Massey Woman Still Waiting For A Live Liver Donor

A Massey woman says the most difficult part about having liver failure is waiting for a matching donor.

Elizabeth Cassidy has had liver failure since December saying her condition, Wilson's Disease, has made it impossible for her to absorb and excrete copper.

She adds because of the degree of her liver failure, she is not able to be matched with someone who has passed on and donated their organs.

Cassidy says she is thankful for all the people who have continued to support her and her family, but is asking for people to consider getting tested so a match can hopefully be found.

Only a small portion of a live liver is needed and all costs are covered.

Cassidy was in Toronto in mid-August to see the transplant surgeon and says finding a living donor is really important for me because of my MELD score," she said.

The Model for End-Stage Liver Disease (MELD) is a scoring system for assessing the severity of chronic liver disease and is calculated using the patient's blood tests.

"My MELD score is around 18 now, so it's still quite low, and that means I am not eligible for a liver from a deceased donor," explained Cassidy.

Cassidy, who is married with a 14-year-old son, has managed her condition with medication until she went into liver failure last December.

Cassidy admits she is tired but is keeping up her spirits as best she can and is asking for anyone considering a donation to get tested. To be a living donor, a person must be between 18 and 60, but none of Cassidy's immediate family members qualify as her son is too young and her husband, Les, is over 70. Other people have also come forward to be tested, but no match has been found as vet. NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING AMENDMENT TO A ZONING BYLAW {Planning Act Section 34(13)}

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers will hold a public meeting in order to consider amendments to the Comprehensive Zoning Bylaw 2010-51. The public meeting will be held on Wednesday, September 25, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers at 11 Birch Lake Road, Massey, Ontario.

File No. ZBA19-04

Purpose and Effect: The purpose of the amendment would allow for a reduced setback of the front yard with shoreline frontage in the Rural zone. The effect is to permit an existing structure to remain closer than the required setback. The property is legally described as Victoria Township, Section 40, Parcel 40-1-2, Plan 53R-13611 Part 7, at civic address 178 Kring Road. The application is deemed to be complete for the purposes of Section 34 (10.1) of the Planning Act. The land subject of this application is not subject of any other application under the Planning Act.

File No. ZBA19-05

Purpose and Effect. The purpose of the amendment is to permit the establishment of a micro-cannabis operation that complies with Health Canada requirements for the growth of medical and recreational cannabis. The operation will be totally enclosed within a building with a footprint of 464.5 m2 which is designed to provide the required security measures. The effect is to allow the installation of a cannabis growth operation employing 3-4 people on a 3.75 ha parcel legally described as May Township, Concession 2, Part of Lot 9, Plan 53R-15647 Part 3, at civic address 288 Lee Valley Road. The lands will be zoned Light Industrial (M1) Zone. The application is deemed to be complete for the purposes of Section 34 (10.1) of the Planning Act. The land subject of this application is not subject of any other application under the Planning Act.

TAKE NOTICE that if you wish to be notified of the decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers on the proposed application, you must make a written request to the Clerk of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers.

To appeal the decision to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal, send an appeal form to the Clerk of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers outlining the reasons for the appeal. You must enclose the appeal fee of \$300.00 for each application appealed, paid by cheque, made payable to the Ontario Minister of Finance.

If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at the public meeting or make written submissions to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers before the bylaw is passed, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision. If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at the public

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at the public meeting, or make written submissions to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers before the decision is made, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Tribunal, unless in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to do so.





Morning Glory Zucchini Loaf

- 2 c. All purpose flour
- 1 tsp. Ground cinnamon
- 1 tsp. Baking powder
- 1/2 tsp. Baking soda
- 1/2 tsp. Salt
- 1 c. Vegetable oil
- 1/2 c. Granulated sugar
- 2 large Eggs
- 1 tsp. Vanilla extract
- $1 \frac{1}{2}$ c. Grated zucchini (from 2 medium)
- • 1 c. Grated carrots
- • 1 c. Crushed pineapple, drained
 - 1/2 cup Raisins

Preheat oven to 350° and grease a loaf pan with cooking spray. In a large bowl whisk together flour, cinnamon, baking powder, ■ baking soda, and salt. In another large bowl stir together oil, sugar, eggs, and vanilla. Add zucchini, carrot, pineapple, and raisins. Add dry ingredients and stir until just combined. Pour ■ batter into loaf pan and bake until a toothpick inserted into the middle comes out clean, about 1 hour 15 minutes. Let cool completely before serving.
