
Rosalind Russell Two former Espanola High School cooperative education employers were acknowledged at this year's 28th Annual Co-Op Employer Appreciation Luncheon.

Highlights of "The Amazing Raptors Bandwagon Ride"

Oh Canada – what a magical, crazy coast- called Joel Embiid threw up a ball on which to-coast Raptor ride it was through 60 urban Jurassic Parks, 36 Cineplex movie theatres, thousands of bars bending the fire code and 7.7 million of us screaming "YES!" at our television sets from the couch.

The two-month Raptors' run up to NBA Championship had Canadians standing proudly in the living room for our national anthem and fist-pumping the rarified air of unity, reminding us yet again that this is the greatest country in the world which we under appreciate and often undermine.

Prior to the Raptors post-season tear, most Canadians didn't pay much attention to basketball. Faster than baseball, softer than hockey and with none of the charm of 'the beautiful game' according to swelling numbers of soccer fans in this country.

But by June 13th seven professional athletes most Canadians had never heard of – Lowry, Leonard, Gasol, Siakam, Ibaka, VanVleet and Green – had their faces on the refrigerators from Victoria to St. Johns.

Today the Toronto Raptors are the greatest professional B-ball team on the planet. So well deserved and historically fitting 128 years since Canadian Dr. James Naismith in trying to get a bunch of chubby kids in Springfield, Massachusetts to break a sweat invented this game with one soccer ball, two bottomless peach baskets and 13 rules ... none of which involved "in the paint," "on the glass," or "alley-oop." "Boardman gets paid." What the hell is that?

Never to be forgotten is The Shot, Kawhi Leonard's buzzer beater that eliminated Philly. Tied 90-90 Leonard, dwarfed by a tree

the sweat of his hands was dried by fairy dust. It hit the rim hard with a big bounce, it hit the rim again with a small bounce, then it thunk! thunked! its way into the netting. An entire country was frozen in time for 3.3 seconds. A basketball fan would call it lucky, a Canadian fan would call it destiny. The path to the championship was assured right there, only the when and the where to be determined later. Highlights, I have a few...

- Folks in Almonte, Ontario, the hometown of Dr. James Naismith pulling a Raptor's jersey over his bronze statue.
- In Cambridge, Nunavut way up in the High Arctic, Raptor fans were wearing T-shirts that said: "We The Real North!"
- A soaked hipster in Toronto's Jurassic Park was photographed wearing a black leather jacket with white letters on the back that read: "Kawhing In The Rain!"
- The unlikely hero Fred VanVleet getting his face smashed by a viscous elbow lost a tooth and needed seven stitches near his right eye was asked by a reporter: "Do you feel more Canadian now? You know... hockey?"
- Note the key phrases in O Canada like "true patriot love" and "land glorious and free" in contrast to those in the US National Anthem like "rockets red glare" and "bombs bursting in air." It's like our anthem was written by a poet and theirs by a four-star general.
- •The magnificent rendition of O Canada by The Tenors in Game 1 at Scotiabank Arena that left the Warriors and coach Steve Kerr shaking their heads in awe. When it comes to singing before major Canadian

sports spectacles, k.d. lang has competition.

- A tad different than the Game 4 singing of the anthem by Burlington folk band Walk Off The Earth. Most fans later suggested they "walk off the court."
- The excited post final comments of Drake, the official mascot of the Toronto Raptors probably won't get framed and hung from the rafters. "I want my chips with dip. I don't want my chips plain. I want my chips with dip.' But it'll likely earn him a. TV ad for Frito Lay.
- Old school sportsmanship starred coaches Nik Nurse and Steve Kerr smart, humble and so respectful of each other. Raptor players helping injured Warrior Kevin Durant off the court. So refreshing was the absence of trash talk and chest-beating bravado.
- Maybe the highest praise a Canadian sports team can ever receive came from President Donald Trump when he ... never tweeted a word.
- The Raptors locker room after the win looked like the front entrance to the United Nations. Recipe

A delicious fresh berry tart with a buttery, crisp, shortbread crust filled with either fresh blueberries or strawberries, (or a combination of both) and glazed with jelly. The crust compliments the flavour and



texture of the fresh berries and is quite easy to make compared to a traditional pie crust. For Father's Day my Mother In Law made the strawberry version and everyone loved it. You can serve it plain or top with a dollop of whipped cream and toasted almonds. It's an impressive dessert that really is quite simple to prepare. You'll definitely want to try it when the berries are in season.

Fresh Berry Tart

Shortbread Crust

- 1 ½ cups of flour
- 3 tbsp icing sugar
- ¾ cup of butter

Filling: Blueberry

- 2 cups of blueberries
- 10 oz of red currant jelly
- 1 cup of sour cream plus a little brown sugar to sweeten
- 2 tbsp toasted almonds

Strawberry

- 3 cups of whole berries (can be halved horizontally)
- 1 jar red raspberry jelly
- Whipped cream
- Toasted almonds

Use a 9" tart tin. Press shortbread into the bottom and sides of tin. Bake at 400 degrees for 10-12 minutes until golden and allow to cool. If using blueberries: fill shell with blueberries. Melt red currant jelly in a small pot over low heat or in the microwave. Spoon over berries to cover. Spread sour cream mixed with brown sugar, over top without touching the sides. Sprinkle with toasted almonds. If using strawberries, cover shell with strawberries, melt jelly in a small pot over low heat or in the microwave, and spoon over berries. Serve each slice topped with whipped cream and toasted almonds.
