Adam Page says the highlight was a day of training at Chutes Provincial Park in early August.

"So, the day at Chutes started off with a call and meeting with park staff because of a missing female hiker. We were given a brief description of the individual, approximate time that they had been missing, and potential hiking routes.

"We then mobilized our command unit." The Search Management team then decided on a search area. NSSAR members then conducted multiple search tasks until the subject was found. First aid was administered to the patient, at which time they found out they had a second missing person, the son of the patient.

"He was wearing a project lifesaver bracelet. Our Project Lifesaver team was then sent out around the park with the equipment until our subject was found.

#### Off To School For Another Year - Espanola **Jump Day Focuses In Niners**



"The total salary for 46 players on the Lion's team is \$5.2 million. And those guys have to sweat for it."


"So people actually pay to watch kids like me play video games?"

"15,000 people bought tickets for the finals, the day they went on sale!"


"That's gross!"

# Espanola: Transition To Provincial Policing Approved; Arbitration Begins For Severance

By Rosalind Russell - The transition from Espanola municipal police to provincial policing will be taking place sooner than expected.

Espanola Police Association President, Constable Ed Stortz, says "it's sad that the members of the town police are being terminated and that several have applied to the OPP, but no offers have been made yet.

He adds, "as far as arbitration, members have been without a contract since December of 2016 and hope to have everything wrapped up regarding severances and wages on September 13th."

Still with the story, The Ontario Civilian Police Commission has given its stamp of approval to the changeover to the OPP, which is expected to take place October 11th, rather than in early 2019.

With that, all municipal police and civilian staff positions, including the police chief, will be terminated.

Any staff wanting to continue employment in policing in Espanola must follow the OPP application process, and there is no guarantee they will be hired

Arbitration talks are set for September 13th.

Severance payments will be paid by local taxpayers as per the agreement.

The terminations will affect 20 individuals; the chief, 11 officers, dispatchers and full-time court clerk.

However, with a new coaching staff in place, the Express are looking to reverse course as they aim to improve their fortunes and make their mark in the 2018-19 NOJHL standings. Looking for experience to instigate the turnaround in Espanola, Express team president and general manager Chad Clarke has brought on board veteran bench boss Dave Clancy to serve as the club's new coach. Also joining Clancy behind the bench will be associate coach Clayton Bertrand and assistant coach Vagelli Sakellaris, who will add further experience to the Espanola staff. The squad has also secured the services experienced equipment manager Brian Workman and trainer Chris Seguin to provide the players in Espanola firstrate skill in those areas. Add in a newly signed director of sales and promotions, in the affable Grant Trayner, Express GM Clarke has boosted the organization significantly as the commencement of the regular season rapidly approaches.

This is the ninth of 12 NOJHL team preseason previews put together by the league.

NOJHL: What is the outlook for the team as you head into the 2018-19 season?

CHAD CLARKE: Our expectations for this year is to definitely try and improve our on-ice structure. By doing

this we have our sights set on making the playoffs and hopefully enjoy some postseason success.

NOJHL: What have you seen in training camp and exhibition games that you believe bodes well for the organization?

C.C.: Our skill set is much further along then where we were last season at this time. We expect our team to grow stronger week-by-week.

NOJHL: Who are a couple of returning players you look to lead the club?

C.C.: Mitchell Lee has a great offensive minded skill set as expectations are high for him. Also, Chase Lammi, Jacob Doucet and Joel Rainville have had a strong start to the preseason and we hope the young guns will continue to lead by example with their exemplary work ethic and relentless pursuit of the puck.

NOJHL: What goals do you have heading into the start of the regular season and beyond? C.C.: Our goals to begin the season are to compete hard for the puck every night. If we are the hardest working team every night we will find our success. Our expectations are to improve upon last season and make the playoffs. I have no doubt with coach Clancy's structure and that of the rest of the staff, this will be accomplished.

cargo trailer outfitted with its own repeater radio system for communications, inverter generator, laptops, large screens, and all equipment needed to run a full search. The unit uses the full Incident Command System (ICS) as the base for paperwork, which sets out things like tasking sheets for searchers, lost person reports, and communication logs, to name a few.

GPS, which are carried by all searchers, are downloaded after each task and recorded in the database and displayed on a large screen. Each search team is comprised of a team leader, communications person, navigation person, first aid person and trained searchers. All searchers are trained to Ontario Search and Rescue Association Standards, which follows the OPP standard. They are also trained in first aid with some trained in Emergency First Response.

"It was an incredible day of working with many staff from Chutes Provincial Park. Park management, Tamara and Jim, were so helpful in making this training day a success. We are extremely excited about our partnership with Chutes Park and look forward to many more training days with Ontario Parks."

They unit raises its own funds and is continuing their training programs. They are also raising funds for a new inverter generator and a new large screen television for the command center.

#### **Espanola Council Supports Huron Central Funding Request**

Central Huron announced it will be making its final run by the end of 2018 if it is unable to secure \$46.2 million from the Federal and Provincial governments. The company, which runs a short line from Sault Ste. Marie to Sudbury, originally announced in a press release this May that high operational costs, low commodity prices and new regulations forcing capital improvements for compliance are threatening closure. The Town of Espanola mills to receive chemicals by has been an active member of the (HCR) Huron Central Railway task force in support of their funding request. The Town of Espanola recognizes the importance of short-line rail operators in Northern Ontario. HCR provides 43 direct jobs; however this railway is an integral link for the Espanola and Nairn mills which provide additional employment for another 700 people. The ability for these

rail and ship product is vital to their ability to compete in global markets. It is estimated that these mills generate over \$600 million in economic activity in our area. These industries have already been hard hit with changing market trends and tariffs. "The Town of Espanola continues to lobby the Federal and Provincial government to provide the support required to sustain the rail line and our industries,"

says Deputy Mayor Bill Foster. "The closure of the Huron Central Railway would have a devastating impact to our local and regional economies, the environment and our roads.

#### Recipe

This is a quick and simple way to bake flavourful shrimp with little fuss. We made it this past weekend to serve alongside steak



and I loved how easy it was to make and just throw in the oven. Dipping crusty bread into the garlic butter is an added bonus. It also makes a quick, delicious dinner when served a over pasta.

Baked Butter Garlic Shrimp

- 1 lb raw shrimp, peeled and cleaned
- 5 tbsp softened butter
- 3-4 large cloves garlic, crushed
- salt and fresh ground pepper
- fresh or dried parsley for garnish
- · lemon wedges, for serving, if desired

Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Smear butter evenly over the bottom of the baking dish. Sprinkle the crushed garlic over the butter. Add the shrimp, trying not to overlap if possible. Sprinkle everything with salt and pepper. Bake for 7 minutes and then stir/turn the shrimp and bake for 7-10 more minutes, or until shrimp is done. Garnish with parsley and squeeze a lemon wedge over it, if desired. Serve as a side with steak, or toss the cooked shrimp and butter sauce with pasta. If you do this, cook the pasta while the shrimp is cooking for a quick meal.

#### 2018 WATER MAIN SWABBING PROGRAM

Beginning on **Monday, September 17th** and running through to **Thursday, September 20th**, the Town of Espanola with OCWA will undertake the Water Main Swabbing Program. Hours of swabbing will be from 9:00 P.M. to 5:00 A.M. The program should take 4 days to complete.

The following street will be swabbed on **Monday, September 17th:** 

• Mead Blvd. from Queensway Ave. to Spanish River Dr.

The following areas will be swabbed from Tuesday, September 18th to Thursday, September 20th:

- Hwy 6/Centre St. from Queensway Ave. to Second Ave.
- Williamson St., Syroid St., Ricci Dr., Buzdygan St., Polojko St. and Duplessis Rd.

The following streets from Hwy 6/Centre St. to Barrie St.:

- James St., Secord St., Albert St. and Adelaide St.
- Barrie St. from Albert to Adelaide St.

Residents immediately affected each night are advised to close the main water valve in their homes and <u>DO NOT</u> attempt to use any water during swabbing hours. This is important to avoid drawing a piece of foam swab into your service and blocking it.

We ask that when you re-open the main water valve in your home following swabbing, that you turn on a cold water tap (laundry tub if possible) and let it run to flush any residue that may be left in your water service.

Residents not in the swabbing area **could** experience dirty water. If you experience dirty water, let your cold water run and it should clear up. If dirty water persists, please call 705-869-1751 between 8:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M.
