### **Active Forest Fires Across Sudbury Region**

The fire danger is high across Northern Ontario and the public should be aware of their responsibilities.

One fire was close to Nairn Centre, but is under control. As of May 16th, Sudbury fire number 5, is under control.

It covers 12 hectares, is located approximately six kilometres south of Nairn Centre, east of Wabagishik Lake

There were ten active forest fires in the Northeast Region, by May 15th.

The forest fire hazard is moderate to high across the region and the public is asked to take precautions.

If you're planning to perform any outdoor burning, make sure you have tools and water on-hand to put your fire out; and never leave it unattended. Fires are to be started no sooner than two hours before sunset and extinguished no later than two hours after sunrise.

If you must burn, make sure you know the rules and follow Ontario's outdoor burning regulations to ensure you burn grass and woody debris safely. Residents of municipalities should also check any local bylaws that may be in effect prior to burning.

## New OPP Auxiliaries A Possibility For Manitoulin-Espanola OPP

By Rosalind Russell - Want to know what it is like to work with the Ontario Provincial Police – the auxiliary is a great way to find out.

The OPP recently removed Espanola's detachment from the Sudbury office and blended it with Manitoulin Island.

Now that working relationship has been established, Manitoulin-Espanola OPP Community Safety Officer, Marie Ford, says she hopes there is enough interest to auxiliary units both in Espanola and on Manitoulin Island.

Ford adds they are looking for interested individuals between 18 to 65 years of age.

Anyone interested in becoming an auxiliary police officer must spend 10 hours on patrol with an OPP officer as well as maintain six hours of training every month including the use of force and firearms, although they cannot carry guns.

Ford said that auxiliary police are trained in the use of force. They are also trained to use firearms, but cannot carry them.

Anyone interested in applying to the Auxiliary Policing Program, go to www.opp. ca. The application form can be printed out. There will also be information about the program, duties and specifics for qualifying. Once the application has been filled out it should be marked 'Auxiliary Application' and dropped off at either the Little Current or Gore Bay OPP detachments on Manitoulin and at the Espanola detachment, with the line: to the attention of Sargent John Parsley.

### NE LHIN Funding Aboriginal Health Centre In Espanola And Massey

The North East Local Health Integration Network (NE LHIN) is directing funding to help ensure primary health care for more people in the local area.

Part of the investment of \$1.9 million is supporting an Aboriginal Health Access Centre (AHAC) in two North Shore corridor communities.

Noojmowin-Teg Aboriginal Health Access Centre is receiving \$810,000 to expand to Indigenous people in Espanola and Massey.

The new services will include a full-time nurse practitioner who will provide clinical services within the Espanola Family Health Team.

The Centre Place will house a full-time Indigenous mental health and addiction counsellor and cultural support worker and will include a culturally specific space for counselling and traditional services, as well as an activity space for workshops and cultural safety training.

Health Centre executive director, Pamela Williamson, says she is pleased to receive funding for an expansion of primary care services to Anishinabe people living within Espanola and area.

She added as a priority, the organization will seek to engage the community in greater awareness of the new services, develop pathways for referrals and linked services with Espanola partners, and ensure that the services respond to the needs of clients.

# The Town Of Espanola Is Ready To Wheel Out Its Espanola Commuter Cycle Plan

Espanola EDO, Cheryl Kennelly stated in a press release, that the Wheels Out for Bike Month Community engagement is at the crux of Espanola's Commuter Cycle Plan.

She says the people of Espanola will help build the framework to develop an active transportation network to improve cycling infrastructure, trail identification, signage and cycling amenities.

Bike month will kick off in Espanola with a public bike tour on Friday June 1st at both 1pm and/or 6pm with the consulting team from Share the Road Cycling Coalition & Liem Strategic Integration.

It will include a guided 90-minute, family friendly ride around Espanola.

The public bike tour will begin at the Town Office and end at the Recreation Complex for refreshments and an exchange on what participants view as the opportunities and challenges for cyclists in Espanola. Still with the story, Kennelly adds Oraclepoll will also begin a telephone survey the week of June 1st to garner community input for the plan. The community is also invited to participate in an online survey.

The month will wrap up on June 27th with a Stakeholder Consultation Workshop and a Community Consultation Session.

## Recipe

This Rice Pilaf recipe is perfect with anything from chicken to fish and makes a great change from plain white rice. It's quick, easy, full of flavour, adaptable,



and so much better than packaged rice. It's a perfect way to use up leftovers; you can add vegetables or meat to make it a one pot meal. You can also turn it into a vegetarian dish by using vegetable stock. I found the original recipe too salty, so I have cut back the amount of salt used. Season to your taste.

#### Rice Pilaf

- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter
- ½ small onion chopped
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 tbsp dried parsley
- 1 cup long grain rice (Uncle Ben's never fails me)
- 2 cups chicken stock

Melt the butter with the onion in a medium saucepan over medium heat. Season with the salt & pepper and cook until the onions are soft, about 5 minutes. Add the rice and stir until coated with the butter. Increase the heat to mediumhigh. Stir in chicken stock, bay leaf and parsley. Raise the heat to medium-high heat and bring to a boil. As soon as

it reaches a boil, lower the heat to a low heat, cover and cook until all the stock has been absorbed by the rice and the rice is tender, about 15 to 18 minutes. Remove from the heat and let set for 5 minutes. Discard the bay leaf. Fluff the rice and serve.


