



Supporting The Humboldt Broncos Of Saskatchewan



By Rosalind Russell - People in the local area are also lending support to the victims of the Saskatchewan bus crash disaster where several players and supporters of the Humboldt Broncos Junior A hockey team were killed including the people of the Espanola, Manitoulin Island and the North Shore corridor.

The Town of Humboldt, Saskatchewan has lost 16 of its 6,000 souls. But, they lost a lot more than a hockey team after a collision between the team bus and a semi-truck left 16 people dead, mostly players between 16 and 21, and more than a dozen injured. The accident occurred at an intersection known locally as Armley Corner, the evening of Friday, April 6th, 2018.

The community also grieves for the Broncos captain Logan Schutz, coaches Darcy Haugun and Mark Cross, the team's statistician, radio play-by-play announcer

NOTICE OF NOMINATION FOR OFFICE Municipal Elections Act, 1996 (s. 32)

Nominations for the positions listed below must be made on the prescribed form available at your municipal Clerk's Office. Nomination papers must be filed, either in person or by your agent, with the Returning Officer of the appropriate municipality during that office's normal office hours between the **first business day of May in 2018 to Thursday, July 26, 2018,** and between **9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. on Friday, July 27, 2018** (Nomination Day).

There is a new requirement that each Nomination Paper (excluding School Board Trustee candidates) must be signed by 25 eligible voters supporting the nomination, this only applies for Espanola (applicable for municipalities with 4,000 or more electors). The individuals providing signatures must sign a declaration stating they are eligible to vote in the municipality on the day they sign the endorsement.

The required fee for a Member of Council is \$100.00 and the required fee for Head of Council is \$200.00. The required fee shall be in the form of cash, cheque, money order or debit (with the exception of Baldwin) and must accompany the signed forms. A nomination paper must be certified by the Municipal Clerk before such person becomes a candidate for office. A nomination paper must be filed prior to accepting campaign contributions or incurring expenses. You are entitled to be an elector and to run for office if you are not disqualified by any Act or Law and on voting day if you are:

- 1. a resident of the Town/Township; or,
- 2. a non-resident who is an owner or tenant of land in the Town/Township or the spouse of or same sex partner of such an owner or tenant; and,
- 3. a Canadian citizen; and,
- 4. of the full age of 18 years.

Trump And Mueller – The Interview Of The Century



The money, over \$8-million and counting, comes from 65 countries, according GoFundMe's to PR agency in Canada, North Strategic.

Apple Pie Muffins (makes approximately 20)

- $2\frac{1}{2}$ cups flour
- 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup brown sugar
- 2/3 cup vegetable oil
- 1 egg

I.

- 1 cup buttermilk or sour milk
- (1 cup milk with 1 tbsp vinegar)
- 1 tsp soda
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 2 cups diced, peeled apple
- ¹/₂ cup pecans (optional)

Topping

- ¹/₂ cup brown sugar
- 6 tbsp flour
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup butter
- 1 tsp cinnamon

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Prepare topping by combining the brown sugar, flour and cinnamon. Cut in the butter until you have a crumb like mixture.

In a large bowl combine the brown sugar, oil and egg. Whisk together the buttermilk, soda, salt and vanilla together in a small bowl or measuring cup. Alternating with the buttermilk mixture; blend the flour into the sugar, oil and egg. Don't over mix. Fold in the apples (and pecans if using). Place batter in lined or greased muffin tins and sprinkle with topping. Bake for 20 minutes.
