French Toast Casserole

I made this recipe for the family on Thanksgiving weekend and everyone loved it. It's like eating a big, cinnamon bun drizzled with maple syrup. You don't need a large piece on your plate, because it is rich, but oh so delicious. My son was taking chunks of the leftovers out of the fridge and eating them cold the rest of the week. This is a great recipe for Christmas morning or to serve to visitors over the holidays. I like to serve it with bacon or sausage. The saltiness pairs deliciously with the sweet.

French Toast Casserole

Yield: 10-12 servings Cook time: 1 hour

• 2 1/4 cups milk

• 8 eggs

Topping:

- 1/2 cup all purpose flour
- 1 loaf thick, chewy bread* 1/2 cup brown sugar, packed
 - 1 teaspoon cinnamon
 - 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 cup granulated sugar
- 2 tablespoons vanilla extract
- 1/2 cup (1 stick) cold unsalted butter, cubed.

*French, ciabatta, or sourdough bread are good options. You can NOT use normal sandwich bread for this - the texture won't be right. Leftover French bread that is just going to go stale (or even if it's already stale), can be torn up into bite-size chunks and put it in a Ziploc bag in the freezer to save for this recipe. Or a loaf of day-old French bread at the grocery store, it's perfect for this! Preheat your oven to 350 degrees. Spray a 9x13" Pyrex dish with cooking spray. Tear the loaf of bread into bite-size chunks and spread evenly in the pan. In a medium bowl, whisk together the eggs, milk, sugar, and vanilla. Pour evenly over the bread, ensuring that all of the bread chunks are wet (press lightly with your hands to soak up the egg mixture if necessary). In a medium bowl, mix together the flour, brown sugar, cinnamon, salt, and cold cubed butter using a pastry cutter until the butter crumbly - the size of peas. Spread the topping over the top of the bread mixture. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour. Remove from the oven and serve with syrup or powdered sugar.

To prepare in advance:

Tear the bread into chunks and place in the greased Pyrex dish; cover. Make the egg mixture and store in a Tupperware container in the refrigerator. Make the crumb topping and store in a Ziploc bag or Tupperware container in the refrigerator. When you are ready to make the casserole, simply pour the egg mixture over the bread, then top with the crumb topping, and pop it in the oven.









Loaded Cheese Ball Bites

Say goodbye to a boring cheese platter when you serve these tasty nibbles!

Loaded Cheese Ball Bites

- 12 oz. (1¹/₂ packages) cream cheese, softened
- 1 c. shredded Cheddar
- 1 tsp. garlic powder
- 1 tsp. paprika
- kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 8 slices bacon, cooked and finely chopped
- 1/3 c. finely chopped fresh chives
- 1/3 c. finely chopped pecans
- 18 pretzels sticks

Mix together cream cheese, cheddar, garlic powder, and paprika and season with salt and pepper. Form into 18 small balls and refrigerate until firm, 1 hour. In a shallow bowl or on a plate, stir together cooked bacon, chives, and pecans. Roll balls in bacon-chive-pecan mixture and insert a pretzel stick in each ball. Serve. (If not serving right away, loosely cover with plastic wrap and return to fridge. Let sit at room temperature 15 minutes before serving.)



The Christmas Game

Are you looking for a crazy-fun-and-totally-memorable-holidaytradition? Then you're in the right place. I was looking for a fun game to play on Christmas Eve with my family and came across the following. It's really all about the fun, and not about the expense or seriousness of the gifts. Buy practical everyday- kinds of items that are inexpensive but useful like; Q-tips, toothpaste Kleenex, and gum, you can even buy packages of items and divide them up. If you have a large group, you can possibly enlist a partner to buy half of the gifts.

Here is how it's played.

• There are 3 wrapped gifts for each who is playing. These gifts are not serious gifts. You can collect them throughout the year if you are planning ahead.

• Have 3 "better" gifts for example a \$20 bill, lottery tickets, or gift cards. These three things are hidden separately in the gifts before

they are wrapped. Often, the person who has the gift card or the cash doesn't even know it. A tiny slit made in the Q-tips container is a perfect place to hide a \$20 bill. So, make sure you write down where you've hid the goods. With a couple dozen wrapped gifts, it's easy to forget.


• Give yourself a good chunk of time to wrap the gifts and using the same gift wrap is nice.

• Pass out numbers on little slips of paper. You will need 3 x the number of people playing. These numbers determine the order of picking and opening gifts.

• In the appointed order, go around the room and select and open the gifts.

• Each gift can be stolen 3 times. If your gift is stolen, you go back to the pile and pick out another gift. Then play continues in the number order. Once a gift has been stolen 3 times, it is dead and can't be taken again.

• A rule is, you have to show people what you have opened. You don't have to take out and show the whole thing. You can be sneaky about it and make people believe you have something special.

Cream Cheese Cranberry Loaf

This loaf is perfectly moist, sweet and tart, and is the perfect thing to serve with coffee or tea during the holidays. Eat it by itself, dust it with powdered sugar, or top it off with more cream cheese.

- 2 cups flour
- 2 cups cranberries, fresh or frozen
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1 cup unsalted butter, room temperature
- 1 (8 oz.) package cream cheese, room temperature
- 4 eggs, room temperature
- 1 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 1/2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

Preheat oven to 350° F and lightly grease a 9x5-inch loaf pan with butter or nonstick spray. Cream together butter, cream cheese and sugar in a large bowl or mixer, then, one at a time, beat in eggs and vanilla. In a separate bowl, whisk together flour, baking soda



and salt until combined. Gradually mix dry ingredients into wet ingredients, stirring until just incorporated. Gently fold in cranberries, then pour mixture into greased baking dish. (I used 2 smaller loaf pans). Place in oven and bake for 60-70 minutes, or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Remove from oven and let cool at least 15 minutes before serving. Enjoy.



Bite sized egg nog cookie cups are simple to do and you only need 3 ingredients. You can fill them with any flavour you like, but egg nog is festive and makes a great Christmas dessert. The key to making these mini cookie cups is to spray your mini muffin pan really well before putting your dough in. Using refrigerated sugar cookie dough makes things easy and all you have to do is substitute egg nog for your milk in the instant pudding mix.

- 1 box instant vanilla pudding 5.1 oz
- 3 cups egg nog or milk if you just want vanilla
- 1 roll sugar cookie dough
- 1 mini muffin pan
- Non- stick cooking spray

Use about half a slice of sugar cookie dough. Roll into 1 "balls and put into a well-greased mini muffin pan. Use small spoon or finger to gently press down ball into holes. Bake for about 8 min. Allow to cool a bit, then gently press shot glass



in middle of cookie to create a pudding pocket. Whisk together egg nog or milk and pudding powder until thick. Refrigerate while cookies are in oven. Spoon into pastry bag or into a zip lock bag with the corner snipped off and squeeze into fully cooled cookie cups. You can garnish the top with nutmeg.
