

Recipe

January is here which means it's time for comfort Salisbury Steak basically hamburger patties braised in gravy. This recipe is like mini



meatloaves sautéed in butter and then finished in a nice rich mushroom gravy. If you don't love mushrooms you can use onions or a mix of both onions and mushrooms.

Salisbury Steak in Mushroom Gravy

For the Salisbury steak...

- 1 lb. ground beef
- ½ cup finely diced onion
- ½ cup panko bread crumbs
- 1 egg, lightly beaten
- 1 Tbsp Worcestershire sauce
- 3 Tbsp fresh parsley, minced or 2 tsp of dried parsley
- 1 Tbsp minced garlic clove or shallot
- ½ tsp. freshly cracked pepper
- ½ tsp. kosher salt
- 1 Tbsp butter, for pan frying

For the mushroom gravy...

- 1 Tbsp butter
- 8 oz. sliced mushrooms
- 2 shallots or green onions, thinly sliced
- 1 Tbsp fresh thyme leaves, minced
- 2 Tbsp flour
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ 2 cups beef broth
- salt & freshly cracked pepper

For the Salisbury steak...

Combine ingredients and form into 3-4 oval shaped patties. Melt 1 Tbsp butter in a large skillet, sauté patties 4-5 minutes per side over medium heat until nicely browned. Remove from pan and reserve.

For the mushroom gravy...

Add 1 Tbsp butter, sliced mushrooms, and shallots or green onion, and sauté for 4-5 minutes. Add the fresh thyme and cook an additional minute. Sprinkle flour in, and cook for 1-2 minutes. The mixture will be thick. Gradually stir in beef broth ½ cup at a time, allowing mixture to come to a boil in between each addition. Add more broth until desired thickness is achieved. Season with salt and pepper. Return steak patties to gravy, reduce heat to low, and allow to braise until patties are cooked through. Serve over mashed potatoes with fresh parsley to garnish.
