Municipal Election October 22, 2018

By Rosalind Russell - Laurier Faldien of Nairn & Hyman Township has been acclaimed as Mayor.

Incumbents Brigita Gingras and Riet Wigzell will take on Kathy Bourrier, Frederic Diebel, Nicole Minialoff, Rod MacDonald and Shelly Ann Lowery.

Baldwin Township Mayor Vern Gorham has also been acclaimed.

There is an election for council. Jo-Anne Boucher is challenging incumbents David Fairbairn, Texas MacDonald, Ray Maltais and Bert McDowell.

Recipe



Sweet and tender, bursting with fresh blueberries, and super moist from two cups of grated zucchini. One stop shopping – fruit and veggies in one delicious,



crumbly-topped breakfast muffin. Even self-proclaimed zucchini-haters thoroughly enjoy these muffins.

Blueberry Zucchini Muffins

Yields: About 18 muffins

- 3 eggs
- 1cup canola oil (or half applesauce, half oil)
- 3 tsp vanilla
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 cups zucchini, grated
- 1 tsp lemon zest
- 3 cups flour
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp baking powder
- ½ tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 2 cups fresh blueberries

For Crumble Topping:

- 1/3 cups flour
- 1/3 cups sugar
- ½ cups butter, softened
- dash of salt



Preheat oven to 350. Grease two standard muffin tins. In a mixing bowl, beat together the eggs, oil, vanilla, sugar, zucchini, and lemon zest until well combined. Mix in dry ingredients until incorporated. Fold in blueberries. Scoop into prepared muffin tins (I used a 1/4 measuring cup for this and filled the cups almost completely full to get the oversized muffin effect). In another smaller bowl, mix flour, sugar, salt, and softened butter together using your fingers or a pastry blender until it is crumbly. Sprinkle evenly over the tops of each muffin. Bake 25-30 minutes or until muffins are golden and cooked through. Enjoy warm or at room temperature.

Gallows Humour From The Past That Isn't For The Faint Of Heart

Gallows humour is back with a arrogance, it was therefore a shock to all vengeance. Trump started it during the campaign when he boasted: "I could stand in the middle of Fifth Avenue and shoot somebody and I wouldn't lose voters..." Not funny, but having survived more scandal and misconduct that an entire floor of prison inmates, he might well be right on this one.

Holding the fake and decapitated head of her president, Kathy Griffin learned that even gallows humor has its limit which she went far beyond.

Snoop Dog's music video featuring a shooting of a clownish Trump was followed by Johnny Depp's quip about actors assassinating presidents. Madonna's suggestion to blow up the White House was answered by 12,000 tweets for Trump to be killed. More gallows than humour, all of these are quite amateurish compared to those who started the ghoulish trend in laughter.

Gallows humour at its modern best? After Trump threatened Kim Jong-un with a devastating nuclear strike, domestic strategist Paul Begala said: "Look on the bright side, compared to the coming thermonuclear inferno, global warming will seem quite pleasant."

Gallows humour might well have begun with Marie Antoinette, the pompous and extravagant Queen of France who was executed for treason during the French Revolution. Known as the epitome of

who heard her final words: "Pardon me, Sir. I meant not to do it."

As it turns out, Marie Antoinette was not apologizing for provoking the revolution in which approximately 56,000 French citizens were killed and one-third of them beheaded. She was in fact apologizing to her executioner as she staggered toward the guillotine and accidentally stepped on his foot.

Although the blade has long since been replaced by the noose, the firing squad, the electric chair and now a chemical injection – last words of those condemned to die by the proverbial sword still sometimes lean to levity.

James D. French was the last person executed before Oklahoma rescinded the death penalty. A career criminal who wanted to die, he murdered his cell mate so as to force the state to end his life. Looking at the ghoulish faces of reporters gathered to witness the event, French's last words were: "How's this for a headline? French Fries!"

Carl Panzram was not a nice or even a patient man, not during his stint as a serial killer or when he was about to be terminated himself in Indiana. "Hurry up you Hoosier bastard. I could kill 10 men while you're fooling around." Somehow I don't think Carl would have been very good candidate for rehabilitation.

Some last words, like those world. A documentary titled of domestic killer David downright Martinez. are poetic: "Only the sky and the green grass goes on forever and today is a good day to die." On the contrary, it had not been a good day to die for Martinez's girlfriend and her

Prior to being chemically put to death in Maryland, triple murderer John Fredrick Thanos got his farewell speech down to one word: "Adios". A man of many murders and very few words, was Thanos. About 20% of inmates choose to say even less than Thanos which is nothing whatsoever. By far the most common last statement heard by execution witnesses is: "I'm ready, warden."

Naturally Texas, where they have executed 484 death row inmates since capital punishment was reinstated in 1976 (four times as many convicts as any other state) would have the largest selection of peculiar last words.

Just before murderer and rapist Johnny Frank Garrett was given a lethal injection by Texan authorities, he solemnly said: "I'd like to thank my family for loving me and taking care of me. And the rest of the world can kiss my ass." Garett may have had a very good reason to be angry at the

The Last Word makes a very strong case for his innocence. Back in the 1880's it was difficult to punish someone with death who believed in world destruction. Just before they hanged him, union activist and founder of the Socialistic Labor Party, George Engel cheered: "Hurrah for anarchy! This is the happiest moment of my life."

Gallows Humour probably began with Marie Antoinette and the guillotine, beheading device which consisted of a heavy blade dropping at the speed of death between two upright posts.

In order to provide a more humane way of killing citizens during the French Revolution, this head chopper was designed by a physician. The year was 1792 and gallows humour was created almost immediately.

As the story goes, a condemned aristocrat was standing on the death platform with his head over the chopping block when a sudden gust of wind rocked the stage and shook the posts on either side of him. Jerking his head up and looking at his executioner he yelled: "Good Lord man, is this thing safe?"



Public Health Removes Swimming Advisory At Clear Lake Beach - Don't Feed The Geese



Public Health Sudbury & Districts has removed the swimming advisory at Clear Lake Beach in Espanola.

The health unit had imposed the advisory on Friday, July 27th, but removed it for Wednesday, August 1st.

Manager, Cynthia Peacock-Rocca, says recent water samples are within acceptable bacteriological water quality standards and advises against feeding geese.

As a result, the beach water quality is once again considered suitable for recreational use.

Public Health takes routine water samples every week during the summer from 35 local beaches.

Human habitation may not be permitted in recreational vehicles unless they meet all requirements of the Fire Code, Ontario Building Code, and any other applicable regulations or Acts, including applicable approvals for sewage disposal.
