

### Espanola Ratepayers Will Pay Separate Water And Hydro Bills With North Bay **Hvdro Taking Over The Utility**

As of this fall, ratepayers in Espanola will no longer pay their water and wastewater billings directly to the Espanola Regional Hydro Corporation.

Rather, the town is assuming the billing as part of the process of selling Espanola Hydro to North Bay Hydro with no changes to the rates.

Ratepayers will receive a bill quarterly that can be paid at the bank or online by cash, debit or cheaue.

They will also receive a new account number.

New authorization forms for

pre-authorized payments will also be available for anyone.

If you wish to pay your water bill monthly, you will have to go to the Town of Espanola and fill out the pre-authorized forms for monthly payments with the payment being taken out of your account the 15th of every month.

The monthly cost for water for a residence in Espanola is \$99.91. The forms are now available at the Town of Espanola office.

The change takes place October 1st with hydro distributing its own billing process.

conflict and in Afghanistan, present veterans and those who have passed on will also be part of the project.

McPherson adds 32 banners have already been purchased since the launch this week.

The idea for the banners originally came out of Saint John. Garth Zwicher, the secretary of Branch #26 in Sackville, New Brunswick, visited his father back on 2015. His father, a Korean War veteran, was living in the Ridgewood Veterans Facility. He found out that Saint John Legion Branch #69 was working with the facility on what was being called 'the Banner Project'. The Legion, in cooperation with a local cemetery, advertised they would offer a limited number of banners, which would hang from hydro poles along a street in Saint John.

They sold out in two days with a waiting list for even more. Zwicher also took the idea and

ran with it

Families provide the final proof of their veteran and it is transposed onto the vinyl banners. The idea has gained momentum from the east coast to British Columbia.

Zwicher says, "The town has been very supportive from the start and it was certainly a good feeling when families bought into the idea.

"When you see the pictures, hear the stories and become aware of the connections between the veterans, their family and the community, it really drives the point home about how these young men and woman volunteered to serve their country. Those fortunate to survive that service came home to help build the community."

That commitment continues today and McPherson heartily believes the people of Espanola and area will embrace the project, a unique way to remember those who made the ultimate sacrifice.

### NOTICE OF A PUBLIC MEETING Concerning Application for Consent and Zoning Bylaw Amendment

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers will hold a public meeting on Wednesday, July 24, 2019 at 6:00 p.m., at the Township Office, 11 Birch Lake Road, Massey in order to consider a proposed application for Consent under Section 53 of the Planning Act, RSO 1990 as amended as well as to consider an amendment to the Comprehensive Zoning Bylaw 2010-51 under Section 34(13) of the Planning Act, RSO 1990 as amended.

### Consent File No. C-19-05

The purpose of this consent application is to provide for a new lot in the Residential zone based on water access. The property is described as May Township, Concession 3, Lot 4, Parcel9327 at 2444 Highway 17. The lands subject of this application is not subject of any other Planning Act application.

### Zoning Bylaw Amendment No. ZBA-19-03

The purpose of this amendment once approved is to allow for increased percentage of lot coverage in the Rural zone. The effect would be to allow for the construction of a storage building. The property is described as Victoria Township, Section 28, Parcel 28-4-4 at #6 Wuorinen Road.

The land subject of this application is not subject of any other Planning Act application.

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers in respect of the proposed applications, you must make a written request to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers. This will also entitle you to be advised of a possible Local Planning Appeal Tribunal (LPAT). Even if you are the successful party, you should request a copy of the decision since the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers decision may be appealed to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal by the applicant or another member of the public.

To appeal the decision to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal, send an appeal form to the Clerk of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers outlining the reasons for the appeal. You must enclose the appeal fee of \$300.00 for each application appealed, paid by cheque, made payable to "The Minister of Finance".

If a person or public body that files an appeal of a decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers in respect of the proposed consent does not make written submission to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers before it gives or refuses to give a provisional consent, the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal may dismiss the appeal.

### Recipe

I'm keeping it simple today folks. I have company coming for the weekend and was looking through my recipes for an easy dessert to have on hand. I found this old, classic recipe and it's



perfect; quick to make and always popular. I'm not a fan of the multicolour marshmallows, so I use regular ones; either one will work. The secret to this recipe is not to add the marshmallows too soon; I have made that mistake and ended up with a melted mess (although it still disappeared).

### **Butterscotch Confetti Squares**

- ½ cup butter
- ½ cup peanut butter
- 1 cup butterscotch chips
- 1 250 g bag coloured marshmallows

Melt butter and peanut butter over low heat, stir in butterscotch chips and melt stirring constantly. Cool mixture for about 10 minutes. Note: Do not add marshmallows if the mixture is too warm, two things will happen; either the marshmallows will melt or the liquid mixture will go to the bottom and the marshmallows will float on top. A little tip I learned; before you add the marshmallows you should be able to hold your hand on the bottom of the pot, if it is just slightly warm then you can add marshmallows. Add marshmallows and stir I until they are well coated. Press into an 8x8 pan lined with parchment or wax paper. Refrigerate and cut into squares.

Note: you can double the recipe and put it in a 9x13 pan.
