylberberg told the court, linked McColeman and his Facebook account to the Treber Boucher Facebook account.

"These are accounts being accessed at the same residence at the same time," Zylberberg told the court. "The same Internet account is being used to access both the Treber Boucher and Paul McColeman Facebook accounts."

Zylberberg said McColeman's trial on sex charges involving young boys would be divided into two groups of alleged victims in specific time periods: 2006-2010 and the second covering 2011 to July 2014.

Sex acts were committed for rewards from 2011 to 2014, Zylberberg said. The sex acts included anal, giving and receiving oral sex, masturbating while being watched, standing fully clothed in McColeman's shower and spying on McColeman as he showered.

In some of the cases, the male teens contacted turned down the requests. But between 2011 and 2014, at least five teens had been involved in alleged sexual activities with a man they knew to be McColeman, said Zylberberg.

The period 2006-2010, in contrast, involved sexual "dares" or "missions" by a woman named Jennifer Johnstone, either on MSN or on Facebook, who also went by the name Hyperchick.

"The Crown alleges Jennifer Johnston, Hyperchick and Paul McColeman are the same person," said the assistant Crown attorney.

The court also learned it was an Espanola grandmother who first alerted police almost three years ago that Paul McColeman and young boys in Espanola were allegedly exchanging sex favours.

The woman testified Monday that her teen grandson and a teenage male friend were talking on her veranda in June of that year when her grandson came into her home upset.

"(The friend) told him he could take him to Paul McColeman, if he did a sexual act, he could put out for sexual favours," recalled the woman. "He told me that if he wanted alcohol or drugs, he just had to do something sexual to Paul McColeman. (My grandson) appeared hurt and became angry."

The grandmother said she called the friend into her home and asked him to talk to her about what he had told her grandson. The friend told her the sexual favours involved manual or oral sex. "He said there was no anal sex," she said. "He said sometimes if (McColeman) doesn't want to do it, he (would) send another to do it. They would wait in the bush by the Espanola Hospital. They would clap or whistle to alert the kids."

The grandmother said the friend told her if a boy wanted to line up performing a sexual act in exchange for drugs or money, they had to contact a Facebook account under the name of Treber Boucher. The grandmother said the friend told her he had done sexual favours for drugs or alcohol and that he was also recruiting other male teens for McColeman.

The grandmother said she checked the friend's Facebook account and brought up Treber Boucher. She said a comment Boucher made about having sexual activity with a young male child upset her.

"He said he had been with a nine-year-old, but could he get him a six-year-old?" she said. "That's when I called police."

She initially contacted Crime Stoppers, but then she and her daughter-in-law visited Espanola Police on June 25. During cross-examination, the grandmother said the teen friend said he knew who Treber Boucher was.

"He said Paul McColeman," she recalled. "(The Facebook account) was under the name of Treber Boucher, but all the kids knew it was Paul McColeman. He said he gets the messages from Paul McColeman, but it was under the name of Treber Boucher."

The trial continues and is expected to take six weeks.

Recipe

There is nothing simpler and more satisfying than a fresh, homemade muffin and a cup of coffee in the morning. These orange flavoured muffins with a crunchy topping are a great way to start the day. Be careful not to over stir, I limit myself to 5-6 large strokes, stopping just before the mixture is totally combined. This keeps your muffins from being tough. Bake according to your oven; my oven bakes very hot so I had to bake these at 350 degrees.



Good Morning Muffins

- 2 cups Flour
- 1/4 cup Sugar
- 1 Tablespoons Baking Powder
- 1/4 cup shortening (can Use 1/8 Cup Shortening With 1/8 Cup Butter)
- 1 cup Orange Marmalade (1 small 250 ml jar)
- 1/2 cup Orange Juice
- 1 teaspoon Vanilla
- 1 whole Egg, Beaten

Topping Ingredients

- 3/4 cups Sugar
- 1 teaspoon Cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon Nutmeg
- 1 Tablespoon (plus 1 Teaspoon) Melted Butter
- 1/4 teaspoon Salt
- Wheat Germ (optional)



Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Sift together flour, sugar, and baking powder. Place in a mixing bowl. Use a pastry cutter to mix in shortening (or butter/shortening if desired). Mix marmalade, orange juice, and vanilla in a small bowl. Pour into dry ingredients. Beat egg and pour into the bowl. Mix all ingredients together gently. In a small bowl, mix topping ingredients. Fill muffin pans with batter. Sprinkle a heaping teaspoon of topping ingredients over each muffin. Sprinkle wheat germ over the top for an extra crunch if you wish. Bake for 20 to 22 minutes until done. Remove from pan and place on wire rack to cool.
