### Resolution Of Sexual Harassment Charge Against Former Espanola Police Chief

Espanola Police Service dispatcher filed sexual harassment complaint against chief — allegations he denies.

An Espanola woman is now speaking publicly about a harassment complaint she brought against the town's former Police Chief Steven (Steve) Edwards.

Cindy Valiquette, who worked as a dispatcher with the Espanola Police Service for a decade, alleges she was subjected to inappropriate touching and sexual innuendoes from Edwards, who worked his way up from sergeant to chief during the same time.

He has denied all of the allegations and no criminal charges have ever been laid against him nor have any of the accusations been proven in a court of law.

Edwards was suspended with pay in 2017 following Valiquette filing a complaint with the Human Rights

Tribunal of Ontario.

An investigation was also launched through the Ontario Civilian Police Commission with no resolution following the disbandment of the Espanola Police Service, and the fact that Edwards has since retired from policing. Edwards who has maintained his silence on the allegations continues to strongly deny them.

The complaint was set to come before a tribunal hearing in Sudbury in October, but the two sides reached an agreement, which has not been made public.

Espanola CAO Cynthia Townsend had no comment except to acknowledge the town covers all the expenditures related to the case.

Valiquette is still hoping the Ontario Civilian Police Commission might yet issue a ruling that holds him more to account, but realizes that is unlikely to happen.

N'Swakamok Native Alternative School.

Charette says the purpose of the document is to strengthen educational opportunities for Indigenous students in Sudbury, ensure students have equal access in completing their secondary school diploma and support services available for all Indigenous students.

Students attend the school from throughout the Manitoulin and Sudbury districts.

## Recipe

Don't you love when you find and try a new recipe and it's a winner!? I made this casserole last week and it was a hit. I know it's a success when I don't have any leftovers. It is a super easy version of



Chicken Pot Pie and quick to put together; using crescent rolls instead of pastry. You can use a rotisserie cooked chicken to make preparation even quicker. I seasoned and put 3 boneless, skinless chicken breasts in the oven and cooked them first.

#### **Chicken Pot Pie Casserole**

- 1 lb Chicken Breast
- 12 oz Frozen Peas and Carrots, thawed
- 2 cup Frozen Hashbrowns, thawed
- 1 Onion diced
- 2 cans of Cream of Chicken Condensed Soup
- 1 cup Water
- 2 cans Refrigerated Crescent Rolls.
- 1/2 tsp Poultry Seasoning
- Salt and Pepper to taste.

Cook chicken breasts until cooked through. Allow to cool. Sauté onions until transparent and set aside. Dice chicken into 1/2" cubes. Preheat oven to 350.

Grease a 11×13" baking dish.

Unroll 1 can of crescent rolls and pinch perforations to seal into a sheet. Press into bottom and up sides of prepared dish. Don't worry if sides do not go all the way up. Bake for 20 minutes or until crust is light brown. Allow to cool.

In a large skillet, combine chicken cubes, diced onion, water, potatoes and peas and carrots. Stir and cook over medium heat until ingredients are warm (5-10 minutes).

Add soup and poultry seasoning and continue heating for I another 5 minutes. If sauce looks too thick, slowly add a little more water until desired consistency is reached. Pour chicken mixture over baked crust and spread evenly.

Unroll other can of crescent rolls and pinch perforations to seal into a sheet. Place over top of chicken mixture and press into sides of dish. Bake for 25 minutes or until
