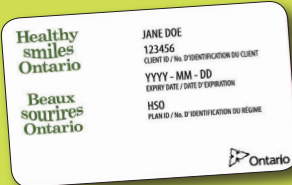

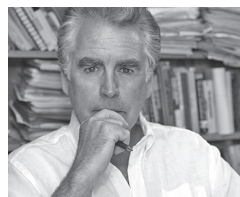

Espanola Family Health Team recognized as Healthy Change Champion

the work of the two outstanding health service providers whose leadership is helping to meet the needs of people closer to home.

"Northeastern Ontario is beaming with leaders like the Espanola and Area Family Health Team and Public Health Sudbury & Districts who listen to what Northerners need to live healthy and well in this beautiful part of the province," emphasizes Stevenson

Public Health Sudbury & Districts and Webbwood Public Library recognized that the library had many existing assets that could be used or enhanced to allow health service providers to offer programs there. Over the last year, they worked together to develop the space.

Earlier this year, the Espanola and Area FHT expanded its programming to Webbwood.

"Aligning with the goals of North East LHIN sub-region planning, the Espanola & Area Family Health Team felt that a programming satellite site was the best way to ensure equitable access to primary care services," said Jon Brunetti, Manager, Espanola and Area FHT. "Our vision is to offer a more robust delivery model that sets an example for other community agencies."

Together, the Espanola and Area FHT and Public Health Sudbury & Districts have implemented the From Soup to Tomatoes arm chair-based exercise program, the snowshoe and urban pole lending program, health promotion programming, and group programming.

The kitchen has been certified, and provides a space for the community to cook together and learn more about healthy eating.

In addition, an Ontario Telemedicine Network (OTN) connection was established in the library's community room, allowing health care providers to offer OTN appointments, including specialist appointments, to residents of Webbwood, eliminating the need for them to travel to a health care facility in another community.

"Together we are able to increase opportunities so that all residents in the Espanola and surrounding area can have control over their health, while knowing that more accessible and client-centred health care is available when needed," said Aimee Belanger, Public Health Nurse, Public Health Sudbury & Districts.

Many other organizations also offer services to residents in Webbwood.

Both the Espanola and Area Family Health Team and Public Health Sudbury & Districts plan to continue to strengthen partnerships and encourage more providers to explore similar models to service delivery. "It is our goal to develop or modify programming to meet the needs of the residents of Webbwood," said Brunetti. "By working together with the North East LHIN and other partners, we can create a service delivery model that enhances access for individuals in the community."

"Public Health recognizes the strengths in working together with community partners to address health inequities in our communities," said Belanger. "Partnering with the Webbwood Public Library is a prime example of how unique partnerships can be used to improve the health and well-being of a whole community."

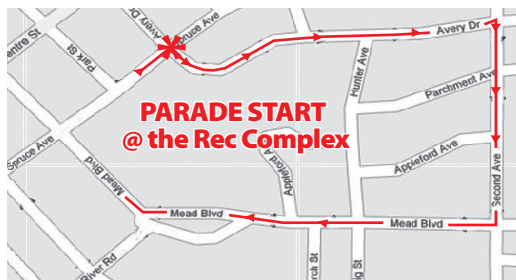

Integrity Report Update - Sanctions Stay In Place, New Visionary Plan Passed

By Rosalind Russell - Resolving how to handle the findings of an Integrity Report calling for sanctions against four Espanola councillors was the focus of a special meeting.

The meeting, held Tuesday morning, November 6th, began with the resolution to remove the sanctions presented to council once again.

The resolution had been presented the week before when the four councillors; Ron Duplessis, Ken Duplessis, Ray Dufour and Heather Mallot, declared a conflict and left the room.

The three remaining council members voted in favour of removing the sanctions, but staff walked out, so the vote was not recorded because legally an appointed clerk had to be in place. Town lawyer Paul Cassen told The Moose at the time, that the resolution is legal because of a ruling under the Municipal Act that states if a quorum is present at the beginning of a meeting and conflict of interests are declared, the remaining members can vote on resolutions.

However, since there was no recording of the vote, it did not stand.

The sanctions issue is still outstanding because the same scenario took place Tuesday morning, but this time the motion was defeated.

This means council will still have to deal with the code of conduct issues and the nine department heads who brought their concerns before the Commissioner still have the option of going to the Ministry of Labour for resolution. Still with the story, the town's lawyer, Paul Cassen, then presented the comprehensive plan entitled 'Council's New Vision' which outlines how council and staff can better their working relationship.

An implementation committee will also be put in place to develop the new vision.

Council adopted the detailed document, which will be available for the public to review.

Recipe

Having a vegetarian daughter, I am always on the lookout for vegetarian recipes that I can make for her. Last week she was sick with a cold and my first thought was, "I should make her some chicken noodle soup", but I couldn't do that, so I found another soup that would be just as comforting and nourishing. Loaded with healthy vegetables, beans for protein, pasta for energy and cooked in a vegetable broth, it was perfect for her, but also for anyone who enjoys a delicious bowl of soup full of goodness.

Minestrone Soup

- 1 tablespoon butter
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 white onion finely chopped
- 1 cup carrots sliced thin
- 1 cup celery sliced thin
- 2 zucchini chopped (peeled if desired)
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 can (28 oz) diced tomatoes, do not drain
- 1 can (15 oz) kidney beans drained & rinsed
- 1 can (15 oz) tomato sauce
- 1 1/2 boxes of vegetable broth (1,450 ml)
- 1 tablespoon dried basil
- 1/2 tablespoon dried parsley
- 1 teaspoon oregano
- 1-2 teaspoons salt more or less to preference
- 1/2 teaspoons pepper
- 1 cup spinach leaves about 1-2 handfuls (optional)
- 1 1/2 cups shell pasta

Melt butter and olive oil in a large stock pot over medium-high heat. Add the onion, carrots, celery, zucchini, and 1/2 teaspoon salt. Let cook for 8-10 minutes until tender, stirring occasionally. Add the diced tomatoes, beans, tomato sauce, vegetable broth, basil, parsley, oregano, salt and pepper. Stir together and let come to a low boil. Once boiling, turn down the heat to medium and let simmer for 10-15 minutes. Add spinach and dried pasta shells. Let cook until pasta is done. Taste and add more salt or other spices if wanted.
