In one deal, the owner of a Pacific coast franchise could not wait to hear Shore rant and rave at receiving a player who was about to arrive at his Massachusetts office with his arm broken and in a sling. The same West Coast owner was not so anxious to hear from Shore when



major-league ballplayers to ever pick up a bat and glove. Mary played first base for the 1962 New York Mets, widely regarded as the worst team in modern baseball history, with just 40 wins in a 160-game season. This team was so bad that the manager, Charles Dillon "Casey" Stengel, looked up and down the Mets dugout one day and screamed: "Can't anybody here play this game?" New York City's wonderful slice-of-life columnist Jimmy Breslin wrote a bestseller posing that question as the title.

At practice one day, weak-hitting "Marvelous Marv" was bouncing ground balls off his glove like it was made of solid steel. That's when the legendary manager, seventy-two years old at the time, relieved him at first base. Stengel hadn't played the game in more than thirty-seven years, but he was sure he could still show Throneberry a thing or two. "Stand over there Marvin and watch!"

Stengel barked at the catcher to hit him a ground ball, which he did. The soft roller went through Stengel's legs. (I did mention he was forty-three years older than Throneberry, right?)

"Hit it like a man!" he yelled. The catcher complied and that one went over Stengel's shoulder.

"One more," screamed the manager and that one hit him in the shin before he could quite bend over.

Stengel dropped Throneberry's

glove and kicked it across the foul line and as he stomped off the field he yelled back over his shoulder: "Throneberry, you have f----d up this position so badly, nobody can play it!" Practice was cancelled due to unending laughter.

Later, on Throneberry's birthday, Stengel, whose nickname was "the Old Perfessor" eased up on his favourite first baseman. "We were going to get you a cake, Marvin," said the manager, "but, well, you know, we figured you'd drop that too!"

For the sake of comic relief and memorable entertainment, some days players like Marv Throneberry bring more value to their sports than the ones who play the game well. And that's what it's all about, because if you take entertainment out of sports, all you have left are the stats.

Despite the futility of the 1962 Mets – you have to go back to 1899 to find a team with more season losses – New York fans came out in droves. Their total attendance of 922,530 spectators was the sixth highest in the league that year. Who doesn't love an underdog? Today with all the emphasis on winning, a team like the 1962 Mets would be playing to an empty stadium. Along with team allegiance, we've lost the good-natured humour in sports.

News From The Town Hall

By Rosalind Russell -Highway Six in Espanola Getting a Makeover

The Town of Espanola is one of 22 communities across Ontario, which has been approved for infrastructure dollars to repair a major portion of Centre Street. Town CAO Cynthia Townsend says it is good news with the town being successful in its connecting link application for a grant being approved for just over \$2.9 million.

She adds the work will address the worst part of Highway 6 -Centre Street on the stretch of highway between Station Rd and Second Ave.

There will be public meetings in the near future for affected businesses and residents to gather more information and address any concerns that they may have.

Townsend says they now have to go to tender and set the actual construction dates.

Slight Tax Decrease in 2018 Espanola for Espanola Taxpayers towards R

There will be no municipal tax increases in Espanola.

In the May 1st special budget session, Espanola council listened to presentations by fire, police and library department heads with the three coming back with slight decreases.

Funds were also pulled from reserves to bring the budget to a .09% increase.

Councillor Ron Duplessis, suggested monies from the impending sale of Espanola Hydro be put use to bring in a zero budget and put the rest into the reserves.

His counterparts agreed and council will pass the budget at its regular meeting on May 22nd.

Education levies came in slightly less than last year, so there is a slight decrease in taxes.

Espanola council moves towards ROPs for design of new fire hall

Espanola council held a Committee of the Whole meeting Monday afternoon, May 1st, to focus on a new fire hall.

Council had to first decide whether to keep the number of pumper tankers to two or retain the third, which would have meant having to build four bays in the new hall.

In the end, council decided to only keep two, one which will be new, and the rescue vehicle, so only three bays have to be constructed, guesstimated at a savings of around \$160,000 to \$220,000 in construction costs by Deputy Mayor Bill Foster.

Council then passed a resolution to have a Request for Proposal put together by staff for a building design of between 6,800 to 7,200 square feet with three bays, three administration offices, washrooms, a training room and common areas.

However, Foster did say he hopes to see plenty of imagination with the designs that come from companies that decide to put together a proposal.

Transition to OPP expected to take place in New Year

The transition from municipal to provincial policing in Espanola will take some time.

In a press release, Espanola Deputy Mayor, Bill Foster, says the loss of provincial grants combined with the costs to provide policing service to a small community like Espanola was the deciding factor in council going with the Ontario Provincial Police.

A full transition to OPP is anticipated to take place by January 2019.

The Town of Espanola and the OPP will have to sign the contract. Once that is done, the two parties and the Espanola Police Service Board will apply to the Ontario Civilian Police Commission for final approval.


