Hospital Hosts Mock Accident Scenario



Submitted by Espanola Regional Hospital and Health Centre - It was an impactful morning in the ERHHC emergency department on May 29, 2018. Seventeen senior Espanola High School students attended a Mock Safe Grad Event.

The focus of this year's Safe Grad Event was on driving while under the influence of cannabis.

The scenario for the mock drill depicted a motor vehicle accident with the driver of the vehicle "high" on cannabis. The vehicle contained the driver and a female passenger.

The scenario began with both victims (high school student actors) being brought into the emergency department by paramedics. Both victims had been prepared with makeup to suit their injuries. The female passenger was critically injured and the impaired driver sustained minor lacerations.

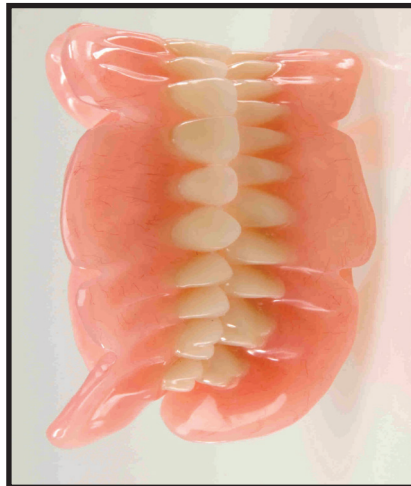

The Canada/U.S. War of Dirty Words

"I am not a crook, although he proved to be one, would have been way too thick to get Pierre's wit. Save AB Ellis Public School Campaign Continues



The Save AB Ellis Public School committee believes a minimum of 30 apartments can be constructed in the school, and that still leaves plenty of room for more.

Committee member, Gary Clackett, says there is radiant heat throughout the school as well as water access, so retrofitting and redesigning the apartments would not be as difficult as other projects.

The committee plans to go to Parry Sound to see a similar project where a school has been retrofitted to accommodate supportive housing for seniors and low income residents.

The original school was opened 100 years ago next September 2019 and the committee wants to form a sub-committee to organize a celebration and a reunion of sorts. The committee considers the school 'the heart of the community' and will be continuing its fight to save the structure.

As for the building inspector's demands on the Huron Superior Roman Catholic School Board that several studies be done including complete structural, mechanical, engineering and

architectural reports, the results would likely assist the group in proving the viability of the structure.

Meanwhile, despite the call from Espanola's building inspector to complete a number of in-depth reports into the condition of AB Ellis school, the Board will renew its lease for another year.

Board Education Director, Rose Burton Spohn, told The Moose they will be renewing their lease for students of Sacred Heart to continue being housed in the building.

Burton Spohn says they have talked to the inspector and submitted various reports on air quality, electrical repairs and the like, as well as agreed to do some remedial work the town has asked for.

She adds they hope to meet with him again in the short term to discuss what further actions he will require and if they must go ahead with the studies.

School was officially out for summer on Friday, June 29th, so it is expected some of the remedial work will be carried out over the summer break.

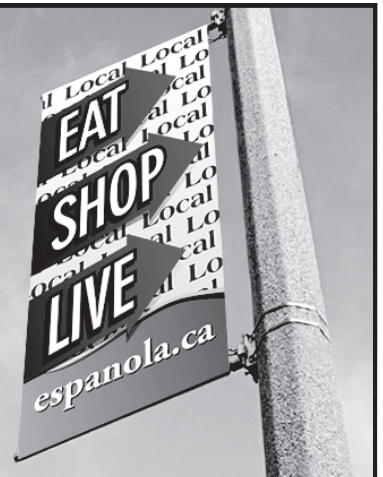

Hospital Hosts Mock Accident Scenario



A team of four emergency department staff received the critically injured victim into the trauma room and began life saving measures in attempts to save her life.

The high school students were brought in to trauma room to observe the work being performed on the victim; this eventually included giving lifesaving drugs and CPR. The victim ultimately succumbed to her injuries and was pronounced dead.

The victims' distraught mother (hospital staff member actor) was brought into the trauma room after her daughter was pronounced dead. This made a very significant impact for the witnessing students as they stood somberly watching the mother cry over her dead child's body. The driver of the vehicle was also assessed by the ED staff, and was cleared medically.

Espanola Police Officer, Constable Mel Rancourt performed a sobriety test on the driver and determined that he was impaired by drugs, so

he was charged with impaired driving causing death.

Constable Rancourt handcuffed the impaired driver and brought him to jail.

The students then followed the nurses as they brought the body to the morgue. The funeral home arrived shortly thereafter and put the body in a body bag and loaded it into the hearse and drove away.

After the scenario in the emergency department all participants and students attended a debriefing where questions were answered and reactions shared. The mock drill proved to be very insightful and left a lasting impression on attending students. The drill was also videotaped and shown over the course of a week at the high school for all students to watch.

Recipe

A crock pot can be your best friend not only when your days are busy but also when the summer temperatures make it too hot to turn on your oven. This recipe can be made with chicken breasts but thighs won't dry out like breast meat is prone to do. Serve over rice, sprinkled with chopped chives for an impressive yet simple delicious dinner.



CROCK POT TERIYAKI CHICKEN

- 12 boneless skinless chicken thighs (about 3 pounds)
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 3/4 cup soy sauce
- 6 tablespoons cider vinegar
- 3/4 teaspoon ground ginger
- 3/4 teaspoon minced garlic
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 4 1/2 teaspoons cornstarch
- 4 1/2 teaspoons cold water
- Hot cooked long grain rice



Place chicken in a 4 qt. slow cooker. In a large bowl, combine the sugar, soy sauce, cider vinegar, ginger, garlic and pepper. Pour over chicken. Cover and cook on low for 4 to 5 hours or until chicken is tender. Remove chicken to a serving platter; keep warm. Skim fat from cooking liquid. Place liquid in a saucepan and bring to a boil. Combine cornstarch and water until smooth. Gradually stir into liquid and stir until sauce is thickened. Serve with chicken and rice.

This is a reminder that Bylaw 2003-10 regulates the use of municipal water for lawn and garden care.

- Even numbered houses may water on even-numbered days
- Odd numbered houses may water on odd-numbered days

Watering is only to take place between the hours of **7:00 am and 10:00 am and from 7:00 pm and 10:00pm.**

SWIMMING POOLS

In 2016 Council amended the user fee bylaw to include a water usage fee for swimming pools. **There is an annual fee of \$100.00 for properties with swimming pools, regardless of its size.** If your property has been identified as having a swimming pool you will see an additional charge on the July – Sept water bill. The total amount is due by September 30th.

Please note that all swimming pools which are at least 50cm (19.6 feet) in depth must be totally enclosed by a fence having a minimum height of 1.5m (5 feet) with a self-locking gate.
