Fire On Queensway Avenue In Espanola – Police Seeking Public's Help

Espanola Fire Chief Mike Pichor told Around&About he believes the modus operandi is the same as other fires that have occurred in the area over the last year and although the department was not called out to the incident, deems the incident suspicious.

He adds there was no damage to the residence, but some to a fenced area on the property.

Meanwhile, Espanola OPP media officer, Marie Ford, says police were called out to the home at Tuesday, December 11th at around 1:00 in the morning.

She says they found an object smouldering near the residence, and are asking for the public's help in connection with the mischief.

"Turkey Hotline. Can I Help You?"

For 30 years America's Butterball Turkey "what's the best way to cook a 30-year-old Talk-Line has been answering desperate pleas from thousands of not-so-good cooks about preparing and cooking North America's favourite holiday bird. Many of these questions to the Butterball call centre are characterized as "bewildering." I've seen the questions. I would add "insanely bewildering". So popular is the talk-line, Butterball employs no less than 50 turkey experts at this time of year to man the phones. Why they would do this when they could have me do it for free, I have no idea. Here then are actual questions to the Butterball Turkey Talk-Line and answers that are exclusively mine.

Question: One expert could actually hear the sloshing of water in the background as the guy on the line said he was thawing the turkey in the bathtub while bathing his two toddlers. "How long will it take the bird to thaw?"

Answer: "Pure freakin' genius, Sir! Killing two birds, no, killing one bird and two kids, no ... A masterpeice of multitasking. And why stop there. All three can be nicely dried off in an oven pre-heated to 375°. Set the timer in order to remove the children well before roasting. Also, should you decide to smoke next year's turkey, a gallon of that bathwater would make a very nice brine.

Answer: "One hour in the oven for every year in the freezer. Eat it in a hospital parking lot."

Answer: "With your track record I would take no chances. Divorce this guy and marry a chef."

Question: One guy called to say he was about to carve up his cooked turkey with a chainsaw and "Do you think the chain oil will leave a bad taste on the meat?"

Answer: "Not if you fill the crank case with olive oil and use a rosemary fusion stabilizer in the fuel tank. Also, to clean the blade of your chainsaw just go next door where the turkey and the kids should be out of the tub by now."

of the bird.

Man Arrested For Murder Of Renee Sweeney

A North Bay man has been charged with a murder that occurred 20 years ago in Sudbury.

On Tuesday, December 11th, Greater Sudbury Police charged 39-year old Robert Steven Wright with first degree murder in connection to the Renee Sweeney homicide case.

On January 27th, 1998, Sweeney was stabbed at her workplace and died at the scene.


At the beginning of November, investigative techniques were used to gather forensic evidence leading to the arrest and search warrant, which were carried out in North Bay December 10th.

Wright, who was 18-yearsold at the time and attending Lockerby Secondary Composite, was in police custody at the time of going to press.

She presented council a letter of support from the Espanola Family Health Team, as well as some 300 signatures asking for more staff, expanded hours and more programming.

The main lobby of the Espanola Regional Hospital and Health Centre now features the In-Memoriam Tree. The tree is festooned with bulbs purchased by the public in memory of loved ones. Last year, the auxiliary raised around \$27,000 to go towards the ultrasound machine. The money raised this year will continue to offset the cost of that purchase. Sandra Courtemanche says the fundraising is going well with some \$1,800 raised through their annual tea, bake and craft sale.

Anyone wishing to purchase a bulb in memory of a loved one, can drop by the gift shop in the lobby of the hospital. Bulbs can either be put on the tree until December 21st and then brought home or supporters can bring them home. The price range is from \$10 to \$20 per bulb.

bake up a batch of warm cookies in a flash. Chopped pecans can be substituted for half the Skor chips, as long as it equals 1 cup. These cookies can be also be drizzled with or dipped in chocolate. These are melt in your mouth, buttery and delicious!

Toffee Butter Icebox Cookies (Servings 48)

- 1 cup butter softened
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 egg room temperature
- 2¹/₂ cups all-purpose flour spooned and leveled
- 1 cup Skor bits

Cream butter and sugar together. Add in the egg and extract and mix until well combined. Stir in flour, mixing until fully incorporated. If dough appears too dry, add a teaspoon of water at a time until it comes together. Fold in Skor bits. Divide dough in half and place on top of a sheet of plastic wrap. Form the dough into a log about 6 inches long and 1.5 inches in diameter. Wrap each log with the plastic wrap and refrigerate dough rolls for 1-2 hours or until nice and firm. Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Line baking sheet with parchment paper. Remove plastic wrap from rolls and cut into ¼ inch slices. Place slices about 2 inches apart on cookie sheet. Bake for 8 minutes or until lightly browsed.
