Huron Central Railway To Be Shut Down By End Of The Year

NDP Candidate Mantha of Algoma-Manitoulin has announced the NDP's Funding Commitment to keep The Huron Central Railway operating. Mantha says if the NDP forms the government on June 7, it will take action on its Northern Rail Strategy, which will fund the province's fair share of capital costs for Huron Central Railway - \$4 million per year for five years. Mantha was responding to the announcement by Genesee & Wyoming Canada Inc. on Tuesday, May 22nd, that given the lack of necessary provincial funding to maintain its Huron Central Railway (HCRY) and following the recent refusal of support from Transport Canada's National Trade Corridors Fund, its HCRY subsidiary intends to discontinue operations by the end of 2018.

The Northern Ontario short line runs 283 km from Sault Ste. Marie to Sudbury under a 1997 lease agreement with

Michael Canadian Pacific Railway and serves major employers in the region, including DOMTAR in Espanola, Algoma Steel in Sault Ste. Marie and EACOM in Nairn Centre, which together ship approximately 13,000 annual carloads of Strategy,

HCRY has 44 employees and supports approximately 7,000 indirect jobs in Northern Ontario.

Changes commodity in demand resulting in carload declines. coupled increased maintenance and regulatory compliance costs have made the railroad economically unviable without strategic investments government. While Ontario provincial government has provided interim funding through a regional development agency, this will not support the line's operations beyond the end of the year.

In 2010, HCRY received both federal and provincial funding

to proceed with essential maintenance and rehabilitation costs intended to keep the rail line operational until 2015. During that time, HCRY contributed three times more than anticipated, enabling the company to keep the railway safe and operational through 2018.

Despite intense efforts and numerous meetings with provincial officials to make them aware of the railway's critical financial situation, HCRY has been unable to obtain long-term financial support to continue operations. As of today, there is still no federal government infrastructure program that addresses adequately funding needs of short line freight railways such as HCRY, which as low-volume lines, typically inherited years of deferred maintenance from prior operators.

"We are obviously disappointed with this turn of events," said Louis Gravel, President of Genesee & Wyoming Canada Inc. "We have done everything in our power to keep HCRY in operation, but both the provincial and federal governments have turned a deaf ear on the situation."

The company is calling on provincial and federal government decision-makers to reconsider supporting the short line rail system in the immediate term to maintain the thousands of jobs HCRY supports in Northern Ontario. "Many of our key customers rely on the railway as the only wighly transportation option."

rely on the railway as the only viable transportation option," noted Gravel. "Closure of the railway eliminates the potential for regional economic development opportunities in the North, along with other public benefits, including reduction in pollution levels and road maintenance costs, as transport trucks will fill the gap left behind by HCRY."

As of press time, DOMTAR, EACOM and political reps has been contacted for a statement.



The Portuguese, you have to understand love their country with great passion and defend their birth places fiercely. Their hearts may sing from the sad songbook of Fado, but they are madly patriotic, going way out of their way to show respect and generosity to strangers.

"Oh no," said Maria, returning to place another glass of red on my tray table. "Try this one." What followed was a rather heated oenophile debate between an expert on Portuguese wines and a guy from Wainfleet who just hit spell-check before he typed in the word 'oenophile.' Save School Committee Works Towards Feasibility Study To Save School

It will not cost Espanola ratepayers any money, but council is lending its support to a feasibility study to save AB Ellis Public School.

The school now houses Sacred Heart Catholic School students and staff while construction gets underway on a new triple school, which is not scheduled to open until 2020.

Gary Clackett of the Save AB Ellis Committee told council the feasibility study is the first step. He told council the feasibility study is the first step in saving the school, which is scheduled to be demolished and used for a parking lot once the new school opens.

Clackett adds they want to get the feasibility study for repurposing the building for senior apartments and affordable housing units, done as soon as possible to show there are other uses for the school.

He adds they are not looking at one particular grant right now, but are looking at different agencies which provide grants for this type of study.

Council agreed to support the commissioning of the study, which will include a current building assessment of the school and considerations as they relate to a change of use for their proposed development.

The Rainbow District School Board owns the property and will be approached for permission to carry out the study.

- 12 ounces orzo pasta
- 6 cups chicken broth
- 2 cups grape or cherry tomatoes, halved
- 4 tablespoons thinly sliced chives or green onions
- 3 tablespoons chopped fresh basil
- cup arugula or baby spinach, coarsely chopped
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 cup feta cheese, crumbled
- ½ cup pine nuts, toasted (heat them in a dry skillet over medium-low heat, tossing often until golden)

For the dressing, whisk together the vinegar, lemon juice, honey and oil. Season to taste with a bit of salt and pepper. Set aside.

For the salad, cook the orzo in the chicken broth until tender according to package directions. Drain well but do not rinse. Let the pasta cool to room temperature, tossing often so it doesn't stick together (stir in 1-2 tablespoons of the dressing if the pasta is overly sticky). Toss the cooled pasta with the tomatoes, chives or green onions, basil, and arugula or spinach. Pour the vinaigrette over the salad and stir to coat the ingredients with the dressing. Season with salt and pepper, if needed. Sprinkle the feta and pine nuts over the top and toss lightly. Serve at room temperature.

*This salad, if refrigerated longer than an hour, will get a bit dry so if you want to make it in advance, consider increasing the dressing ingredients by half and reserving some of that dressing to pour over the salad right before serving (also, wait to add pine nuts right before serving).
