Espanola Family Needs Support Once Again



By Rosalind Russell - Ten year old Blake Bond of Espanola has spent half his life fighting cancer and is now diagnosed with a new disease. Blake has been diagnosed with Graft-versus-Host Disease, a medical complication following the transplant of tissue from a genetically different person. The disease which affects his skin, muscles and joints is commonly associated with transplants such as those that occur with bone marrow transplants, which Blake underwent last year. While not curable, it can be treated, but it requires Blake to travel to Ottawa weekly and Toronto monthly. Remedy's RX in the Espanola Mall is setting up a donation jar to assist the family in offsetting travel, lodging and prescription costs not covered by any support program. The pharmacy encourages the public to drop by with a donation. They will also host a Pop Up Sale on December 4th to encourage donations.

Espanola Regional Hospital & Health Centre Vein Finder Campaign

Espanola woman Jolene Courtemanche has been on a mission to purchase two Vein Finders for Espanola Regional Hospital & Health Centre. Courtemanche, who suffers with difficult veins, decided that there must be many people with the same condition who would benefit from this piece of equipment. With that in mind, she began campaigning the community. "Friends, family, business and community members have been so very generous," says Courtemanche. "So much so, that we are now

able to move forward with the purchase of the first Vein Finder!" Espanola Hospital Foundation Coordinator, Terri Noble adds "We are so grateful for Jolene's determination to give back to our hospital. We are certain these vein finders will eliminate some of the stress of having blood work for many of our patients." Courtemanche has collected \$9,000 to date with more on the way. Each unit costs \$8,100 and will be available in the Lab and in the Emergency Department.

Canada's Rocky Horror Hospital Show

Our Canadian health care system has fallen to ninth place among 12 nations as rated by the highly-respected Commonwealth Fund. With the UK, Australia and Holland leading, we're barely staying above the United States. So with costs and wait times on the rise, not to mention patients being warehoused in the hallways of our hospitals, it's nice to come across some good news for a change. "Report finds 553 foreign items left inside Canadian patients after surgery from 2016 to 2018." I had to read that twice.

Yeah, there's an awful lot of surgeons in this country snapping off the latex gloves after stitching somebody up and asking the nurse: "Hey! There's only two sponges here! Didn't we start with three?" Sponges and medical instruments were the most common items left behind according to the report released by the Canadian Institute for Health Information.

The statistics in the CIHI report are enough to send you into shock and off to your local emerge. Canada has the highest rate of avoidable complications after surgery among the 12 countries studied. That's a staggering 90 percent above the average. One out of every 18 patients in a Canadian hospital will experience some form of 'preventable harm' during their stay. Hard to believe that preventable harm is now the third leading cause of death in Canada behind cancer and heart disease.

By way of explanation, the CIHI's Tracy Johnson said: "People don't go to work to make mistakes, but these things happen." Well yeah, but when I make a mistake, I spell somebody's name wrong. I don't leave some poor bugger looking at the impression of a vice grip on his stomach and wondering

how it got inside?!

This is pretty shocking news to anyone carrying a provincial health card. Not as horrible, mind you, as American doctors operating on the opposite side of a patient's head or removing the right limb when the left limb was the one designated for amputation. Happening so frequently, it now has a name - 'wrong side surgery.'

A rash of botched surgeries at the University Community Hospital in Tampa, Florida included a wrong knee operation, a wrong female sterilization and the removal of a tube from the wrong patient that resulted in death. Heading the list of 'wrong side surgery' was a 51-year-old heavy-equipment operator by the name of Willie King. Nobody should wake up after an amputation as King did and say: "Doctor, that's the wrong leg."

And nobody I know possesses a sense of humour as forgiving as Willie King who after losing both legs and learning to walk with two prosthetic legs said: "I've kind of taken it in stride."

Here then are a few snippets of conversation you never want to hear when you're on your back and woozy in a hospital operating room.

Doctor: "Tick, tick, tick...you hear that! That's his heart beating again. I saved his life!"

Nurse: "Actually doctor, he has no pulse and that sounds an awful lot like you're new Rolex."

Doctor: "When it says 'left' leg...is that on my left when I'm looking at the patient or on his left when he's looking at me?"

Nurse: "SECURITY!"

Nurse: "Doctor, you just removed a kidney

Explore Carpentry Day



On November 20 and 21, some 40 grade 9 female students from Conseil scolaire catholique Nouvelon high schools in Greater Sudbury and Espanola took part in the activity entitled "Explore Carpentry Day." Taking part were students from Collège Notre-Dame (Sudbury), ESC Champlain (Chelmsford), ÉSC l'Horizon (Val Caron), ÉS du Sacré-Coeur (Sudbury) and ÉSC Franco-Ouest (Espanola). Offered through the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP), this hands-on learning activity was held at the Carpenters' Union in Azilda.

During this experiential learning activity, the girls participated in a construction workshop. They had hands-

on experience in carpentry, drywall installation, and plastering while learning about the tools and products needed for construction. This group of CSC Nouvelon students was also informed of related health and safety protocols.

The purpose of the experiential learning activity is to demystify specialized trades for girls and enable female students to learn about rewarding careers in this sector of the economy. By participating in this type of activity, the CSC Nouvelon is seeking to raise the girls' level of confidence while initiating them to non-traditional careers.

Historical Pointer Boat Dismantled And Repurposed



The front of the Massey Area Museum looks a little different today following the removal, dismantling and repurposing of a historical replica.

Big Red, a replica of a 32-foot pointer boat used by the lumber industry in the early part of the 19th and 20th century has been dismantled. Former president of the Friends of the Spanish River, Bill McKenna, says the boat's stern and bow have been kept

to be repurposed as shelving for a historical display inside the museum, rather than outside where it had been featured for several years.

McKenna says it was originally built for the Friends by Bill Blight of Espanola and Ed Tate of Sudbury 20 years ago to highlight local lumbering history and was used for tours on the Spanish River, in parades and at other public events.

I love these make ahead breakfast casseroles, especially at this time of year when life is busy and I have more overnight guests. This casserole is loaded with sausage, peppers, cheese and Italian flavour! Serve with a fresh fruit salad and you have a delicious breakfast that your guests will love.



Overnight Sausage Breakfast Casserole

- 14 slices bread, crust removed, cubed and dried overnight or in a 300-degree oven for 10 minutes.
- 1 package Italian Sausage
- 3 green onions, sliced
- ½ red bell pepper, finely diced
- ½ green bell pepper, finely diced
- 2 cups shredded Italian blend cheese, or your favourite flavour
- 2 cups mozzarella cheese
- 6 eggs
- 3 cups milk
- 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning
- Pepper to taste



Remove casing from sausage and cook over medium high heat until no pink remains. Drain any fat. Layer ½ of the cubes in a greased 9×13 pan. Top with ½ of each the sausage, green onions, peppers, and cheese. Repeat layers ending with cheese.

Combine eggs, milk, & seasonings Pour egg mixture over bread ensuring all of the bread has been covered. Refrigerate overnight (or at least 3 hours).

Remove from fridge and place in the oven while preheating the oven to 350 degrees. Bake covered with foil 65-75 minutes or until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean.
