The Shelter Lady – And Other Cruel Big-Sister Tricks

highest compliment a humourist can hear as in: "You're a pretty funny guy." Inevitably, this is tempered with: "But you're like, well, kinda screwed up. No offense." Truth is, they're probably right. But trust me, it's not my fault.

I was born on October 18, 1946 at the Welland County General Hospital a few hours after Nadine Jowett. Two scrubbedred, screaming, twitching, naked babies in adjoining beds – I would eventually fall madly in love with Nadine Jowett even though at one point that day she was like ten times my age.

A little later in life, during Grades 7 and 8 at S.S. No. 4 in Dain City, Nadine and I spent so much time ogling each other across the classroom, Mr. Hodgkins had to place a barrier between us. That barrier was Jimmy Nelson.

Love dies an agonizing death when you're twelve and breaking up plunged me into a well of depression so black, so deep, so desolate only Donald Trump's personal attorney has been to that dark place.

Once born and breathing, I was released from the Welland County General Hospital on my own recognizance and lived at 124

Occasionally people will award me the Dunkirk in the wartime houses in Welland. At 14 days of age, family tradition dictated that my mother turn the frail and frothing baby boy over to his older sister to hold in preparation of a decade of babysitting. And they say my sister Gail was a very good holder of newborn baby boys but that she had the attention span of a fruit fly in heat.

"Oh Joan," Gail yelled to my sister, rushing to the living room window, "there goes Roger Carbonneau, that cute guy you like so much!"

Gail forgot one thing. Me. Eye witnesses, my mother being one, would later marvel: "He bounced ... he hit the hardwood floor head first and he actually bounced right up in the air."

It was a shame that Gail was by this time trying to pry the window open to invite Roger in, otherwise she might have made a gem of a recovery, grabbing me on the first bounce. And then throw me to Joan for the

Despite the early efforts of my older sisters, I lived to the age of two whereupon Gail was generous enough to include me in her daily neighborhood bicycle rides. Had my mother known that Gail had a two-year-

old balanced on the back fender with feet on the wheel nuts and fingernails embedded in the leather seat, she'd have beaten her severely about the neck and ears with Plymouth Cordage Grade B rope.

What Gail lacked in mental sharpness she more than made up for in friendliness. "Follow me" she said to a man in a car who'd asked directions to a neighbour's house. And we sped off with me hanging on for dear, sweet life.

When a car backed out of a driveway ahead on the right, Gail cut left causing the man in the car behind us to run us over. I was thrown into a ditch and a coma, pretty much simultaneously. Gail, as was the case in all our early death-defying calamities, came away without a scratch.

I would survive the crash and live to see both Joan and Gail reach the apex of their misspent youth - 'The Shelter Lady' game. In this game, the origin of which is largely accredited to medical experiments conducted by the Third Reich, two grown up girls taunt, torment and terrorize a three-year-old boy with the story that he was adopted, abandoned on the doorstep of the Children's Aid Shelter by a band of migrant tobacco pickers and today - if he's not good, while the parents are away – today is the day that 'The Shelter Lady' comes to take him back. Long before Donald Trump libeled Obama, my sisters were the original "birthers."

They got a good year of cruel and unusual punishment out of 'The Shelter Lady' game until I began to believe the reassurances of my mother who backed it up with a certificate of birth.

So I was buying none of it until one day while my sister Gail was out of the house, Joan telephoned 'the Shelter Lady.' And she came! I laughed right up until I heard the rapping of the cane on the back door. When I saw the old black hat, the black veil and black gloves I knew I was deader than Frankie Sokolski's dog, mashed by a dump truck the previous day.

I hid in the bathroom for one month, shook uncontrollably for two years and was a model child for nine years after the incident. When I was a salesman with the 3M Company my manager Richard Smythe used to get record sales out of me by threatening me with 'The Shelter Lady' gambit.

It wasn't until recently I learned that Gail and 'The Shelter Lady were one and the same witch. So if you're thinking to yourself as you read my columns, "Boy, is this guy screwed up or what?" have some compassion. You're right of course, but I've had a real rough childhood.

Groundbreaking Ceremony for New Double School in Espanola



Despite a touch of rain, a groundbreaking ceremony was a well-attended affair in Espanola. Ecole Ste. Joseph hosted the ceremony with some 150 people in attendance June 18th for the official launch of construction of the new double school.

Students. parents, staff. supporters, board members and elected officials all gathered together to host a Blessing of the Land ceremony and to pose with shovels in the ground. The project will house Ecole Ste. Joseph and Ecole Franco-Ouest as one school. from JK to Grade 12, and Sacred Heart elementary, and barring any delays, is to open its doors for September 2020. The new building, which will be located on the current Sacred Heart School and former St-Louis de France Catholic Church properties, will house a French-language (kindergarten school grade 12) operated by the Conseil scolaire catholique du Nouvel-Ontario (CSCNO) English-language and an school (kindergarten to grade 8) operated by the Huron-Superior Catholic District School Board (HSCDSB). The shared site, with its two distinct schools, will welcome students from Sacred Heart Catholic Elementary School,

École Saint-Joseph and École secondaire catholique Franco-Ouest in two years time. The site will also include 50 daycare spaces in each school. This \$25.2 million project, funded by the Ministry of Education, is the result of a request made by the Ministry of Education to the school boards in Espanola to work together in addressing student accommodation needs the area. The goal here is to maximize the use of space while ensuring that all students continue to have access to the best programming possible in quality school facilities.

"The joint project will enhance Catholic education in Espanola while ensuring that linguistic differences are respected," said André Bidal, President of the CSCNO. "We are happy to see it come to fruition and excited to welcome all of our Francophone students, from kindergarten to grade 12, in a single institution of learning where they can study and grow together."

"This is great news for our students, our staff and the community of Espanola at large. The new facility will enhance the learning experience for all students, both English and French," added John Caputo, Chair of the HSCDSB.



Highway Six Construction Underway In Espanola

Highway Six reconstruction is underway in Espanola, but there will be open lanes of traffic most of the time.

Public information sessions held in mid-June revealed that the project will be carried out in several phases, so there will be lanes of traffic moving between Station Road and

Second Avenue on Highway Six.

The brunt of the project, roadwork, water-main and sewer line construction will be carried out between now and November.

Asphalt work and other work that needs to be done will be completed next year.


A campaign is underway to raise enough money to buy a new wheelchair-accessible van for a Massey family and their handicapped daughter.

Espanola's Riley Nadeau To Join **Blind River Beavers**



The New Tecumseth Civics are very proud to announce the advancement of last year's Captain Riley Nadeau to the Blind River Beavers of the Northern Ontario Junior Hockey League (NOJHL) for the upcoming 2018-2019 season.

The NOJHL is a Junior 'A' Hockey League that is a part of the bigger CJHL and the NOJHL has been responsible for sending numerous players to the NHL including current Florida Panthers Captain Derek Mackenzie and Vegas Golden Knights Defenseman Colin Miller.

Nadeau, the highest scoring captain in Civics history, was an offensive dynamo last year (producing at a clip much higher than a point per game) totaling 64 points (25G, 39A) in just 41 games throughout the season good for the 2nd best total points output in the franchises short history since rebranding from the Alliston Coyotes. Nadeau's point total also put him 4th among U20 players in the league (1st U20 in North Division and 29th among all players) putting him in an elite group of players including South Division MVP Eisai Arai.

Nadeau paced the Civics offensively leading the team in both goals and assists while adding 4 game winning goals, 4 on the power play and 2 shorthanded all while limiting himself to just 18 PIM all year. At peak Nadeau was ranked the #11 player in the entire Northern Division in the GMHL power rankings The 1998 born forward


came to the Civics from

the Espanola Express in the NOJHL where he was coming off a career year in which he had 22 points (8G, 14 A) in 56 games for his hometown team. The Civics choice for Offensive Player of the Year has a history of being able to facilitate the game on the ice with his hustle and leadership qualities that numbers don't always show.

When asked about joining Blind River and his time in New Tecumseth, Nadeau had plenty to say: "I'm excited about joining the Beavers and playing my 20 year as a part of Hockey Canada. I'd like to thank New Tec for everything the organization has done for me and to better mature me. Last season was a great year and a stepping stone for me as an individual and as a teammate."

Standing at 5'10" Nadeau is able to use his size and work his way in and out of the scoring offensive zone while maintaining a steady two way presence, a style of play he partially developed while playing for Espanola Secondary School where he put up 41 Points in 21 Games in the CAHS.





NOTICE OF THE PASSING OF ZONING BYLAW (Planning Act-Section 34)

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers passed Bylaw 2018-27 on the 13th day of June, 2018.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the zoning amendment is to rezone lands from Recycling Depot to Composting Facility. The effect is to provide for zoning approval required for applicable approvals from the Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change. The land to which the bylaw applies is described as Shakespeare Township, Concession 2, South-Half Lot 4, Parcel 5985, Firehall Road. This application is not subject of any other application under the Planning Act.

APPEAL - The last date for filing a notice of appeal of the by-law is July 16, 2018. Any such appeal must be filed with the clerk of the municipality and must set out the reasons for the appeal and must be accompanied by the fee required by the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal. Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal a by-law to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal. A notice of appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a notice of appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group on its behalf. No person or public body shall be added as a party to the hearing of the appeal unless, before the by-law was passed, the person of public body made oral submissions at a public meeting or written submissions to the Council of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers or, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

This bylaw is available for inspection in the municipal office during regular office hours.

Recipe

I tried this recipe on the weekend and they seriously were some of the best cupcakes I've ever made; they were a huge hit. By simply adding a few extra



ingredients to a boxed cake mix you get a flavourful cupcake with a moist, fluffy texture. The cupcakes come out with a flat top and don't rise into a mound like most cupcakes do, which gives you a flat base for piping frosting on. They are perfect for topping with a buttercream frosting for special occasions, hence the name "White Wedding" cupcakes. This recipe can also be made into a cake(s). You can frost these with a frosting of your choice, but I will include the recipe for buttercream frosting which works well if you are doing some fancy decorating.

White Wedding Cupcakes.

- 1 box white cake mix
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 cup granulated white sugar
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/3 cups water
- 2 tablespoons vegetable or canola oil
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 cup sour cream
- 4 large egg whites

Preheat oven to 325°F. Place cupcake liners in cupcake pans (you'll need approx. 24-36). In a large bowl, whisk together cake mix, flour, sugar and salt. Add remaining ingredients and beat with hand mixer for 2 minutes, or until well blended. Use an ice cream scoop to fill prepared cupcake tins-fill about 3/4 full. Bake about 18 minutes, or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.

Buttercream Frosting

- 3 cups powdered sugar
- 1 cup butter, at room temperature
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract (use clear extract, if you really want it white)
- 1 to 2 tablespoons whipping or half and half cream

In a large bowl, with a hand or stand mixer, cream together sugar and butter on low speed. Mix until well blended. Increase speed to medium and beat for another 3 minutes. Add vanilla and 1 tablespoon of cream and continue to beat on medium speed for 1 minute more. Add more cream if needed for desired spreading/piping consistency. Scoop into a piping bag and pipe decoratively onto cupcakes, or spread onto cupcakes as desired.
