Girl Guides And The War I Helped Them Avoid

Good grief! Now President Donald Trump is going after the Girl Guides! Recently the Girl Guides of Canada cancelled their trip to a summer camp in California, worried that some kids of colour might be detained and turned back at the U.S. border. Members of the Guiding Movement are quite proud of their policy of complete "inclusivity."

When asked if he knew the meaning of "inclusivity" President Trump replied: "Yeah, like at Mar-a-Lago where guests get drinks and meals included in their \$200,000 membership fee."

Girl Guides selling cookies never come to my door anymore. Many years ago when Kelly Beck was an aggressive, doe-eyed Brownie with Mary Kay ambitions, I had to rent storage space in town to keep all the cookies that kid sold me. Kelly was Girl Guide Salesperson Of The Century and I was her only customer.

Today the Girl Guides of Canada are as progressive as ever offering with nut-free and Kosher cookies, advocating anti-bullying campaigns and embracing transgender girls. They've recovered nicely from a crisis I wrote about in March, 1993 when out of the blue the Girl Guides announced they were dropping the Queen from their membership oath. This announcement to snub the Queen sparked a bit of war when the Monarchist League of Canada retaliated by threatening to boycott Girl Guide cookies. (Not making this stuff up.)

Today, in retaliation for the monarchists' boycott of their cookies, the Girl Guides of Canada announced that they will now refuse to help little old ladies across the street. Any little old lady wearing a Union Jack pin will be spun around until she gets dizzy and led into traffic. To cover their butts, Girl Guides will immediately start wearing "tushie cushions" fearing little old ladies with Union Jack pins.

From now on, when Jehovah's Witnesses are spotted coming up the driveway, ultranationalists plan to sneak up behind them with boom boxes and play the national anthem.

Upset that the Guides also made referencing God an option in their pledge, Jehovah's Witnesses confirm that they will still visit homes where Girl Guides live, but they will not discuss God.

Irritated, public protests were then planned in all major Canadian cities where thousands of uniformed young girls will stand at attention in front of Jehovah's Witnesses Halls and hum the national anthem.

Furious over the anthem protests, Jehovah's Witnesses announced that from now on parents of Girl Guides will now have to pay for each issue of The Watchtower. And if they take out a subscription, they won't get the alarm-clock signing bonus. In a move that even their national organization does not condone, Girl Guides began scraping the cream filling out of all cookies ordered by Jehovah's Witnesses. In what first appeared to be a conciliatory move, the Jehovah's Witnesses have stated they will now play the national anthem at meetings. Further questioning

Angered by the bad publicity they've been getting in Canada, Jehovah's Witnesses claimed they would no longer speak to Canadians directly. Starting next Sunday, they will be sending Jehovah's Witnesses mimes door-to-door.

Then an ugly incident occurred in the Toronto subway when an ultra-nationalist, a monarchist, a Jehovah's Witness and a Girl Guide all entered the same car, at the same time, apparently by coincidence. Five gang bangers in the same subway car who were beaten up and admitted to hospital claimed they were just minding their own business.

Looking back, you have no idea how close we came to national chaos and how lucky we were to avoid it. We very nearly had to bring our peacekeepers home from the Balkans and put them to work on our city streets. As I said, I never have Sparks or Brownies or Rangers coming to my door with cookies anymore. Either Wainfleet is not part of their marketing territory or ... those Girl Guides have real long memories.

Big Changes In Handling Espanola's Garbage Collection

By Rosalind Russell - There are some major changes coming to Espanola's garbage collection, including less bags, only two per week, and the likely introduction of the Green Box Program.

Espanola CAO and Treasurer, Cynthia Townsend says the main reason for the change is to get the town closer to the Waste Free Ontario Act.

Under the Act, landfills would no longer accept food and organic waste a few years from now.

"While council has directed staff to investigate cost savings in everything they do that is not the primary reason for the proposed changes," explains Townsend. "The reduction of approximately \$6,500 in contract costs is in recognition of the additional recyclables that will be collected and redeemed by the contractor.

"The main driver behind the proposed changes to the twoclear bag limit is to move the community closer to what is going to be required by municipalities under the new Waste Free Ontario Act.

"The intent of the legislation is to achieve a circular economy with the goals of zero waste going to landfills and zero greenhouse gas emissions from the waste sector." Townsend adds the Green Box Program will likely become a reality for Espanola as well.

"Within the next few years, we will most likely see food and organic waste banned from landfills, which will then require a green box collection similar to what many of the larger municipalities are undertaking now.

"Many other municipalities, including some of our neighbours, have already reduced their bag limits and introduced clear bags to encourage recycling. The proposed changes are simply keeping up with what is going on around us so that as the new legislation is introduced it won't be such a big adjustment to our residents," emphasizes Townsend. Under the current legislation,

residents are allowed four bags not weighing more than 50 pounds each. Businesses are allowed eight bags, twice a week with no weight limit specified.

The new bag limit will be two clear bags and one small grocery bag sized privacy bag with a weight limit of 40 pounds.

Townsend says bag tags will also be available, but administration has not worked out the details or the pricing, let alone a start date.

"We do not have a start date yet. Council has agreed to the changes, but the contract has not yet been finalized outlining the dates, so that said, there will be a six-month phase-in to allow residents to use up their current garbage bags."

She adds recycling is continuing as it is now.

Townsend adds council is aware this could cause problems, especially when it comes to dumping waste.

"Illegal dumping may increase and we will have to also do some public education on the fines and possibly use game cameras to catch those who choose to dump illegally," says Townsend. "There really is no excuse for dumping your garbage in the bush and with this legislation there will most likely be steeper fines. People are responsible for their own waste." When it comes to recycling manufacturers. are being challenged to ensure targets are met for ensuring their product waste is reclaimed for recycling. In the staff report which was presented to council there are interesting numbers in the garbage collection stream: 88% of households already recycle and 96% of households regularly have two bags or less, so the changes may not be too difficult for town

residents.
Townsend added there will be some changes coming for businesses, but those details haven't yet been finalized. Businesses may not face reductions in bag limits ... however clear bags may be required.

"I was looking for support for my cousin, Aaron and his little girl, Autumn who is currently at Toronto Sick Kids in the Intensive Care Unit," explained Larissa. "With shared custody of his daughter, Aaron who has worked at Canadian Tire in Espanola for several years travels often with his daughter to Toronto."

Two-year-old Autumn McCulligh was born with a heart condition, but doctors had to wait until she was older to do the surgery. It has not been easy. Her heart has stopped twice and there could be some long-term problems, including mental damage, as a result. But, the doctors still don't know and are constantly monitoring the tiny toddler.

Larissa says Autumn has now stabilized and they are just waiting for the surgeons to make the decision when her operation to repair her heart will take place.

"Ronald McDonald House is awesome, but there are still other expenses that Aaron can't afford," explains

Larissa. "That's why we held a yard sale-bake sale last weekend."

Thanks to the public's generosity, nearly \$1,500 was raised.

Recipe

If you need a quick and easy dinner recipe, this Spinach Parmesan Pasta is a good one. It's a delicious vegetarian dish on its own or nice served as a side



dish. The flavors are simple, but tasty. You can toss in other veggies or add some chicken if you wish. We like to add fresh chopped tomatoes when serving. Using fresh parmesan is a must.

SPINACH PARMESAN PASTA

- 8 oz uncooked pasta (I use spagettini)
- 3 tablespoons butter
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 5-6 cups packed baby spinach (I end up putting in the entire small container 142 g)
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

Add the pasta to a large pot of boiling salted water and cook until al dente. Drain the pasta, reserving 1/2 cup of the pasta water. Set pasta aside. Using the same pot, melt the butter over medium heat. Add the garlic and cook for 2-3 minutes. Add in the pasta and spinach. Gently toss and cook until spinach leaves are wilted. If the pasta starts to dry out, add in some of the reserved pasta water. Stir in 1/2 cup of the Parmesan cheese and toss until combined. Season with salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste. Pour pasta into a large bowl. Garnish with additional Parmesan cheese and serve immediately.



NOTICE OF THE PASSING OF ZONING BYLAW (Planning Act-Section 34(18))

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers passed Bylaw 2017-12 on the 9th day of May 2017.

The land to which the bylaw applies is described as Victoria Township, Section 17, Plan 53M-1278 Lot 13, #40 Sunset Bay Drive.

The purpose for the amendment is to allow for an accessory structure to be closer to the front line than the required setback for a main building, and for a reduced front yard setback at the shoreline in the Resource Recreation zone. This application is not subject of any other application under the Planning Act.

The last date for filing a notice of appeal is June 5, 2017. A Notice of Appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers, setting out the reasons for the appeal. This must also be accompanied by the fee required by the Ontario Municipal Board.

Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal a zoning bylaw to the Ontario Municipal Board. A Notice of Appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a Notice of Appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group on its behalf.

No persons or public body shall be added as a party to the hearing of the appeal unless, before the bylaw was passed, the person or public body made oral submissions at a public meeting or written submissions to the Council or, in the opinion of the Ontario Municipal Board, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.
