





Hatterer of York, Penn., who bravely went where few men have gone before: headfirst into a stinking septic tank. On Australia, with a yellow head and grey purpose. But for a very good reason – to save the life of a dog.

Mark saved Scottie, a Terrier who, while sniffing the sweet fumes of an open cesspool, got dizzy and fell in, thrusting Mark reluctantly into the role of a hero. A dirty, filthy, dripping hero, but a saviour nonetheless.

Mark successfully applied CPR to the unconscious Scottie, bringing him back with the breath of life. In the absence of witnesses, it's still unclear who threw up first. This was the only case I'd ever heard of in which a human rescue technique was successfully applied to a dog – until I met Maureen Fredrickson at her farm in Fredonia, NY.

An absolute animal lover, Maureen has created a kind of healing homestead, where emotionally damaged people achieve recovery by developing 'gentle touch' and trusting body language while interacting with her menagerie of horses, donkeys, chickens and turkeys in her huge, arena-like barn. Animal Systems operates weekend group seminars and one-on-one therapy sessions for people not dealing well with the nightmares of their past. The dogs and birds lived in the house.

One day, Maureen arrived home with

A few years back, I wrote about Mark a prized addition to her lineup of therapists: a young and very sociable Cockatiel. The small crested parrot from body, was everything Maureen looked for in a teaching assistant – gentleness and predictability. Moreover, the bird liked people more than other birds.

Watching him flop around on the kitchen counter that first day, taking measure of his new home, she wondered what to name him. Just then, her roommate Greg came into the kitchen with the dogs, having just finished their daily walk. New bird, old dogs - there was suddenly an awful lot of staring going

Even under the best conditions, a tall, long-snouted Irish Wolfhound can be quite intimidating. To a small bird in an unfamiliar environment, big, gangly Gaibhne (pronounced "Go-Nee") must have looked like the Loch Ness Monster - which could be the reason the young Cockatiel lost his balance and fell awkwardly to the floor.

Maureen's dogs are working dogs and after a long day at the healing barn, the house is theirs for rest and relaxation. So, there aren't a lot of rules in the house, except one: anything that hits the floor is theirs.

Before the bird could pick himself up from an unceremonious landing,

Gaibhne was on him like he was a table scrap from a Thanksgiving buffet. In a flash, two people frozen in fright, watched what the chain of 7-Eleven stores might call The Big Gulp. Before Maureen or Greg could move, the dog had swallowed the Cockatiel whole.

Maureen lunged for the Wolfhound and pried open its jaws, only to see the bird's trembling tail feathers sticking out of the dog's Her only option would be to grab the tail and yank hard, but she was pretty sure she'd only end up with a handful of feathers.

Before she had to make that decision, though, Greg straddled the dog from behind. He had been in the restaurant business and the chart on the wall came back to him:

- 1. Wrap your arms around the victim's waist.
- Make a fist against the victim's upper abdomen, below the rib cage and above the navel.
- your other hand and press into the victim's abdomen with a quick, upward thrust.

After hesitating about where a dog might keep its navel, Greg did the hug and jerk on Gaibhne and in doing

so, performed a successful Heimlich maneuver. bird shot out of the dog's mouth and across the room like a cruise missile - only damp and backwards. The look of surprise on both the dog and the bird was something Marlin Perkins never captured in 25 years of filming Mutual of Omaha's Wild Kingdom.

It may not have been the first ever successful Heimlich maneuver on a dog, but it had to be the only time in history an Irish Wolfhound ever barfed up a parrot. H. J. Heimlich would be proud, if not a little confused.

Both dog and bird lived wearily ever after. Maureen said the Cockatiel never felt comfortable around big dogs after that. And the dog never trusted small birds. Eventually he did go on to eating other snacks.

However, the collision of two unrelated links on the food chain had solved one problem: the bird's name. It was a no-brainer after what Grasp your fist with he'd been through. Maureen named him Jonah.

Espanola Council Accepts Espanola Parks And Recreation Strategic Master Plan

Espanola Council has received the final report that will focus on recreational development in town for the next ten years.

The Parks and Recreation Strategic Master Plan provides a comprehensive and sustainable multi-year framework of short (1-3 years), medium (4-6 years) and longer-term (7+ years) priorities for the development and enhancement of sport and recreation as well as community quality of life in the Town of Espanola.

Many of the recommendations contained in this Master Plan can be expected to extend well beyond the time horizon of 10 years – particularly as it relates to decisions regarding capital investment and plans.

The plan is the first of its kind for the Town of Espanola.

Triggers which necessitate changes in facilities and services are based on a balance of factors. With population and demographics changes, as well as changes in the delivery of programs and services, it has become imperative to evaluate the Town's recreation delivery system - that is, identify the opportunities issues, and challenges.

The plan was formed after consultation with the public, stakeholders, Town staff and Council as well as an analysis of Town's assets, facility revenues expenditures, facility conditions and standards of provision based on population and participation data during the Spring and Summer of this year. The Parks and Recreation Strategic Master Plan is a municipal guidance document designed to further effective planning, budgeting and implementation of the stated goals, objectives and corresponding actions outlined herein to outlined within the document.

The long-term vision statement for recreation in Espanola is as follows: "An active and vibrant community that maximizes its existing built/natural assets to provide exceptional leisure opportunities and quality services for residents and visitors".

The plan also identifies key issues and opportunities and is positioned on the following principles: 1. Investment in recreation for resident retention attraction (i.e. and and families); 2. Addressing needs of an aging the population through recreation Enhancing planning; 3. utilization of existing assets through investment, creative programming and partnerships; 4. Adopting an asset management approach to investment in infrastructure that reflects prudent capital investment - this includes consideration for replacing, decommissioning and/or repurposing assets where warranted; 5. Ongoing monitoring of community demand for events, new sports and activities and where possible, accommodating such demand through the multi-use of assets (that is, through the creation of 'recreation destinations'). 6. The provision of quality services in a responsive manner as well as the development and implementation of policies and protocols that enhance the user experience with facilities; and, 7. A balancing approach to fee setting that encourages broad community participation in recreation and which recognizes the value of assets.

It also contains specifics, such as the formation of a recreation committee made up of members of the public, repurposing some of the land at the Red McCarthy Ballfields for other uses, such as a BMX park, park improvements at Clear Lake Beach and along the Al Secord Trail and much more, 43 recommendations in all.

Town CAO Cynthia Townsend says the 'living' document will now be implemented through the Community Services Committee, which is made up of half the council members. They will review and decide what aspects they want to implement in the near future.

Zoning Bylaw Amendment File No. ZBA-17-02

The purpose of this zoning bylaw amendment application is to rezone from General Commercial to General Residential to allow for the severance of an existing residence in Consent File No. C-17-10, and to provide for a reduced lot depth.

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers in respect of the proposed applications, you must make a written request to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers. This will also entitle you to be advised of a possible Ontario Municipal Board Hearing. Even if you are the successful party, you should request a copy of the decision since the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers decision may be appealed to the Ontario Municipal Board by the applicant or another member of the rubbic.

To appeal the decision to the Ontario Municipal Board, send an appeal form to the Clerk of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers outlining the reasons for the appeal. You must enclose the appeal fee of \$300.00 for each application appealed, paid by cheque, made payable to the Ontario Minister of Finance.

If a person or public body that files an appeal of a decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers in respect of the proposed consent does not make written submission to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers before it gives or refuses to give a provisional consent, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss the appeal.

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers before the zoning bylaw is passed, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision of the Council of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers to the Ontario Municipal Board, and may not be added as a part to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Municipal Board unless, in the opinion of the board, there are reasonable grounds to do so.

Hundreds took in the various events and the venues were filled to capacity at the annual Espanola Pumpkin and Fibre Arts Festival held October 18th to 22nd..




Massey at 75 pounds.

- 1 small onion, diced
- ½ cup raw carrot, shredded
- 1 cup grated cheddar cheese
- 2 tsp salt
- ½ tsp pepper

Glaze

- ½ cup brown sugar
- ½ cup ketchup
- 1 tbsp prepared mustard

Beat eggs slightly. Add milk, salt, pepper and bread. Mix well. Add onions, carrots, cheese and beef. Mix well and put into a loaf pan. Combine glaze ingredients and spread over the loaf. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour. Pour off any excess fat when finished cooking and let loaf sit for 5 minutes before serving.
