Traffic Stop Results In Cocaine Charges

A traffic stop by Espanola OPP has led to the arrest of two southern Ontario Men on drug charges.

On Tuesday, February 26th, the Espanola OPP stopped a car for a traffic violation and following a search of the vehicle found an estimated \$20,000 in suspected cocaine and oxycodone.

A 22-year-old man and an 18-year-old man, both from Kitchener are facing two counts each of possession for trafficking.

Both are to appear in Espanola court on April 15th.

OPP Lay Charges In Historical Sexual Assault In Espanola

The Espanola OPP have laid charges against an Espanola man involving a historical sexual assault.

Media officer, Constable Marie Ford, says in early January an investigation began looking into a historical sexual assault, which is alleged to have taken place between 1971 and 1976. As a result, a 78-year-old man, Robert Secord of Espanola, has been charged with two counts of gross indecency and one count of sexual assault.

He was to appear in Espanola court on March 4th.

Residential Fire On Cutler Lake Road

Suspected human remains have been found in a burnt out residence in Sables-Spanish Rivers Township.

On Sunday morning, March 3rd, around 4:00am, local fire, police and emergency staff responded to a residential fire on Cutler Lake Road in the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers.

Espanola OPP community services officer, Constable Marie Ford, says officers, with the assistance of the Office of the Ontario Fire Marshall. located suspected human remains inside the residence. She says the identity of the deceased has not been confirmed.

Espanola Woman Raising \$750,000 For A Drug For Her Cousin



An Espanola woman says a drug is available to help people with a rare neuromuscular condition called Spinal Muscular Atrophy, but only if they are under 12 years of age.

Teri Lacey of Espanola is trying to raise three quarters of a million dollars for a one year supply of the drug called Spinraza for her cousin, Tori.

Teri says in June 2017, Health Canada approved the treatment, but the Ontario government, nor the pharmaceutical giant, Biogen, will cover the cost for her cousin's treatment because she is considered too weak and too old.

The drug is available in Ontario, but only funded for those under the age of 12, since that was the test group for the clinical trials. Teri says Algoma-Manitoulin-Kapuskasing MP, Carol Hughes, says the family should also try to push for clinical trials for older individuals, so Tori could become part of the test group, but it is not known if any company will be undertaking those trials. Teri adds she finds it quite ironic that in a country that professes it provides free 'universal' health care, that Ontario doesn't, but Ouebec does offer the drug. The family has talked about moving Tori to Quebec. If she resides there for six months, she will qualify for provincial coverage. Teri adds her aunt and uncle have also re-mortgaged their home and have several investment properties up for sale to try and raise the thousands of dollars needed for the drug.

In the meantime, Teri says a Go Fund Me has been set up to ask the public for their help. She says time is of the essence since Tori is now wheelchair bound and has very limited mobility. LINK: https://www.gofundme.

A Massey woman is in what her husband calls 'liver purgatory' because no match has been found for a liver transplant, but he says the public can help. Leslie Knibbs says his wife, Beth Cassidy's liver failed in December and she is being treated as best she can be, but no matches have been found for her.

Most liver transplants are found through donations made by donors who have passed away, but living donors can also help, and, according to Knibbs, even

speed up the process of finding a match quite a bit.

To that end, he is hoping the public will come forward and be tested to see if they are a match. Knibbs says he is too old and their son is too young, but anyone in good health between 20 and 60, can apply.

Knibbs adds if a match is found, all their costs including time off work, will be compensated.

Whether you're hosting a St. Patty's Day party or attending someone else's get-together, you're going to want to make a festive appetizer. The best



appetizers for this holiday are green, considering green is the primary colour associated with Ireland. These pinwheels are made with spinach tortillas and have green ingredients in the filling which makes them perfect for the occasion. For convenience they can be made ahead and then cut into rounds for serving. These are easy, delicious and festive!

St. Patrick's Day Pinwheels

- 4 oz cream cheese
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- ¹/₂ can diced green chillies (in Mexican section of store)
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sliced green onions
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup chopped red pepper
- ¹/₂ cup chopped green olives
- 4 large spinach tortillas
- 1 cup salsa for dipping

Combine cream cheese, cheddar cheese, chillies, green onions, red pepper and olives. Divide and spread cheese mixture over each tortilla. Tightly roll up each tortilla and wrap in plastic wrap. Refrigerate. When ready to serve, remove plastic wrap and with a serrated knife, cut into ¹/₂ inch rounds. Serve with salsa for dipping.






