Snowbirds Listen Up! Portugal Is Way Better Than Florida

Let's say you're a "Snowbird" and like 500,000 Canadians who go South for the sun each year, you've just returned from Florida having successfully avoided another Canadian winter except we didn't have one this year. Your back is sore from meeting other Canadians hunkered down in dark closets in order to talk politics. You're tired of the daily magic show in which you watch a Canadian dollar turn into 75 American cents. Your neck is sore from nodding in approval to anything said by a local who's openly carrying a firearm. And masochism being an inherited Canadian trait, you're about to book the same place for next winter. Not Yet.

I had friends who drove to Florida this winter while I flew to Portugal. We kept track of our expenses. Here then is an unscientific, but fairly accurate comparison for the many Canadian seniors who winter in warm places.

TRAVEL. At an average price of \$2.25 US per gallon, the cost of driving there and back (\$170 CDN each way) = \$340 CDN. Motel/hotel accommodations for four nights (two down/two back) costs \$135 CDN per night = \$540 CDN. Meals at (\$140 a day) for four days = \$560 CDN. Direct flight on Air Transat from Toronto to Faro, Portugal (\$970x2) = \$1940 CDNall in, including meals, plus I got to my destination overnight, not spending four days of my stay in a car!) Total: Florida =\$1,440. Portugal = \$1,940.

LOCAL TRANSPORTATION. friends had their own car and spent \$210 on gas (100 gallons) = \$263 CDN. Before Easter arrives in Portugal you can rent a small, economy car for as low as \$8 CDN a day. Let's go with \$10 a day for 31 days = \$310 CDN. Same amount of driving

around using 400 litres of gas = \$860 CDN. Because I was working, I did not rent a car this time, so my local transportation costs were a 30 Euro airport/hotel transfer (two people) ... \$172.80 CDN to and from. Two people taking 3 buses a week = \$96 CDN. Two excursions, one to the Portuguese market town of Loule (\$30 CDN) and another to Seville, Spain (\$140 CDN). Total: \$438.80 (Almost anywhere on the Algarve is a short walk to a slew of bars, restaurants and supermarkets.) Getting around: Florida = \$263 CDN. Portugal with Car = \$1,170 CDN. Portugal on foot and bus = \$438.80 CDN.

ACCOMMODATION. My friends got lucky and rented a spacious, 2-bathroom house/apartment in Sarasota on the ocean with a pool for \$3,000 US (normally \$4,000 US) a month including cleaning and taxes = \$4,000 CDN. My onebedroom, one-bathroom, self-catering apartment at the Aparthotel Oceanus in Olhos do Agua/The Algarve costs 1154 Euros for a month = \$1633 CDN. That included daily cleaning with fresh towels, free WiFi in the lobby, the use of three pools, one indoors and heated, ping pong, billiards, free entertainment three times a week (pass on the Reptile Show) and happy hours. (You can get a breakfast option in the pool bar – croissants, rolls, ham & cheese, a fried egg with bacon, juice, sliced fruit and unlimited coffee -\$7.50 CDN per day.) Roof overhead in Florida = \$4,000 CDN. Portugal = \$1,633. MEALS. Groceries are a lot cheaper in Portugal and a very decent bottle of wine costs \$5 to \$7. Let's say 16 prepared meals with wine in Florida (\$30 CDN per meal) = \$480 CDN. Same in Portugal (\$20 CDN

per meal) = \$320 CDN.

Average cost of dinner with wine in a restaurant in Florida (\$85 US) = \$110 CDN. Same in the Algarve is \$36 CDN. My favourite restaurant was the ridiculously low-priced Adega de Ze, a busy local eatery run by two hardworking sisters and a chubby waiter/surly son.

Me: "What's the special?"
Him: "Everything here is special."

Select piri-piri chicken or the Portuguese steak with an egg on top, or pork chops or fish, etc., etc. plus chips and a salad. With that entree you get a half carafe of good wine, plus coffee and dessert (usually cheese cake) and a small shot of Port wine to finish off the meal ... 8 Euros. That's \$11.40 CDN. Most comparable meals in Florida or even Canada would come with a tax of \$11.40!!! So the 16/15 combo of meals in Florida = \$2,130 CDN. Portugal = \$860 CDN.

While accommodations are about half as much in Portugal, gas is the killer at four times Florida pricing. (Today by litre: US = 70 cents CDN. Here = \$1.14 CDN and Portugal \$2.15 CDN!!!) (If you drink and don't drive, you have just found paradise.)

Hit a few buttons on the calculator and whaddayagot? Two people with their own car staying in Florida for one winter's month = \$7,833 CDN. Portugal with rental car = \$5,603 CDN. Portugal by foot and bus = \$3.402 CDN.

FULL DISCLOSURE: I love Portugal and I really don't care for Florida. Flat, boring and culturally-deprived – if the "Sunshine State" wasn't so close to the equator, it would look like Mississauga and feel like downtown Detroit.

On the other hand, there's something very special of dabbling in a different language, trying exotic local dishes and swapping books and stories with fellow expats you happen to bump into and then keep in touch ever after.

In Portugal, they love vacationing Canadians and almost every local you meet has a relative living in Canada. In Florida, they love the money of vacationing Canadians. Your call ... winter in another world or keep going to Canada South.

Taking Autism One Step Further – Espanola Woman Hopes To See New Program Welcomed In Schools In Ontario

An Espanola woman hopes to see a new program she designed become part of the school system for autistic and other special needs students.

Theresa Laurenti attended a national conference, the Canadian Autism Leadership Summit, in Ottawa earlier this month focusing on autism.

She was invited to speak about the program she designed called Edge of the Box Theatre and Movement and shared her successes with the audience.

"The program uses movement, acting, music and dance to bring autistic kids out of their shells."

We find they are changing in all different areas of their lives, parents are coming back and saying they're learning these skills, learning they can overcome huge challenges they faced before taking part in the program," explained Laurenti. "Teachers are also noticing differences in school and I even have some pediatricians asking me, 'what's different in

their lives? We ae seeing huge differences in the way they are expressing themselves.' These kids are making major strides in overcoming their own personal challenges, thanks to the program.'

Laurenti hopes the program will eventually be embraced and adopted by the school system in Ontario for all students to have access to it.

She adds having the kids immersed in the program helps them develop and grow.

"Using something that is really experientially based is a key to what these children need in order to better advance themselves and accelerate the learning in their lives, developing those skills they need to move forward."

The program has been well received in the Espanola and Sudbury area.

Laurenti is now seeking funding to expand it, adding the ultimate goal is to have it become part of school programming in Ontario Continued from front page...

of Local 74, Joanne Lamothe says the two teamed up last year wanting to look at ways to give back to the community of Espanola and area.

"Our local has partnered with McCulloch Insurance in providing all our members insurance needs," explains Lamothe. "This is absolutely wonderful," says McCulloch. "We are so glad to partner together to offer our seniors this wonderful piece of equipment, which will help so many of them. This contribution of this valuable piece of equipment is a great way for us to give back to Espanola, and especially its seniors."


Patricia Poikkimaki, the Resident Care Coordinator, says there are 64 residents in the long-term care wing of the Espanola Regional Hospital and Health Centre.

"This will definitely benefit our residents," says Poikkimaki. "Being able to transfer residents around the long-term care unit will not only benefit them, but also staff. The Sara 3000 Sit to Stand Lift is a safe, easy way to do so."

Recipe

The warmer weather is here and with summer approaching, it's time to put the crock pot and recipes for comfort food away, and fire up the barbecue. Nothing accompanies meat hot off



the grill better than a good salad. Macaroni salad is always a favourite. One of the best things about this salad is that it can be prepared in the morning and simply pulled out of the fridge at supper time. This is an old-fashioned type of macaroni salad made with mayonnaise but with a few special ingredients that make it special including, sweet pickle juice, sugar and fresh dill. These really make all the difference.

REALLY GOOD MACARONI SALAD

Dressing:

- 2/3 cup mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 2 teaspoons Dijon mustard
- 4 teaspoons sweet pickle juice
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon pepper



- 6 cups elbow macaroni, cooked
- 1/2 large white onion, finely chopped
- 4 celery stalks, finely chopped
- 5-6 sweet pickles, finely chopped
- 4 hard-boiled eggs, chopped
- 1 cup green olives
- (pimento-stuffed), sliced in half
- 1 tablespoon fresh dill, chopped
- Additional fresh dill for garnish

Begin by cooking the macaroni according to the package directions. Cook al dente. Drain and rinse under cold running water. Set aside. For the dressing, in a medium-size bowl, whisk together the mayonnaise, sour cream, mustard, pickle juice, sugar, salt, and pepper. Whisk until combined.

In a large bowl, add the macaroni, onion, celery, pickles, green

olives, and dressing. Stir well to coat.

Then add the hard-boiled eggs and dill. Stir again to coat. Add extra salt or pepper to taste. Chill in the refrigerator or transfer to a serving bowl. Garnish with fresh dill before serving.


