Water Billing: NOTICE TO ALL RESIDENTS



The Town of Espanola will be assuming the water and wastewater billings from Espanola Regional Hydro Corporation effective October 1st, 2019.

How Does This affect me?

Residential water and wastewater rates are NOT changing. Instead of receiving your water charges on your bill from Espanola Regional Hydro you will receive a bill from the Town of Espanola on a quarterly basis.

How Do I Pay?

Any special billing arrangements such as monthly pre-authorized payments with Espanola Regional Hydro WILL NOT be transferred to the Town. New authorization forms will be available if you wish to pay in this manner. You will be issued a new account number from the

Town and this must be used for payments through the bank or online. You will also be able to pay your water bill at the Town office using cash, debit, or cheque.

Multi-Residential Property Owners

If water is supplied to more than one party at a property, the owner may request that the occupant be billed directly. The Town will do so as a convenience to the owner under the following conditions:

a) The owner shall assume full responsibility for all water and wastewater charges in the event the occupant fails to pay
b) An authorization form must be completed and signed by the owner and returned to the Town Office.

Outstanding balances greater than 90 days will be added to the property tax account in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Act, 2001 on a quarterly basis.

2019 WATER MAIN SWABBING PROGRAM



Beginning on **Mon, Sept 23** and running through to **Thurs, Sept 26** the Town of Espanola with OCWA will undertake the Water Main Swabbing Program.

Hours of swabbing will be from 9:00 P.M. to 5:00 A.M.

The program should take 4 days to complete.

Residents immediately affected each night are advised to close the main water valve in their homes and DO NOT attempt to use any water during swabbing hours. This is important to avoid drawing a piece of foam swab into your service and blocking it.

We ask that when you re-open the main water valve in your home following swabbing, that you turn on a cold water tap (laundry tub if possible) and let it run to flush any residue that may be left in your water service.

Residents not in the swabbing area **could** experience dirty water. If you experience dirty water, let your cold water run and it should clear up. If dirty water persists, please call 705-869-1751 between 8:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M.

Should you have any questions or experience low water pressure following swabbing, please call the Public Works Dept. between the hours of 8:00am to 4:00pm at 705-869-1751 or 705-222-7932 after hours.

Recipe

This is a simple but delicious recipe that I found in an old cookbook years ago. They can be served with any type of meat, and everyone enjoys them. Just be sure not to cut the potatoes all the way through when preparing them.



Hasselback Baked Potatoes (Makes 4 servings)

- 4 medium baking potatoes
- 1 tsp salt
- 2 to 3 tbsp melted butter
- 2 to 3 chopped fresh herbs, such as parsley, chives or thyme
- 4 tbsp grated cheddar cheese (or more if you like them cheesy)
- 1 1/2 tbsp parmesan cheese



Scrub potatoes. Cut potatoes into thin slices vertically, but not all the way through (like a fan). Put potatoes into a baking dish, fan them slightly. Drizzle with melted butter and then sprinkle with salt and herbs. Bake potatoes at 425 degrees for 50 minutes or until tender. Remove from the oven and sprinkle with the cheeses. Return to the oven and bake for another 10-15 minutes.
