Espanola's Blake Bond **Rings The Bell**



An Espanola boy has rung the bell declaring himself officially cancer free. There is a bell at Sick Kids in Toronto and when a child is declared cancer free, they get to make it ring.

Kayli Bond, the mother of eight-yearold Blake Bond, says he rang the bell in early January adding it is fantastic news because it means Blake has hit a major milestone in his cancer treatment, which began nearly four years ago and is now being considered cancer free.

But, there will be long-term ramifications for Blake as well.

"He bruises easily and is sore. The treatments have led to some learning challenges, and we don't know the full



summer job killing rattlesnakes as they slithered up to the conveyor belt at the Erie Peat Moss factory in Wainfleet. The women packaging the peat at the end of the line were most grateful. I had nightmares for months. Before I discovered I could make money by staying home and make a living making fun of my dog, I life-guarded, waited tables at the Rex Hotel in Welland and the Walper Hotel in Kitchener, painted houses, cleaned steel with a swing grinder, worked in two men's clothing stores, taught tennis, ran a wine bar, sold books to universities, drove a delivery truck, took bets for a friend who ran an illegal bookmaking operation and sold audio/visual equipment for The 3M Company.

These income-earning exploits did not however inspire me to seek even stranger employment like sniffing armpits, testing condoms, emptying porta potties, giving haircuts to dead guys or hugging thousands of strangers. Now more than ever before, there are a lot of very weird ways to make a living in the world.

Espanola Council Asking For Extension To OPP Costing

Espanola council is putting in a request to extend the deadline for a possible switch from municipal to Ontario Provincial Police.

Councillor Bill Foster says the delay is needed because it has taken four months to get some crucial numbers from the OPP in the costing, the interim police chief will be gone all of February and there has to be public consultation.

Councillor Robert Yocum believes the OPP will be receptive to the extension since they are the ones who caused the major delay with pieces of crucial information needed for the final decision.

Council approved a bylaw to ask the OPP for a two-month extension to the March 22nd deadline.

If approved, the new date for the final signing of the deal for the switch would be May 22nd, 2018.

No final decision to stay with the Espanola Police Service or go OPP has been made.

Helping Kids Play ... In A Big Way!



extent of the long-term effects yet. We will have to deal with that as time goes by."

Kayli is cautiously optimistic though saying she prays the cancer doesn't return. She says Blake has blood tests every week at home in Espanola, goes to Sudbury every two weeks and is in Ottawa every month for close monitoring.

With the ongoing testing, the support of the public is much appreciated and still very much needed, especially the trips to Ottawa. The family does receive financial assistance, but not all expenses are covered and waiting for

reimbursement makes travel difficult.

Kayli adds the positive news makes for a very special birthday for Blake who turns nine this February 19th. There will be balloons, cake, treats, games and those special people who love the little man.

Kayli emphasizes the family could not have survived the last four years without the support of family and friends, and the wider public who have assisted the family through so many fundraisers. A special thank you goes out to the Espanola Express who have always been there for Blake.

Recipe

Last week I shared one of my Mother-in -law's tried and true recipes and here is another one. She kindly has provided me with a month's worth of recipes,



which is simply wonderful because it saves me a lot of research and work, and I confidently know that the recipes are good. This bread dunks deliciously into big bowls of chili, but can be served with any meal.

Chili- Cheese Corn Bread

- ½ pound of pepperoni
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 ½ cups yellow cornmeal
- 1/3 cup of sugar
- 2 tbsp baking powder
- 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp salt
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup milk
- ½ cup vegetable oil
- ½ cup sour cream
- 6 oz (1 ½ cups) of shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 4oz can chopped green chillies, drained

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Grease a 9" spring form pan. Chop pepperoni into small pieces. In a large bowl, measure flour, cornmeal, sugar, baking powder and salt. In a medium bowl with a wire whisk, beat eggs, milk, oil and sour cream until smooth. With a fork, stir egg mixture into the flour mixture just until blended. Stir in the pepperoni, cheese and green chillies. Spoon batter into prepared pan. Bake 60 minutes or until golden and toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. To serve-carefully loosen bread from inside of pan; remove side of pan and slice bread. Serve warm.
