New Access - Cup And Saucer Trail To Remain Open

An emergency meeting was held by the mayor and council of the Town of Northeastern Manitoulin and the Islands Tuesday night, May 23rd, in which a partnership was formed between the municipality and the Escarpment Biosphere Conservancy (EBC) to create a new access to the Cup and Saucer hiking trails. Approximately 20 percent of the former trail, which crossed the property belonging to Don Eadie Construction, will be lost with the new trail.

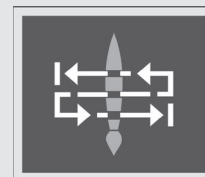
The Adventure Trail and lookout, however, are all part of the EBC properties.

Earlier last week, the owner of part of the trail had informed the public that the popular tourist attraction on Manitoulin Island was going

to be off limits to the public, and that led to a public outcry. The popular Cup and Saucer hiking trail, an extension of the Niagara escarpment, was closed as the owner of some of the trail, including a parking lot and entry point, tried to find ways to keep himself financially solvent.

Casson Eadie, the owner of Don Eadie Construction says he made the decision to close the trail for financial reasons. He has plans to show his portion of the trail to a timber interest, and, if the price is right, the property could be timbered, making the trails dangerous for hikers.

Eadie stressed he is open to suggestions and could reverse his decision if an alternative is found, adding that he knows the trail's importance to the tourism economy.

Cash For College Offers Help For Students Starting Fall Programs

On Monday, May 8, Cambrian College launched a new program that will reduce financial barriers for eligible students who are starting fall semester programs.

The Cash for College program will offer 196 students a \$500 credit to offset the cost of their education.

"At Cambrian, we are always looking for ways to help our current and future students to overcome financial barriers that may prevent them from accessing postsecondary education," said Renée Scott, Director of Student Success and Recruitment.

"Our new Cash for College program will help eligible students who apply for the \$500 fee credit by July 21. All they need to do is answer

a short questionnaire to show financial need. If they qualify, the credit will be applied to their student account in time to offset fees that are due at the beginning of the school year," Scott continued.

Cambrian College set aside \$98,000 to make this program possible for students who start fall programs in 2017. The investment in the Cash for College program is closely aligned with Cambrian's strategic plan objectives, which include enhancing access to postsecondary education.

The Espanola Friendship Circle is a support group for people with Alzheimer's disease or related dementias, and their care partners. Recipe

This cake is good, maybe too good! I have a hard time resisting it when I make it. The cake is thick and very moist. The cream cheese frosting is my favourite. This is another great way to use up over-ripe bananas.

Banana Cake

- ¾ cup butter
- 2 tsps lemon juice
- 2 1/8 cups white sugar
- 1 ½ cups mashed bananas
- 3 eggs
- 2 tsps vanilla extract
- 3 cups flour
- 1 ½ tsp baking soda
- ¼ tsp salt
- 1 ½ cups buttermilk

Frosting

- ½ cup butter, softened
- 1(8 oz) package cream cheese, softened
- 3 ½ cups of icing sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla extract

Preheat oven to 275 degrees (yes the oven is to be at a low temperature). Grease and flour a 9x13 pan. In a small bowl, mix mashed bananas with lemon juice and set aside. In a medium bowl, mix flour, baking soda and salt, set aside. In a large bowl cream ¾ cup butter and 2 1/8 cups sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs one at a time, then stir in the 2 tsps of vanilla. Beat in the flour mixture alternately with the buttermilk. Stir in the banana mixture. Pour batter into pan. Bake in oven for 1 hour or until a toothpick inserted into the middle comes out clean. Remove from oven and place directly into freezer for 45 minutes. (This makes the cake very moist). Combine frosting ingredients and beat until smooth. Spread on cooled cake.

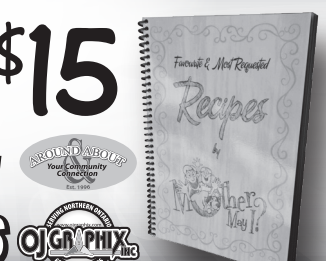
