All three attended the camp: Mack Emiry in 1959, Keith in 1987 and Logan in 2015.


The three officially welcomed the hundreds of graduates at the banquet held on August 17th at the University of Guelph.

## Former A.B .Ellis Public **School Declared Surplus**

A Unique Way To Fight Mental Illness Stigma - That Glove Will Travel

A Rainbow District School Board trustee says the former AB Ellis Public School in Espanola has been declared surplus.

Trustee Bob Clement told The Moose the motion allows for the property to be now sold on the open market. Just over a year ago, the board passed another motion stating the school would be demolished to make way for some 150 parking spaces.

However. Clement says a section adjacent to the Bourcier Funeral Home could be severed, rezoned and used for the required parking.

He adds that would leave the school and the rest of the large property available for purchase.

Clement says he does not know how much the property would be listed for, but under legislation it must be market value.

The declaration now opens the door for the Save AB Ellis Public School Committee to look at various options in saving the school and retrofitting it for other uses, such as senior housing and/ or as an art and drama and possible theatre centre.

### Splash Pad Still A Possibility For Massey

The idea of having a splash pad constructed in Massey has been revitalized.

Two organizers of the Massey Haunted Trail, Tiffany Hall and Stephanie Stonley, met with Sables-Spanish Rivers Township council to tell them they plan to continue the successful fundraiser with funds going towards the splash pad.

An application for Trillium funding was turned down last year, but the two women say they will continue fundraising to build up the funds.

Stonley says the event, which runs the last two weeks of September, has raised an average of \$7,000 to \$11,000 per year over the last four years.

Hall emphasizes they can't go it alone however and will need volunteers to help make it another success this fall.

In turn, council agreed to erect signage and are looking for storage for their supplies. Anyone wanting to volunteer, can contact Stonley or Hall on Facebook.

## Sables-Spanish Rivers Township Creating A New Farming Class – Building Permits

Sables-Spanish Rivers
Township council is expected
to give final approval to a new
class in the Building Code
focusing on farming properties.
Farmers Charlie Smith and
John Mooney both appeared
before council to express their
concerns about what they call
unfair permits charges for
building structures such as
barns.

Mooney was being charged \$11,000 in building permit fees to build a new barn.

Mayor Leslie Gamble says the township is proposing farm buildings be assessed in a separate class; \$10 per square foot for farm buildings with low human occupancy; \$15 and \$20 per square foot for commercial structures.

Gamble feels there is a bit more fine-tuning to be done before the proposed fees become law, so the matter will once again come before council later this month before the bylaw is passed.

### Recipe

**Giant Tiger** 

These Peach Cobbler Muffins are the perfect sweet snack and nice to make when Ontario peaches are in season but can also be made with canned peaches. This is such an easy recipe that tastes just like Grandma's peach cobbler! And the best part? They're even easier to



make than a traditional cobbler and have the perfect crumble topping.

For the muffins:

- 1 1/4 cup all- purpose flour
- 1 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2/3 cup white sugar
- 1 1/4 cups chopped fresh (or canned) peaches, drained well
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 egg

■ 1/4 cup vegetable oil

For the streusel topping:

- 1/4 cup all purpose flour
- 1/4 cup white sugar
- 1 pinch cinnamon
- 3 tablespoons cold unsalted butter



Preheat your oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit and prepare a large muffin tin. Add the flour, baking powder, salt and sugar to a large bowl and whisk together to combine. Add the peaches, and stir to coat. Add the milk, egg and oil and stir together with a rubber spatula just until the flour disappears. Portion the batter out into the muffin cups evenly (about 3/4 full).

For the topping: Combine the flour, sugar and cinnamon in a small bowl and stir. Add the cold butter in chunks and break it up with your fingers in the flour mixture until it resembles coarse crumbs. Top the muffins with a spoonful of the streusel topping. Bake at 400 degrees for about 20 minutes until golden brown and a toothpick inserted into one of the muffins comes out clean.
