**Update: Huron Central Railway Contingency Plans** – **Trucker Shortage** 



Two major, local companies that use the Huron Central Railway say there are major challenges if the rail line is shut down.

Both Domtar in Espanola and EACOM in Nairn Centre rely on the line between Sudbury and Sault Ste. Marie to move their raw materials and finished products and both are hoping the government can find a solution to help rehabilitate the line.

Both would also have no alternative but to look at trucks.

EACOM's Director of Public Affairs, Christine Leduc, says that presents another major challenge, a shortage of truckers.

She says the shortage is not just in Canada, but across North America.

Meanwhile, Bonnie Skene of Domtar says they are prepared to play a constructive role working with government in finding a long-term sustainable solution and also working with customers to ensure continued service.

Genesee & Wyoming Company Limited has indicated it needs \$40-million over five years to sustain and rehabilitate the line or they will shut down in March 2020.

# Espanola Council Approves Website Redevelopment

It is going to take quite a bit of time, but the Town of Espanola will have a new website up and running in 2020 that will be more social media friendly and easier to navigate.

The present website does not support platforms such as Facebook and under new Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act legislation the town must upgrade the site by January 2021.

Council asked for requests for proposals and received 17 in all.

Councillor Maureen Vanalstine says she agrees with the recommendation to accept the submission by Sandbox Software Solutions of Guelph.

She says she is impressed with how they are gearing the revamp specific to the needs of Espanola.

The company is expected to take up to seven months to have the new site up and running.

Council accepted the bid with that work expected to begin as soon as possible.

# Recipe

During the summer I was given this recipe by one of our readers, who is also a friend of the family. She told me it's delicious and would be a great recipe for




my column. It's a wonderful combination of tender shrimp and creamy beans tossed in a fresh salad with a lemony vinaigrette.

#### Shrimp, Celery and White Bean Salad

- 2 lb large peeled shrimp, not cooked
- 2 garlic cloves, finely chopped
- Salt and Pepper
- 5 tbsp extra-virgin olive oil, divided
- 1 (19oz) can white beans such as cannellini, rinsed and drained
- 3 celery ribs, thinly sliced diagonally
- 3 cups packed baby arugula or baby spinach
- 2 tbsp fresh lemon juice
- · Parmesan cheese

Toss shrimp with the garlic, 1 tbsp oil, 1/2 tsp salt and 1/4 tsp pepper. Heat 2 tbsp of oil in a skillet over high heat and sauté shrimp, stirring occasionally, until cooked through, about 3 minutes. Meanwhile toss together the beans, celery, arugula, lemon juice, 1/4 tsp salt, 1/4 tsp pepper, and remaining 2tbsp of oil in a bowl. Add the shrimp with any juices and toss. Top with parmesan cheese.

Permission to produce wholly, or in part, any part in any form whatsoever, particularly by photographic or offset process in publications must be obtained in writing. Any unauthorized reproduction will be subject to recourse in law.
