

For example, there is nothing wrong with listening to a vegetarian promote a daily diet we'll all be sharing one day soon as the world can no longer afford to commit resources like land, water and grain to produce meat. That's desirable. In the meantime, there's nothing more enticing than a pepperoni pizza with a couple of cold beers. But to witness said vegetarian slurring his words after a few beers while wolfing down a meaty pizza-that's irony...with an indigestion topping.

When a fire station burns to the ground or a police station is burglarized--those types of paradoxical events are considered irony. It's like tripping over the five cords that connect your computer to a printer, a modem and a wall socket and remembering we now operate in a "wireless world"!

Irony it seems, is breaking out everywhere these days. Members of the hugely popular boy band BTS who would have careers of maybe two years before they start to sprout facial hair, have just been sentenced to 18 months of compulsory military service in South Korea. (Somewhere up there, with his classic sneer, Army Elvis' upper lip is twitching.) Not being a fan of boy bands, I find this both ironic and a boost to good music. Japanese "organizational guru", Marie Kondo who became massively famous for instructing people to downsize, donate and generally get rid of their material stuff has just opened an online retail store so that her followers can now...load up on material

stuff. Ironic.

Not one but two Roman Catholic nuns recently returned to their base church in Italy after completing missionary work in their home countries in Africa...in a state of pregnancy! Yes, both of them. Religiously ironic? (And please make up your own jokes about one being a "mother superior" and that "missionary" thing.)

Examples of situational irony are all over the Net. For instance, the first person that arrived on the scene of an accident in Springfield, MA snapped a photo that shows a newspaper delivery truck smashed into the front of a home. The logo on the side of the van reads: "The Republican-Where The News Hits Home." A bullseye of irony right

That, and a photo of a dog who is resting on a living room carpet after having chewed up a sheet of paper of which only the title at the top remains intact: "Certificate Of Dog Obedience Training." In his heart he knows he flunked the damn class anyway.

For whatever reason Canada seems to be a popular setting for the satirical. But when he adds: "Oh, by the way, I'm half American"--that goes all the way to ludicrous.

Walford Artist Completes Mural At Walford Community Centre



The Village of Walford has a rich history and a local artist has just completed a huge mural on one of the walls at the Walford Community Centre depicting that history. Award-winning artist Theresa Minten says her family has strong ties to the centre, which her mother helped build as a member of the Women's Institution and her father even put in the footings.

She says she was honoured when board members who oversee the hall asked her to paint her magic on the huge wall.

She says the columns feature various kinds of trees found locally with the wall itself also featuring farming, fishing and a train station.

Minten adds the lumbering portion also depicts old and modern technology.

Minten paints mainly with acrylics, but started to paint with oils as a teenager. She has a degree in graphic design and worked in the printing industry. She was also a member of a number of art groups and trained with Victor Sullivan in Orangeville where she lived for many years.

Since moving back to Walford, she has focused on her art and

was the featured artist at the 2016 Massey Area Museum's Jesse Burnside Memorial Art Show and has won several awards in numerous shows including the LaCloche Art Show in Whitefish Falls. Her paintings are also showcased at Lucky's Homestyle Restaraunt on Highway 17 in Walford and she hosts painting lessons at the centre itself.

Minten says the project was intriguing. With her parents, Morris and Dolores Sanftenberg having such close ties the centre, it was also a labour of love.

For the first panel, she chose the train station, which is gone now, and a train which ran in the early 1900's because having a station turned Walford into a bustling little place as they toted food and supplies of all kinds to the logging camps north of Walford during that period.

The logging section of the mural portrays the old and the new technology of this industry, which is and was so integral to the economy of this area.

She chose to paint a farm scene as that is where most people lived in the early days and those farms are now being worked again.

A moose looking out at people fishing in a boat on a pristine lake portrays the recreational opportunities and the majestic beauty that draws people to the area.

The columns became tree trunks, a birch, a white pine and a maple, which divided the panels but also incorporated themselves in each panel.

Minten adds she knew she would enjoy painting the mural, but never expected the overwhelming reaction she got from the community; people stopping by to say how much they loved it, some checking daily on her

progress, some coming by just to say hello and see if she needed anything and plenty of people taking advantage of photo opportunities.

The public is invited to drop by anytime to view the completed work.

Welcome to Local Hippie's weekly tip I for living a greener life! Each week I we will provide you with a quick I tip to help you reduce your carbon I footprint and change the world.

■ This week's tip isn't exactly a tip I - it's a craft! A low-waste, low-I impact, Christmas craft.

Christmas decorations can be incredibly wasteful. These days, most decorations are made of cheap plastic that cannot be recycled at the end of its lifetime. As you can imagine, that doesn't sit right with me!

This year, I decided to try my hand at a classic Christmas decor piece that is not only cute, but completely biodegradable. I thought I'd share!

Recipe

If you're looking for an easy, no-bake goodie to add to your cookie tray, these Chubby Hubby Clusters absolutely delicious. Chocolate, peanut butter, pretzels, and peanuts all



come together to make a perfect little treat. No baking required.

Chubby Hubby Clusters

- 1 1/2 cups semi sweet chocolate chips
- 1 cup peanut butter chips
- 1/2 cup butter, cut into pieces
- 1/4 cup peanut butter
- 2 cups pretzel sticks, roughly chopped (I just broke them all in half)
- 1 cup salted peanuts

In a large bowl, mix together chocolate chips, peanut butter chips, butter, and peanut butter. Microwave on high for 45 seconds, stir, and microwave again for 30 seconds. Stir until smooth (if it isn't completely melted, return to the microwave for 20 second intervals, stirring after each time).

Add pretzels and peanuts to the melted chocolate mixture and stir until they are completely coated in chocolate. Drop by tablespoonfuls onto wax paper and refrigerate for about 30 minutes or until firm. Optional: drizzle with melted peanut butter or peanut butter chips. Store in an airtight container. Q

Dried Citrus Christmas Garlands:

■ Materials:

- Citrus fruit of your choice (oranges, grapefruits, limes, or lemons)
- Cooling racks
- Cotton or jute twine
- **I** An embroidery needle

Directions:

- Cut your citrus into thin slices (roughly 1/3 inch thick).
- Arrange the slices on a cooling rack.
- Set your oven to the lowest possible temperature, somewhere around 200 degrees Fahrenheit. Place the cooling rack inside, baking for 2-4 hours, flipping every 45 minutes.
- String your needle and poke it through each side of the citrus slices until your garland is as long as you'd like it.
 - When the holiday season is over, simply place your garland in your compost bin!
