Espanola Diabetes Educator Makes A Global Impact: Hughes



A diabetes educator from Espanola is helping people work toward better fitness using a novel approach that has gained a global audience.

Algoma-Manitoulin-Kapuskasing MP, Carol Hughes, told Parliament Wednesday, February 20th, Susan Clarke is a diabetes educator making a big difference in people's lives.

She says Clarke noticed a gap for those who needed to exercise and she put together a program for clients, calling it From Soup to Tomatoes.

Clarke knew any program had to be free, easily accessible, designed to address mobility issues, and above all, be led by a professional to ensure safety and avoid injuries.

The two most senior officers of the Anishinabek Police Service have been suspended until the outcome of a disciplinary hearing.

Police Chief John W. Syrette and Deputy Chief Dave Whitlow were/are suspended with pay on February 15th.

According to a statement released by APS board chair Jeffrey Jacobs, the suspensions were issued following complaints regarding the conduct of certain members of the senior command.

The statement did not specify the nature of the allegations, but stated the board had hired an external investigator after receiving the complaints.

A disciplinary hearing is expected to be held in the Spring.

In the interim, Inspector Mark Lesage will serve as the acting police chief.

Espanola Looking To Improve Efficiencies At The Sewer Treatment Plant

The Town of Espanola is partnering with the local Ontario Clean Water Agency to look into two options to improve efficiencies at the sewage treatment plant.

Once someone flushes the toilet, they really don't concern themselves with where the waste goes, but agency spokesperson, Indra Maharjan, says there are several opportunities for the town to improve efficiency at the plant when it comes to disposal of solid waste.

One option is to install geotubes that can dry the waste, called aerobic digestion, which can save haulage disposal fees to Sudbury. Rather, he says, the solids would go to the local landfill or to be used in farming/soil operations.

That option carries a cost of \$1.4 million.

The second option carries a much higher cost of \$10 million and creates savings by diverting food waste away from the landfill and creating energy, in the form of gas, which can then be sold on the grid.

Council gave Maharjan's team the go-ahead to apply for funding for both, but stressed they are under no obligation to accept either project.

Maharjan is expected to report back to council by late summer.

Recipe

Fuel to Go Muffins really live up to their name; they are seriously loaded with protein and nutrients but also taste delicious. This is an amazing breakfast muffin, after school



snack, or a great way to refuel the athletes in your life. If you are hiking, snowshoeing or spending the day skiing or snowboarding, be sure to pack along some of these muffins. They taste amazing, boost your energy and will fill you up!

Fuel to Go Muffins

- 2 cups whole wheat flour or all-purpose flour
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 tbsp cinnamon
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 cup shredded coconut
- 1/2 cup sach of raisins, dried cranberries, dried blueberries
 (1½ to 2 cups total) or any kind of dried fruit like figs or apricots
- 2 cups grated carrots
- 1 apple, shredded
- 8 oz can crushed pineapple, drained well
- 1/2 cup sunflower seeds
- 1/2 cup pumpkin seeds
- ½ cup chia seeds
- ½ cup hemp seeds
- 3 eggs
- 2/3 cup vegetable oil can also use olive oil
- 1 tsp vanilla

Mix together flour, sugar, cinnamon, baking powder and salt in a large bowl. Add dried fruit, coconut, seeds, raisins, crushed pineapple, apple and carrots. Stir to combine. In separate bowl whisk eggs with oil and vanilla. Combine this mixture with dry ingredients and mix until just incorporated. Batter will be very thick. Fill 12 baking cups heaping full. Bake at 350 degrees for 30-35 minutes, until tops are nicely browned and crusty. These also freeze very well.
