**Blood Drive Clinic ...** Give The Gift Of Life Monday, November 27th, **Espanola Knights of Columbus Hall** 



By Rosalind Russell - A regional territory manager for Canadian Blood Services is alarmed with the sharp drop in blood donations in Espanola over the last six

Joanne Drake says the drop in donations has dropped dramatically since May.

She says the service sets a goal of 86 units every month, but while they collected 82 in May, donations have declined steadily to 73 at the last clinic held October 2.

Drake says new blood donors are needed in Northern Ontario every month.

"We need up to 200 new blood donors every single month in Northern Ontario to fill the need."

Drake points out anyone 17 and older can donate, there are no longer any age limits. To donate blood for the first time you must be in good general heath, feeling well and able to perform your normal activities,

be at least 17 years old and meet certain height and weight requirements if you are between 17 and 23 years old.

Clarke says there are plenty of other changes to criteria for all types of scenarios.

Cancer: For most types of cancer, you can donate five years after your treatment is complete and you are cancer-free. These include breast, prostate, colon, thyroid and uterine cancer. And for skin cancer such as squamous cell or basal cell, you can donate after treatment.

Flu Shot: Getting the flu shot no longer means you can't come in on the day of your shot. Book anytime. Book an appointment today.

Zika: Travelers to locations outside of Canada, the continental U.S. and Europe have a waiting period of 21 days after their return home before donating blood.

Medications: While taking some medications means you can't donate, most are okay. Most common medications, such as ones used to treat high blood pressure, high cholesterol, or depression are all okay. So, if you are currently taking medication and want to know if you can give blood, ask when you come to donate blood.

Men who have sex with men: Health Canada has approved the request to reduce the blood donation waiting period for men who have sex with men from five years to one year. The change took effect across the country on August 15th, 2016.

Trans individuals: New criteria for trans donors also took effect on August 15th, 2016. Female donors must now book their next appointment 84 instead of 56 days out to protect their iron levels. Male donors are required to measure 130 g/L on the hemoglobin test (an increase from the previous 125 g/L).

The next blood clinic is at the Espanola Knights of Columbus Hall on Monday, November 27th.

The loss is estimated at around \$250,000.

#### **Special Espanola Council Meeting On OPP**

Espanola council held a special meeting earlier this month to find out more about the Ontario Provincial Police costing report released in early Fall.

Council met with representatives from the OPP to review details in the document outlining how the town would transition from municipal police to OPP. It also gave the members the opportunity to ask questions they had as well as relate public comments to the OPP.

The public had, and continues to have, the opportunity to ask questions about the report through the town's website, espanola.ca or by contacting any of the councillors or Mayor Piche directly.

The report also detailed costs, but some are still unknown such as

renovations to the detachment on Highway 17 and the downtown office.

Reps said they use the staggered shift format so there is always staff on duty and available where needed.

They also pointed out that all OPP vehicles including motorcycles are equipped with a web-based real-time GPS system, so supervisors know where officers are at all times and can dispatch them where they are needed.

The public is invited to review the document at espanola.ca and submit questions to the town office.

The review process continues. Espanola council has until March 2018 to accept or reject the proposal.

#### Recipe

My mom made these cookies this week and passed along the recipe to me. I thought I should share it with you. These cookies are super simple to make and are perfect for when you are



craving some cookies but don't have all the ingredients to make them from scratch. They are soft, chewy and delicious.

#### **Jumbo Cake Mix Cookies**

- 1 box of yellow cake mix (or your choice of flavour)
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 2 eggs
  - ½ cup vegetable oil
  - ½ cup chocolate chips
  - Smarties or more chocolate chips for decorating.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Place cake mix in a large bowl.

Stir in the baking powder. Add the eggs and oil and beat well.

Fold in the chocolate chips. Drop on a cookie sheet lined with parchment paper using a large cookie scoop (2 large tablespoons). Top each cookie with 2- 4 smarties or chocolate chips. Bake 9 – 11 minutes.
