Outside Ebbing, Missouri, - do. Beautiful, horrible, touching, crass, frightening with a message of hope and forgiveness – this film is the very reason we go to movies. Not just to be entertained, but also enthralled, transported to a foreign place and delivered in mind to another's opinion.

I was reminded of how great this movie was while driving near the town of Sherman in Western New York last week where I spotted a not-so-great billboard. In large badlypainted white letters on a huge black piece of plywood were the words: "Todd, where's my gravel? Paid for it years ago."

Sounds like a handshake deal gone bad and the guy who got the short end of the stick instead of the gravel is trying, apparently unsuccessfully, to embarrass Todd into making good on the deal.

Marshal McCluhan was famously quoted as saying: "The medium is the message," but whoever thought in the age of instant communication we'd be reverting to big sign boards on the sides of roads to send such messages? But maybe that's the power if not the charm of billboards – old school, in your face, hard to avoid.

Now outdated but still funny, somebody professionally altered a sign on Toronto city limits. "WELCOME TO ONTARIO'S CAPITAL, OUR HOCKEY TEAM SUCKS AND OUR MAYOR SMOKES CRACK." May they never have to bring this sign back under the leadership of Premier Doug. (Just got a chill down my spine writing 'Premier Doug!'

Not sure this billboard was sanctioned by the U.S. Military, but the solders in the photograph look very serious and very professional above the slogan: "WE'RE PROUD OF OUR PRIVATES."

Near a busy U.S. Highway, somebody put up a billboard above a shady little spot behind some bushes with an arrow pointing downward: "COPS HIDE HERE."

No harm and a lot of truth in the billboard outside a veterinary hospital: "IF CATS COULD TEXT YOU BACK, THEY WOULDN'T."

Sometimes it's what's not there that really hammers home the message as on one of those storefront sign boards: "QULT ST3ALING OWR LETT3RS!" And the Oscar for Roadside Messaging goes not to Three Billboards Outside Ebbing, Missouri, but the woman who wrote the billboard: "Hi Steven. Do I have your attention now? I know all about her, you dirty, sneaky, immoral, unfaithful, poorly-endowed slime-ball. Everything's caught on tape." It was signed "Your (soon-tobe-ex) wife Emily." And just when you thought the cut could not get deeper: "P.S. I paid for this billboard out of OUR bank account." (I know you're shocked! Shocked! Shocked! That it wasn't signed: "Your soon-to-be-ex Melania!!!")

As a five-year-old in the 50s with my face mushed up against the backseat window of the family car headed for Florida, I was completely captivated by the Burma Shave ads. They were a series of six big signs spaced apart that offered two and three and four-word teasers with the last one of course reading: "BURMA SHAVE." A silly, time-killer for bored kids, this advertising gimmick made the makers of the shaving cream company rich beyond their wildest aspirations.

"A MAN, A MISS. A CAR, A CURVE. HE KISSED THE MISS. AND MISSED. THE CURVE. BURMA SHAVE." And that's the difference between then and now, mildly humorous messages on the side of the road and a very pissed off woman telling the world her exhusband has a Teenie Weenie Peenie.

And Todd, deliver the damn gravel already! And no, not on his front porch!

A Massey couple, Alexcie Dillen and Dylan Latendresse, are thrilled with the impending arrival of their baby girl, but they are also apprehensive.

Alexcie was told back on February 20th, 21weeks into her pregnancy, that baby Malia has the most severe form of spina bifida there is.

This is when the spinal column fails to close early in fetal development causing damage to the baby's spinal cord, nervous system and possible other effects.

The baby is scheduled to be delivered by cesarean section on June 21st at Toronto's Sick Kids hospital, so Alexcie travelled to Toronto in early June.

Doctors will be assessing the baby and what surgery she will require once the delivery has taken place.

The North Shore Cruisers and Knight Cruisers clubs donated \$2,600 to the family to offset costs not covered by government or support programs, since Alexcie will have to stay in Toronto while her baby receives care.

The presentation was made in early June.

Espanola Council Rescinds Siding Exemption

By Rosalind Russell - In late May, Espanola councillor Ron Duplessis asked for a motion that anyone doing siding on their home be exempt from a building permit, unless there were structural considerations. He said, to his knowledge, other communities did not charge a building permit for doing siding (also called cladding) and that he didn't think it fell under the Ontario Building Code.

Council agreed and passed the motion, but also directed that there be more information provided by other municipalities and the town's building inspection office. Building inspector Dan Rivet told council at its regular

meeting on June 12th that absolutely everything and anything to do with construction of any building of any type is in the Ontario Building Code, so there are no exemptions.

Councillor Bill Foster pointed out the town only averages around 10 or so requests for siding every year.

In the end, council rescinded the May bylaw and now anyone doing any siding must apply for a permit from the municipal building inspection office.

Espanola Council Agrees To Purchase Of New Fire Truck

By Rosalind Russell - The Town of Espanola will have a new pumper/tanker truck by next summer.

Council ordered the tendering process and sent out packages to three different companies since both the current fire trucks will be 20 years old next year. The fire department must have one truck less than 20 years old to meet required standards. Only one bid came back, Fort Garry Industries for a quote of \$381,910.

With council's approval, the new truck will be ordered, outfitted and is expected to be delivered next summer.

McColeman Sentencing Expected End Of The Month



By Rosalind Russell - An Espanola man convicted of several sex-related charges involving several young boys is expected to be sentenced in the near future.

Sentencing hearing dates of June 27th and 28th in Sudbury court for Paul McColeman have been set according to The Crown.

The Crown says it will be seeking either a dangerous offender or long-term offender designation for McColeman. He also underwent a psychiatric assessment last fall.

McColeman, 45, has been in custody since he was convicted June 29th, 2017 of 34 sex-related and luring charges in Espanola over an eight-year period.

Two of the luring convictions were stayed leaving McColeman with 32 convictions for sentencing purposes.

Still with the story, according to a website, Justice 4 Paul, supporters want the sentencing over with, so they can begin the appeal process.

The site also indicates they will not be seeking a psychiatric assessment of their own although McColeman is legally entitled to it.

Recipe

Who doesn't love dill pickles? My girlfriend makes this yummy Dill Pickle Pasta Salad and it is one of my favourite pasta

salads ever. In this creamy pasta salad, dill pickles play a starring role and add tons of flavour and crunch! This recipe is even better when it's made ahead of time, making it the perfect potluck dish or to pack for your lunch.

Dill Pickle Pasta Salad

- 1/2 lb dry shell pasta about 3 cups
- 3/4 cup diced dill pickles (baby dills give the best crunch)
- 2/3 cup cheddar cheese diced
- 3 tablespoons finely diced white onion (red onion, green onions or chives)
- 2 tablespoons fresh dill
- 1/2 cup pickle juice

DRESSING

- 2/3 cup mayonnaise
- 1/3 cup sour cream
- 1/8 tsp cayenne pepper
- 4 tablespoons pickle juice
- salt & pepper to taste
- 1. Boil pasta al dente according to package directions. Run under cold water to stop cooking.
- 2. Toss cold pasta with about 1/2 cup of pickle juice and set aside for about 5 minutes. Drain & discard pickle juice.
- 3. Combine all dressing ingredients in a small bowl and mix well.
- 4. Toss all ingredients in a large bowl. Refrigerate at least 1 hour before serving.
