#### 42nd Running Of The Massey Marathon And Add In A Bit Of Colour!



By Rosalind Russell - It is one of Northern Ontario's premier summer events attracting people from around the globe to the small community of Massey - the 42nd running of the Friendly Massey Marathon. And, there will be a spot of colour this year too! Along with the signature Friendly Massey Marathon, a Boston Qualifier certified course, the event includes the Spanish River Half Marathon, the Chutes 10K and the Family 5K, meaning there is a race and a distance for every runner. All in all, about 300 participants are expected to take part the July 14th weekend.

In the past, the event has been called the Northern Lites Marathon, the Rainbow Country Marathon, the Voyageur Marathon and finally the



Friendly Massey Marathon. It was founded by Norm Patenaude, who was also one of the founders of the Ontario Roadrunners Association and helped develop the standards used for race accreditation, which have been adopted by several national and international running organizations.

Maintaining a loyal following, excuse the pun, was not always easy. The event changed locations regularly in its infancy to places such as Espanola, Chelmsford, Sudbury and finally Massey. But, the marathon continued and is a highlight event for enthusiasts in July. In fact, the 10K is celebrating its 11th anniversary this year and this is the third year for the Family 5K.

The course, simply put, is beautiful and runs as two loops of the half marathon course, which is flat and fast. It also runs along the Spanish River with lots of shade and beautiful vistas, so it is a pretty course.

A traditional spaghetti supper is offered on Saturday evening and there is a popular pancake breakfast for all participants on Sunday morning at the Massey Arena.

New this year is the Predators Colour Run on July 14th at 3:00pm, a fundraising event for the local minor hockey association, but it will definitely add some sparkle to the weekend with splattered colour powder dressing up the participants.

Race headquarters are also located right near the beautiful Chutes Provincial Park, which has six kilometres of hiking trails with great views of scenic waterfalls. With fun runs on Saturday, they provide something for everyone in the family and a full weekend of fun. 
#### **Jill Beer Taking Another Run For Espanola Mayor**



#### Recipe

Are you trying to avoid using the oven because you don't want to heat up the house any more than it already is? Or are you looking for a simple



summer dessert? This layered frozen ice cream dessert is a recipe you can make all summer long and I promise you that everyone will love it. It's easy to make, delicious, and you can make it ahead to have on hand for summer guests, to take to a social gathering or just to enjoy yourself.

#### **Buster Bars**

- 1 package (14.3 ounces) Oreo cookies, crushed (dump cookies into a large plastic zip-lock bag and pound them until they crumble)
- · Container of vanilla ice cream, softened (approx. 8 cups or 4 Litres)
- 16 ounces hot fudge sauce
- 1 1/2 cups peanuts
- 1 large container of Cool Whip (1 Litre)

Line the bottom of 9x13-inch dish with crushed Oreos (I like to use a tall foil cake pan). Spread softened ice cream over Oreos. Place the pan in the freezer and allow time for the ice cream to freeze again (1 to 2 hours). Spread fudge sauce on top of the vanilla ice cream (if it's too thick, put it in the microwave for just about 10 seconds to soften a bit). Sprinkle peanuts on top of the fudge, and then the Cool Whip over the peanuts. Place it in the freezer again to firm up. Once firm, you can cover it with plastic wrap and keep it in the freezer until ready to serve. To serve, allow it to thaw a bit, cut into squares, and serve with additional hot fudge and peanuts.
