Tenders Finally Out For New Triple School In Espanola – Construction Expected To Begin In The Spring



By Rosalind Russell - Sacred Heart School in Espanola was torn down over a year ago and many citizens were wondering when construction of the new triple school would begin.

The tender finally went out last week for the building of a new school to house the elementary Catholic students, as well as elementary and secondary French Catholic students. The site will also include day care spaces for up to 120 youngsters, explains EPOH architect Franco Pastore.

Pastore made a presentation to the English Catholic Board last week.

"It is expected to take up to two years for the school to be built with an estimated cost of \$24-million."

Sacred Heart students are now housed at AB Ellis Public School while Ecole Secondaire Catholique Franco-Ouest students are housed in a small section of

## Espanola Therapeutic Park Reaches Half Way Point - Fundraising Continues

The Espanola Regional Hospital and Health Centre announced nearly a year ago that there were plans in the work to build an outdoor, enclosed, safe space for residents of the long-term residence in the centre. Foundation co-ordination, Terri Noble, says the public has been generous in its support and the plans are in place to build the park in the Spring of 2018.

It's estimated the park will cost around \$150,000 to construct. Noble says they have reached the half-way mark.

"We have received lot of support from the community," says Noble. "Some of our major donors include the Allens, Mike Dunn, Doug and Roberta McMullan, The Espanola Ladies of the Royal Purple, Lobsterfest, The Espanola Canadian Legion and the Grooming Shop, just to name a a few. All contributions will acknowledged when we are closer to the grand opening." Noble adds there is still more funding needed and the latest fundraiser was another resounding success.

"Our Labour Day Road Toll raised another \$5,500. Our next fundraiser will be part of the Espanola Fibre Arts Festival. We will be selling costume and fine jewellery at the I Made It Myself Fashion Show, and we are also the recipients once again of The Moose 99.3 FM CJJM


Charity Radiothon set for December 8th."

The Park has been designed by Jennifer Harvey, Landscape Architect and the construction will be overseen by Rick Leclair who has volunteered his time and know-how to the project. Great people and trusted neighbours, they lived three doors down from me on Sunset Bay before they relocated to Montreal. I taught Justin how to play tennis on the court across the street; put him on my Sunday morning baseball team though he was half the age of everybody else. Now a fine young man with two handsome boys of his own, Justin looked like a larger version of that sweet kid I'd known so many years ago.

"No, no, no," I said, "no apologies for dropping in on me. Great that you did and also you need to meet Marsha and Liz who now live in your old house. They're lovely."

But first we took the inevitable trip down memory lane by the lake. With our backs to the water, Justin and Jocy surveyed the dozen cottages that make up the neighbourhood they had called home for three decades and hadn't seen for two more. "It was the Chonkas down there at the end, right?" "Yeah, Al's there now. His parents have passed away."

"And then the Sherk family." "Still a bit of a shocker, but Bob died about a year ago. Still a relatively young man."

"Then there was Mary Szabo." gone."

'And Gaza, the old guy who loved your dog Jake?" "Yeah, gone quite awhile ago,

"Then your other neighbour?" "Larry, died suddenly a few years ago. Again, far too young."

"And the American?" "Nelson's been gone for about ten years now. His widow Nancy sold and moved back to Buffalo."

"Then there was our house and then Bob and Marion." "Moved away, then passed

"And the Becks?" "John died like two years ago. I was with him at the end. Terrible. Best neighbour ever!"

"And then ..." I interrupted Justin by taking hold of his arm mostly for support. I couldn't help but notice the recurring theme that had crept eerily into our conversation. I looked at my simple summer cottage now winterized and renovated with an outside office and sauna. Suddenly it was not a home, but a mausoleum with a red brick chimney, a forest green tomb set in the middle of what became in just 15 minutes of reminiscing, the Sunset Bay Cemetery.



"Ah, Justin," I said in a weakened voice, "why don't you go down and visit the girls? I think I need to lay down for a spell." Holy crap, I thought to myself. I'm like this close to that wood-fired human oven and





#### Tenders Finally Out For New Triple School In Espanola – Construction Expected To Begin In The Spring

Espanola High. Students from A.B. Ellis relocated to Espanola High School, operated by the Rainbow District School Board. Ecole St. Joseph, which houses JK to Grade eight, continue to use their school facility on Mead Blvd.

Huron-Superior Catholic District School Board and Conseil scolaire catholique du Nouvel-Ontario are working together to build the new two-storey, 79,800-square-foot building on the seven acres of land on Mead Boulevard where Sacred Heart once stood.

A request for tenders went out September 7th. Construction is expected to start in the spring of 2018.

The project budget is \$23.8 million, with HSCDSB paying \$10.5 million of that amount.

"General offices will be on the main floor, as will classrooms and a discovery room for each school and three elementarysized gyms. Two of those gyms can be combined to make one secondary-sized gymnasium.

"The shared spaces are "strategically placed" in the middle of the building," said Pastore. "An art room and more classrooms are on the second floor

"High school classes will also be upstairs, so there's "separation" between the younger and older students."

Playgrounds will be split into

zones for primary, junior and intermediate students attending the two in-house elementary schools.

A Best Start Hub will be on the north side of the property. Daycare facilities will also be in each school.

The site of the former church will be turned into a parking lot for the new triple school.

Meanwhile, a group of citizens will continue to fight to save AB Ellis Public School, which could be demolished after the Sacred Heart students move into the new school in two years' time. There are plans to create a parking lot for staff of the adjacent twinned elementary and high school by demolishing the 90+ year old building.

The Save AB Ellis Committee was formed last fall when news of the possible demolishment was released. Citizens want to see the school remain as a fixture in the community and have discussed many plans including having it be used for an arts and cultural centre, theatre, museum, exercise gym and so much more. The group continues to meet on a regular basis and is working on having the building declared a historical site thus saving it from the wrecking ball.

The accident occurred on September 9th. Kristen was burned with second and third degree burns on 90% of the front and back of her legs. She is presently at Sunnybrook Hospital in Toronto awaiting surgery. Sharon has been by her side during this difficult journey.

A nurse at the Espanola hospital, she has been unable to work since this accident so she can be by Kristen side and unsure when she will be able to return.



#### Recipe

My daughter is a vegetarian and every so often she'll share a recipe with me that she thinks even the biggest of meat lovers will enjoy. This shepherd's pie certainly passes the test - it's not only



#### **VEGAN SHEPHERD'S PIE**

#### **FILLING**

- 1 medium onion, diced
- 2 cloves of garlic, minced
- 1 1/2 cups uncooked brown or green lentils, rinsed and draine
- 4 cups vegetable stock
- 2 tsp fresh thyme or 1 tsp dried thyme
- 1 10-ounce bag of frozen mixed vegetables OR 1 1/2 cups of fresh vegetables: peas, carrots, green beans, corn

#### MASHED POTATOES

- 3 Pounds Yukon gold potatoes, thoroughly washed
- 3-4 tbsp vegan butter (non-vegan butter will work if you prefer)
- Salt and pepper to taste

Set oven to 425 degrees F (218 C) and lightly grease a 9 x 13 baking dish. Set aside for later. Slice large potatoes in halves and place in a large pot filled with water. Bring to a boil and then reduce to a medium heat, covering and leaving to cook for 20-30 mins or until they can be easily pierced with a fork. Once cooked, drain, and transfer to a mixing bowl. Mash with a masher or a fork until smooth. Add desired amount of vegan butter (2-4 tbsp), and season with salt and pepper. Cover and set aside. In a large saucepan over medium heat, sauté onions and garlic in olive oil until brown - about 5 minutes. Add lentils, stock, thyme, and salt and pepper to taste. Stir and bring to a low boil. Reduce heat to a simmer. Continue cooking until lentils are tender (35-40 mins). In the last 15 minutes of cooking, add the vegetables and stir. Replace lid and continue to cook. When the 35-40 mins is up, transfer the mix to your prepared oven-safe baking dish and carefully top with mashed potatoes. Smooth down with a fork and season with salt and pepper. Place on a baking sheet to catch any overflow and bake for 10-15 mins or until the mashed potatoes are lightly browned on top. Let cool and enjoy!
