Manager of Diagnostic Imaging, Phil Smith says the unit used for vascular ultrasound needs replacing.


"It is the ultrasound unit used for vascular ultrasound. It is also a back up unit for general ultrasound. So it's primary use is procedures involving arteries and veins. We are looking for blockages, aneurysms (bulges in the vessel), blood clots in the veins and many other things," explains Smith.


Smith says the old one was state of the art when it was purchased however is now at the end of it's life.

Dealing With Bell And Fighting Through Wireless Hell

their new fiber optics service when they introduced it to my neighbourhood a few years ago. Way too expensive. But recently I heard about a \$100 per month offer and called Richard, the local Bell salesman. After he consulted with three Bell 'experts,' he said it wasn't possible. "You're in a black hole." But Richard, I argued, the optics line goes over and above my driveway and all my neighbours are plugged in and if I cut that line they'll all be switching over to my new system, Black Screen/Bad Optics. Richard said he'd get back to me me, which he never has.

I kept calling until I got a slick Toronto salesman who laughed at Richard's "black hole" theory. Not only was I eligible for Fibe 300, he could have it installed first thing Monday morning. \$100? Yeah, sure. Done! The installation takes most of the day, but by five o'clock my house is wired to the future - WiFi, phone and fax lines and not one, but two TVs receiving Bell's "Good Package" of channels. When I told "Slick" in Toronto what programming I'd been getting with Shaw, he scoffed: "Way more, way better with Bell." Oddly, when I asked the installation guy questions about channels he hesitated, guessed and then finally admitted he doesn't own a television!!!

I did not bite on Bell's initial offer of A bit of a give-away right there because by noon the next day everything crashed. First the televisions went dead. Then I was on the phone with a Bell troubleshooter trying to get the TVs working when the phones went silent. And when I went out to my office to email Bell repair, my computer was down as well. Bit of a give-away #2 – their email address is "NoReply-BellService."

So as a proud, one-day member of Bill's Fibe 300 Club, I find myself three doors down asking a handyman in a neighbour's cottage if I can borrow his cell phone to call Bell!?! And just before I used up all his power, it works! Angelo, a troubleshooter in Toronto gets my phones and computers running again and promises to have a repairman come out the next morning to fix the TVs. Because I can't call him personally, I ask Angelo to call me back in the morning so I don't have to keep repeating my problems to new techies, but no. He cannot call out. He's a Bell Telephone employee using a phone that only works one way. Plus, he can't accept calls. That's a little like a car salesman who doesn't own a driver's licence. I remind him back in 1876 that would have been a real big problem for Alexander Graham Bell who would have had to use sign language to summon his assistant Thomas Watson! I can

Espanola Public Library's First Escape Room A Hugh Success

By Jaymie Muncaster - On Friday March 16th and Saturday March 17th the Espanola Public Library ran their very first Escape Room - a group activity where participants are locked inside a themed adventure room and must figure out how to escape before the time runs out. The library's escape room was appropriately named "The Abandoned Library" and was set inside of a dusty, old, deserted library room.

The teams consisted of 4-6 people who were charged a small fee of \$3 per person. Groups entered the escape room, which was located in the library's meeting room, and the timer was set. They had 60 minutes to locate 4 code numbers, arrange them in order, and slide them under the door to be released. Finding the clues involved things like decoding secret messages, using black-light flashlights to uncover invisible ink, and locating hidden keys for various locked boxes and closets.

The room was designed by library employees Shylene Lingenfelter and Jaymie Muncaster, who said that "escaping the room required a lot of teamwork and creative thinking." After months of planning, the library staff were elated to see all the time slots fill up in a matter of days. In total, they had 7 teams participate in the escape room, 3 of which managed to locate all of the code numbers and escape before the time ran out.

First place was awarded to

Alyx Podlatis and Alex Shank, who escaped in 40 minutes despite the fact that half of their team was unable to make it. For winning first place, they received a free large pizza and 8 breadsticks, courtesy of Toppers Pizza. Second place was awarded to Natasha Elliott, Jeff Elliott, Alexis Elliott, Sierra Elliott, Cindy Lalonde, and Real Lalonde, who escaped in 43 minutes. For second place they received a "movie night" package, which included pop, popcorn, and a brand new DVD. All proceeds from the escape room will be used for future library programming, which, as a result of much positive feedback, will include another escape room at the end of June. Stay tuned!

community needs to be assured that when they come to this facility, that they are getting the best possible test. The same tests are being done but will have better images," explains Smith.

And he also emphasizes with more tests being able to be done in Espanola, people will not have to travel, especially those who have chronic illnesses that make it difficult to travel.

"If you get better image quality, inevitably you will reduce the amount of people heading elsewhere for testing. For example, those tough cases where you had difficulty seeing something in the past thereby not able to confidently rule something out would likely result in testing elsewhere ie Cat Scan, MRI or even more invasive procedures such as angios (dye test). This causes delays in treatment, anxiety, costs to the system, and risks. A newer unit may have simply

obtained the images needed and ended it there."

The new piece of equipment is expected to cost around \$200,000 and Smith hopes to have it installed within the next 12 months. His department continues to use the equipment available and he believes no shut down will be needed.

"A quick configuration to hook up to our computer systems (half hour, literally a few settings) and then plug the unit in. We get an applications specialist from the vendor to come on site to show us how to use it to it's potential. They would be here for 2 or 3 days, and they are also accessible after for help by phone, email or even they could actually remote in to the unit if we need them to. The technologist then just needs to get used to where everything is. They need to get to know where the buttons are, so that they basically watch the scanning screen and don't need to find the different functions." Smith says the original machine was installed in January, 2007, and thousands have benefited from the service.

"I don't know of any other hospital of this size that offer this range of vascular testing. Because of this, we pull from not only our catchment area, but also Blind River, Elliot Lake, Manitoulin and the west side of Sudbury. This saves patients from these outlying areas from needing to drive into Sudbury. The wait times are also greatly reduced.

Funding for the new piece of equipment has to be raised locally with limited supports from other supports including government, so the Espanola Hospital Auxiliary is already undertaking the task to cover the cost with its Mother's Day Draw coming up and other fundraisers.

Donations can also be made in memory of a loved one.

Recipe

Making bread or dinner rolls can be a scary thought for many people, I'm one of those people. BUT I found this recipe online and have made it three times



with amazing results. It is much easier and foolproof if you have a stand mixer, but this recipe can be made the old fashioned way using a wooden spoon and then kneading. These are perfectly soft, homemade dinner rolls that will look impressive on your Easter table. Don't be afraid to try it.

Simple Delicious Homemade Dinner Rolls Yield: 24 rolls

- 2 cups warm milk (warm in the microwave until luke warm)
- 2 tablespoons instant dry yeast
- ¼ cup white granulated sugar
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 6 tablespoons salted butter, softened
- 2 large eggs
- 6 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon melted butter

In the bowl of a stand mixer, combine warm milk, yeast, sugar, salt, butter, and eggs. Add in 5½ cups of flour. Using



a dough hook, turn the mixer on to a low speed. Once the flour starts to incorporate into the dough, increase the speed to a medium. Slowly add the remaining ½ cup of flour until the dough pulls away from the sides of the bowl. The dough mixture should be slightly sticky and soft. Add more or less flour until the dough reaches the desired consistency. The amount of flour you add in bread making is always an approximation and you should go by feel. Transfer the dough to a lightly greased mixing bowl. Cover with parchment paper and then a towel and let rise 90 minutes in a warm spot. Lightly grease a baking sheet. Punch down the dough and form into 24 rolls. Place on the greased baking sheet in six rows of four. Cover again, and let rise 1 hour. Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Bake the rolls for 12 to 14 minutes, until lightly browned. Remove rolls from oven and brush with melted butter. Serve the rolls warm, or to cool, let rest on the pan for 15 minutes before transferring to a wire cooling rack. Once cooled completely, store in a plastic bag.
