Mental Health Focus Of Several Initiatives In Rainbow Schools



PEERS® adolescent support program in Rainbow Schools

Public Health Sudbury & Districts and the Rainbow District School Board have teamed up to pilot a social skills training intervention program.

Called PEERS®, the Program for the Education and Enrichment of Relational Skills is geared to teens with autism spectrum disorder.

Medical Officer of Health, Dr. Penny Sutcliffe, says forming and maintaining trusting relationships with teachers, friends, family, and adults is key to students having a sense of belonging and supporting their mental health.

The research project is taking place in a Grade 8 classroom with non-autistic students for 16 weeks.

Board Mental Health Lead, Mary Jago, says students will be given the opportunity

NOTICE OF A PUBLIC MEETING Concerning Application for Consent

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers will hold a public meeting on **Wednesday**, **March 13 at 6:00 p.m.**, at the Township Office, 11 Birch Lake Road, Massey in order to consider a proposed application for Consent under Section 53 of the Planning Act, RSO 1990 as amended.

File No. C-19-01 & C-19-02: The purpose of this consent application is to provide for two new lots in the Rural Zone. The properties are described as Victoria Township, Section 34, RP 53R8683 Part 1 & RP 53R7144 Part of Part 1. The lands subject of this application are not subject of any other application under the Planning Act.

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers in respect of the proposed consent, you must make a written request to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers. This will also entitle you to be advised of a possible Local Planning Appeal Tribunal (LPAT). Even if you are the successful party, you should request a copy of the decision since the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers decision may be appealed to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal by the applicant or another member of the public.

To appeal the decision to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal, send an appeal form to the Clerk of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers outlining the reasons for the appeal. You must enclose the appeal fee of \$300.00 for each application appealed, paid by cheque, made payable to "The Minister of Finance".

If a person or public body that files an appeal of a decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers in respect of the proposed consent does not make written submission to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers before it gives or refuses to give a provisional consent, the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal may dismiss the appeal.

NOTICE TO MASSEY RESIDENTS

Due to the extreme cold weather conditions we are recommending that you leave a cold water tap running in a steady stream of about 6mm (1/4 inch). Please note that the tap does not need to be open fully to keep your line from freezing.

If you are concerned about your septic system, run a hose out to the ditch to drain the water away from your system.

Some additional suggestions:

- Wrap foam pipe insulation around pipes most susceptible to freezing (e.g. near outside walls, crawl spaces, attics)
- Do not turn your furnace below 13 degrees C (55 degrees F) at night or when the house is vacant
- · If you are planning on being away, have someone check your house regularly

You Should Know Where It Is Illegal To Smoke Cannabis Or Tobacco, Or Use Vapour Products

The Smoke-Free Ontario Act, 2017, now includes additional restrictions to denormalize smoking and to protect people from being exposed to second-hand smoke and vapour. With recent changes to the Act, Public Health Sudbury & Districts is raising awareness about where it is illegal to vape, smoke, or hold lighted tobacco or cannabis.

Public Health Sudbury & Districts' Smoke-Free Ontario Act Inspectors enforce the rules that prohibit smoking and vaping under the Act. The fines for not following the laws are substantial, and individuals can receive penalties of up to \$305 for a first offence. The inspectors conduct checks of properties to ensure compliance with the Act and respond to complaints.

"Our top priority is keeping these substances out of the hands of youth and protecting the public from second-hand smoke and vapour," said Burgess Hawkins, a manager with Public Health Sudbury & Districts' Environmental Health Division. "The same laws that apply to smoking tobacco also apply to smoking cannabis and the use of all vapour products," said Hawkins.

Given the prevalence of students using vapour products nationally, people should be aware that smoking and vaping is prohibited in schools, on school property, and within 20 metres of the perimeter of the school property. These same rules apply to all community recreational facilities, including arenas, gyms, pools, and sports facilities.

Other places where smoking tobacco or cannabis, and vaping is prohibited under the SmokeFree Ontario Act, include:

- enclosed public places
- enclosed workplaces (including workplace vehicles)
- any indoor common area of a multi-unit dwelling
- child care centres, home child care centres, and any place where an Early Years Program or service is provided
- hospitals and psychiatric care facilities, including all their outdoor properties
- long-term care facilities and within a 9-metre radius surrounding any entrance or exit
- restaurant or bar patios including public areas within a 9-metre radius of the patio
- children's playgrounds and all public areas within 20 metres of any point on the perimeter of a children's playground
- the reserved seating area of a sports arena or entertainment venue
- sporting areas and public areas within 20 metres of any point on the perimeter of a sporting area or a spectator area adjacent to a sporting area (some exceptions apply to certain locations)

Several local municipalities also have bylaws that include more restrictions than the Smoke-Free Ontario Act. Check with your local municipality to see if bylaws exist for smoking tobacco or cannabis, or vaping. Contact Public Health Sudbury & Districts for more information about the Smoke-Free Ontario Act, enforcement or to make a complaint; to learn about the risks of smoking and vaping; or to find out about the services offered by the agency's Quit Smoking Clinic, please 705.522.9200 (toll-free 1.866.522.9200) or visit www. phsd.ca.

Grade 1 and 6 students in Rainbow Schools are learning strategies for stress and success. Since September, they have been engaged in Kids Have Stress Too! ®, a program that aims to positively influence social and emotional development.

Board mental health lead, Mary Jago, says research tells us that stress among children is estimated to have increased 45 per cent over the past 30 years.

She adds, stress can affect a child's ability to get along with others, think intuitively, and learn.

Kids Have Stress Too! ® is being delivered by Rainbow District School Board's mental health team in six-week blocks. Students engage in a series of skill-based activities and lessons that range from five to 50 minutes.

Teachers, who are involved in the program as learners, are taught a variety of ways to create a peaceful, safe and stimulating classroom environment, while delivering the curriculum.

"The Kids Have Stress Too! ® program is one of many ways in which the Board is fulfilling its commitment to enhance the mental health and well-being of students and staff," says Norm Blaseg, Director of Education for Rainbow District School Board.

Rainbow District School Board

adopted its first Mental Health Strategic Plan in September 2018. The plan guides the Board's work by embedding student mental health policy within its strategic planning; raising awareness to decrease stigma and increase the capacity to recognize the signs of mental health problems early and how to access the appropriate intervention; and implementing evidence informed promotion, prevention, and intervention mental health services to promote mentally healthy classrooms.

Wolves United supports mental health at Espanola High

Sports, social activities and chats are all part of an initiative coming to Espanola High School.

Espanola High School Principal Kristina Rivard Gobbo says students will walk away with tools and strategies to help cope with, and manage, their own mental health.

The school received a \$1,900 grant from Wolves United, a partnership between the hockey organization and United Way that supports youth-based programming.

The money will be used by the mental health collaborative inquiry team to host two Mental Health and Well-Being Afternoons for all 470 students, which will be held in the near future.

Gobbo adds students will explore healthy coping strategies for anxiety and stress, and ways to recognize and understand mental health conditions in others.

Recipe

I find as I'm getting older I appreciate a delicious, dense and flavourful coffee cake more than I ever did before. Apparently chocolate cake isn't the be- all, and end- all, after all. Whether you eat it in the morning with



coffee, or in the afternoon with hot tea, it's always so good, especially during the cold and snowy weather. Many people think the name means there is coffee in the ingredients but this is not the case, it just means it's a cake best served with coffee. I personally think this would be a great cake to make for your co-workers to have with their morning coffee (hint, hint favourite office baker). Fresh or frozen berries can be used and other berries can be substituted for the raspberries.

RASPBERRY ALMOND COFFEE CAKE

- · 1 cup fresh or frozen raspberries, thawed
- 3 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 1 large egg
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 3 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract (or almond)
- 1/4 cup sliced almonds

ICING:

- 1/4 cup confectioners' sugar
- 1-1/2 teaspoons whole milk
- 1/4 teaspoon vanilla extract

In a bowl, combine raspberries and brown sugar; set aside. In a large bowl, combine the flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda and salt. In a small bowl, whisk the egg, sour cream, butter and vanilla. Stir into dry ingredients just until moistened. Batter will be dense. Spoon half the batter into a greased and floured 8" round baking pan. (Make sure to completely cover the bottom of pan, it will seem like there is not enough batter but there is. (Using a small off-set spatula to spread it around evenly helps.) Top with raspberry mixture. Spoon the remaining batter over raspberries. (Again, it will seem like there is not enough batter. Just swirl it around gently, you don't have to completely cover all of the raspberries.) Sprinkle with almonds. Bake at 350 degrees F for 20-25 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool on a wire rack for 15 minutes before removing from pan. During the cooling time, carefully run a sharp knife around the edges to loosen them. In a small bowl, combine the icing ingredients; drizzle over the coffee cake and serve.
