#### Espanola Council Votes OPP



**By Rosalind Russell** - Espanola Council unanimously voted to disband the Espanola Police Service and switch to Ontario Provincial Police.

Espanola Mayor Ron Piche was not in attendance for the April 24th meeting, but no reason was given publicly for his absence. However, family members confirm he had open heart surgery and is in recovery.

Councillor Ron Duplessis summarized the direction council took in making its decision.

Duplessis says the projected savings of \$5 million put together by CAO Cynthia Townsend and staff has been verified by KPMG, the fourth largest accounting firm in the world, and the decision making process relies on that expertise. He adds the issue will divide families, organizations, workplace relationships,

# Three Candidates For Algoma-Manitoulin Riding To Take On Mantha

With the election just over 46 days away, three parties have named their candidates for the Ontario election.

Little Current businessman, Jib Turner, was appointed as candidate for Algoma-Manitoulin by Ontario Progressive Conservative (PC) Party leader Doug Ford.

Turner is a fifth-generation owner of Turners of Little Current and has been a longtime member of the PCs.

Tommy Lee, will be the Northern Ontario Party (NOP) candidate for Algoma-Manitoulin in the provincial elections taking place June 7.

Party President, born, raised, and residing in the central Algoma area, Lee will push a platform to make Northern Ontario a power in its own right.

Justin Tilson is also representing the Green Party in this election. Tilson is an entrepreneur, IT professional and not for profit director born and raised on Manitoulin Island.

The Liberal Party has not named or appointed a candidate for the riding as of press time. The candidates will take on incumbent New Democrat Mike Mantha, who was first elected in 2011.

## **Espanola Council Continuing Discussions On Fire Hall Options**



By Rosalind Russell - Espanola Council will be reviewing the latest report for a new fire hall.

Espanola Fire Chief Mike Pichor had already presented one design plan, but was asked by council for a revamped proposal, smaller in size and less expensive, which he presented to council at its regular meeting on April 25th. He says the estimated cost for the latest design is \$2,160,000, but will meet the new standards and have the room the department needs.

However, Councillor Ray Dufour believes it is still too big and too costly and says he won't vote in favour. He wants to see yet a smaller footprint and more cost savings when it comes to building a new fire hall.

Councillor Ron Duplessis also

pointed out that there has been a fair amount of time spent on the issue and believes council should speed up the process. meeting every two weeks, rather than once a month to discuss the issue.

Council reached a consensus on that particular issue and in the end, decided to review the report and other options at a special meeting.

They also asked the CAO to provide a cost comparison of the options for their review.

Deputy Mayor Bill Foster also thanked an Espanola construction company who came forward to provide a design and cost of their own for the new building. Foster says they appreciate the effort and will look at, but made the point that once a decision is made, the project will go to tender.

and it is going to displace some people in the community, but the decision has to be based on what is good for all the community.

The Town of Espanola and the OPP have to sign the contract. Once that is done, those two parties and the Espanola Police Service Board will apply to the Ontario Civilian Police Commission for approval.

The commission ensures an agreement is in place between the Espanola Police Service Board and Espanola Police Service employees in respect to severances or arbitration.

A full transition to OPP is anticipated to take place by January, 2019.

Renovations to both the OPP detachment on Highway 17 and the Espanola Police Service building in downtown Espanola are also part of the deal at an estimated \$450,000.

The seven dispatchers with the municipal service, four full-time and three parttime, will all lose their positions. Dispatching would be handled out of the North Bay Communication Centre through the 911 access number. However, the Town will also have to look at contracting out for fire dispatch, and other arrangements will also have to be made for hydro or gas emergencies, which were handled by the local dispatchers in the past.

I had a request for some healthy recipes for make ahead lunches or light dinners. After some research and taste testing, here is my first recipe for you. Loaded with fresh veggies and





#### **Greek Quinoa Bowls**
