Espanola Lions Club Supports Clear Lake Beach Summer Program




By Rosalind Russell - The Espanola Lions Club is providing financial support to expand the Clear Lake Beach Summer Program.

Perched In The Cat-Bird Seat On Gran Canaria Island

Spanish island of Gran Canaria because I'd never been there before. I rented a small, second-floor apartment with a balcony over the boardwalk of a strip of beach called Las Canteras. Gran Canaria is 1500 miles from mainland Spain but just 62 miles from the southern tip of Morocco, North Africa.

Walkers, joggers, skate boarders and surfers pass by at a rate of a thousand per hour which means I'm sitting in a peoplewatching control tower, an up-close and personal study in local human traffic from an anonymous point of view. The passersby seldom look up. A curious guy with a drink in one hand and a pen in the other, I'm sittin in the cat-bird seat.

Most of the passersby are Spaniards of course, on their way to work or meeting friends at the myriad of outdoor cafes with tables within striking distance of the waves that crash against the boardwalk's sea wall. The rest are tourists, mostly Germans, sunburned and often disoriented. Pairs of Muslim women the Western Sahara shuffle by swathed in brightly coloured silk burkas and giggling like school girls.

Half of the people passing are either looking at their phones or listening to something with buds in their ears. You would think the surfers wielding boards on their shoulders would pose a serious problem amid the boardwalk crush but no, it's the careless selfie-takers that cause people to collide with each other while trying to avoid them.

These rude people need to wear blinkers. Seriously, the cell phone holders should have flashing turn signals attached to their arms and the ones using selfie extension sticks should have backing-up beepers attached

So I bought a ticket to Las Palmas on the to their butts. Both devices will draw more attention to them which fits perfectly into their plan.

The joggers will sometimes smell their armpits and I suppose it's an indicator of effort while women who falter and nearly fall on their five inch heels, that's just a poor choice of footwear.

I notice that when people think they're not being watched they'll do a bit of a dance step or quite often talk to themselves. At eight in the morning, with the tide well out, city workers rake the beach and a voice heard through loud speakers warns swimmers of dangerous tides. Ignoring the message, the swimmers head for the shore along with people practicing yoga and tai chi.

On day one the quiet routine on the beach was shattered by the screams of an obnoxious kid swearing and throwing sand at his mother. She tried to bribe him with a bottle of Coke but he threw himself down in the sand and screamed even louder. She walked away thinking he'd panic and follow her but instead he ran up into the crowd on the boardwalk. Suddenly it's the mother who's yelling and chasing the kid through the crowd. When she caught him she showed him her cellphone, presumably threatening to call his father. The kid knocked the phone out of her hand. I wanted to yell: "Lady! You have the answer to the problem in hand – just pour the bottle of Coke on his head!" And I thought, that's how a monster like Donald Trump was created. Nobody slapped him silly way back when they had the chance!

There are two men I see every day who are as different as night is to day.

The one who sets up shop on the bench







below my balcony is a black Africa who exercises on the beach, finishing with a prayer on a mat facing east. At night he sets up his handmade jewelry and wood carvings and sits and waits for a customer. He's cheerful and occasionally a local will stop to chat or greet him with a slap on the back. Nobody buys his wares. Just as I have never seen money change hands, I have never seen him despair. So on my last night at I went down and bought a beautiful broach. The price was 15 Euros and ... he tried to give me a discount!

The other man is stocky and white and he worships the chair his fat ass spends all day on. The so-called security guard/ receptionist at my apartment building does absolutely nothing but sit behind a desk, scroll down his cell phone or read the newspaper. When I arrived with luggage and two bags of groceries he was visibly upset that he had to leave his station, walk six steps down to the front door and help me with a tricky key. I knew then that if ever I

locked myself out, he'd watch me from his empty desk as I slept fitfully through the night. This guy makes the Maytag repairman look ambitious. When I checked out he was on break so I dropped my set of keys on the floor next to his desk. I'd have loved to have been there when he summoned the maid to come and pick them up for him.

Most days I venture down to little tobacco shop where I'm lucky enough to nab one of the three copies of the New York Times he brings in every day. The deli on the back street offers rotisserie chicken, seafood paella or fresh breads and salads. Cordoniu, a fine Spanish champagne is \$12 a bottle. Most evenings as I dine on my balcony and read by the lights on the boardwalk and I think if I die here, my smile will survive the ten-hour flight back to Canada.

Director, Tracy Mark, took the Espanola High School Jazz Band to Cleveland, Ohio in early April to play at the famous Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

Mark shares kudos with others in making the trip such a success.

"Brightspark and Sara Nicholson did it again. They planned an amazing trip that the kids loved and our tour guide, Amelia, was great with this being her first trip to Cleveland and her first high school music group. Everyone is already talking about where to go next year and requesting that Amelia join us. Special thanks to all the chaperones and shoutout to the parents and guardians for raising such wonderful young people. I love my job!" exclaimed Mark.

They performed at the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

"We were originally scheduled to perform on the outside stage, but due to the pouring rain, the manager was able to shift some things around and changed our performance time, so we were able to perform inside."

"Students from the Lancers Marching Band stayed to watch us perform and some new friendships were made." The trip itself was also an adventure.

"We traveled by coach leaving at 7:00 AM Wednesday, April 10th and returned at 9:30 PM April 13th. Thirty students attended this year's trip. Three ensembles performed at the venue. The Senior Jazz Combo made up of four Grade 11 and 12 students, the Junior Jazz Band with 16 Grade 9 and 10 students and the Senior Jazz Band with 14 Grade 11 and 12 students."

"And, it wasn't a competition," says Mark. "We didn't compete. It was a great performance opportunity for the kids. They can now say they are Rock and Roll Hall of Fame performers!" "We toured the home from the classic movie A Christmas Story (don't worry, no one shot their eye out). Had a backstage tour of Severance Hall, the most beautiful concert hall in America. We went to the museum of art and also toured the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. We got to ride a red trolley and get a guided tour of the city and all the landmarks and learn about its history."

And Mark also discovered an interesting fact: the founder's name is actually spelled Cleaveland, but due to a misprint in the paper way back when, the city dropped the "a". "We also went to see the production of the Phantom of the Opera. Our tour

guide, Amelia, was surprised at how many kids were Team Phantom. She is Team Raoul.

And, on the final evening, we went to the Music Box Supper Club where there was a live band whose opening song was the same as our opening song at our performance (The Chicken). The kids loved it!"

Mark says the trip wouldn't have been a dream come true without the help of the families and the community at large.

"This year, we sold chocolate bars, cookie dough, pizza kits, chocolate covered pretzels and hosted the meat roll off at the Legion in January and again in April."

Tracy Mark started making stuffies five years ago and once the tradition started, there was no way the kids would let her stop.

"I figured everyone needs something to cuddle and it's no fun if you forget your fav stuffies at home," explained Mark. "I have a few orders after the trip for stuffies people saw in pictures and will use the money to cover costs of materials. Each stuffy or critter takes four or more hours to make depending on size. The bigger ones can be

a full weekend project."

The trip was chaperoned by Mark, her parents, Don and Karen Finucane, and parents Dianna Boivin, Brian Coyne and Rob Forcier.

"The music students of Espanola High School represented our school and town in a way that would make anyone proud. They were inquisitive, polite, friendly enthusiastic, punctual and we had loads of fun," concludes Mark.

One of the students, Heidi Meier, wrapped up the experience nicely stating, "it was beyond amazing to experience the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame as a performer and not just a tourist. It helped me and my band bond and grow as performers."

- 3/4 cup green pepper
- ½ cup minced fresh parsley
- 1 ½ cups chicken broth
- 1 cup chopped tomatoes
- 1 ½ tsp salt
- 1 ½ tsp chili powder



Place chicken in a greased 9 x 13 pan. Combine the garlic salt, celery salt and paprika; sprinkle over the chicken. Bake, uncovered at 425 degrees for 20 minutes. Remove chicken from pan. Combine rice, onion, green pepper and parsley; spoon into the pan. In a saucepan, bring broth, tomatoes, salt and chili powder to a boil. Pour over rice mixture; mix well. Place chicken pieces on top. Cover and bake for 45 minutes or until chicken and rice are tender
