School Boards to Proceed with Construction of New Catholic Schools in Espanola



The Conseil scolaire catholique du Nouvel-Ontario (CSCNO) and the Huron-Superior Catholic District School Board (HSCDSB) trustees have approved the construction of a joint facility that will enhance French and English Catholic education in Espanola. The \$25.2 million provided by the Ministry of Education will allow the construction of two distinct schools on the current Sacred Heart School and former St-Louis de France Catholic Church properties. This shared site will accommodate students from Sacred Heart Catholic Elementary School (kindergarten to grade 8) as well as students from École Saint-Joseph (kindergarten to grade 8) and École secondaire catholique Franco-Ouest (grade 9 to 12). 

The new committee is one of the many recommendations made within the new 10 Year Recreation Plan, which passed into law in the fall of last year.

- Seniors (55+)
- First Nations
- Not for profit Recreational Service (Golf Club, Ski Club, Curling)
- Private sector (i.e. personal trainers, class instructors, bowling alley)
- Library volunteer (board member or Friends of the Library)

### **Espanola OPP And Espanola Police Service Holding A Gun Amnesty**

By Rosalind Russell - A Gun Amnesty is being held by police services, both provincial and municipal, across Ontario, during the month of April.

The Espanola OPP and the Espanola Police Service are also taking part in the initiative.

During the amnesty, police will not recommend weaponsrelated Criminal Code charges that might otherwise apply to people who are turning in these items.

Police note no amnesty is offered for people who turn in weapons that have been used in the commission of a crime and no anonymous submissions will be accepted. The gun amnesty is for any Ontario resident who wishes to voluntarily surrender unwanted illegallyor weapons, owned firearms, accessories or ammunition.

Interested gun owners can call the OPP or their local police service to arrange for officers to retrieve the weapons.

Under no circumstances should anyone deliver guns or ammunition directly to police facilities.

### Rainbow Schools Receive Student Voice Speakup Project Grants

Innovative projects are being implemented in Rainbow Schools thanks to funding provided through the Ministry of Education's Student Voice strategy. Rainbow Schools will share a total of \$16,930 in SpeakUp Project grants in the 2017-2018 school year.

Students will lead projects that make a difference in their schools while supporting the province's renewed vision for education - achieving excellence, ensuring equity, promoting well-being and enhancing public confidence – and Rainbow District School Board's strategic directions – reaching minds and touching hearts.

While each SpeakUp project varies from school to school, the initiatives have one thing in common - they are intended to promote student engagement and student success, whether the focus is on mental health and well-being or Indigenous education and our collective commitment to truth and reconciliation.

Espanola High and Manitoulin Secondary took part in a Peer

Mental Well-Being Support Training Session in February on how to provide their peers with supports in connection with mental health.

Little Current Public School will host an Anishinaabe Culture Day. "It's very gratifying when students identify a need in their school, get together to brainstorm ideas, take the initiative to apply for funding, and roll up their sleeves to take action," said Rainbow District School Board Chair Doreen Dewar. "We thank the Province of Ontario for valuing student voice and giving students an opportunity to be active participants in their education through the SpeakUp grants."

"With the support of the Ministry of Education, we have a number of exciting projects taking place for the benefit of students in Rainbow Schools," added Director of Education Norm Blaseg. "We commend students, with the support of the province, administrators, teachers and parents/guardians, for leading initiatives that promote well-being and foster student success."

# It's Back To The Drawing Board ... Again For Espanola Fire Hall

By Rosalind Russell - Espanola council wants to go back to square one when looking at the design of a new fire hall for the town.

At the last committee of the whole meeting in late March, Councillor Bill Foster, suggested that Fire Chief Mike Pichor come back with a layout for an 8,000 square foot prefabricated building.

The new layout would also include Public Work offices and sharing common areas, such as

washrooms.

Council discussed the various concepts back and forth, but are rejecting the two-storey concept.

The last engineering study suggested a two-storey building, but Foster says there is simply too much wasted space.

Councillors agreed and Pichor is expected to re-activate his committee and come back to the committee with a redesigned grid layout for a new fire hall.

Like a lot of their works, this short film, with a small cast featuring Dylon Whyte, Autumn Buratynski, Heather Stevenson and Liliane Chrétien, deftly peels back

the real world we know to expose something... different, something dangerously beautiful.

"For some characters in the film, their problems in life are solved and they walk away with immense riches," explains Stewart. "For others, they choose a more sordid life and never return from their meeting with The Philanthropist."

### **Recipes**

An old, classic recipe apparently made by the ladies who served school lunches. These brownies are fudgy, chewy and totally amazing. These will satisfy any chocolate craving.



### **Lunch Lady Brownies**

- 1 cup butter, melted
- 1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 cups granulated sugar
- 4 large eggs
- 4 teaspoons vanilla extract

### **CHOCOLATE FROSTING**

- 1/4 cup butter, softened
- 1/4 cup milk (I use 2%)
- 1/4 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 3 cups powdered sugar



Preheat oven to 350° F. Line a 9x13-inch baking dish with foil and spray foil with non-stick spray. Set aside. In a bowl add the melted butter and cocoa powder, stir or use a mixer to blend until smooth. Add the flour and sugar, beat together. Add the eggs and vanilla. Mix just until combined. Don't over mix. (Batter will be thick)Pour batter into prepared baking dish and spread out evenly. Bake 25 to 30 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Remove brownies from oven and let stand 15 minutes before frosting. You want the brownies still warm when you frost them!

FOR CHOCOLATE FROSTING: Beat together all the frosting ingredients until smooth. Pour and spread over warm brownies. Let cool completely before cutting and serving.


