Domtar In The Fight Against Covid-19




By Rosalind Russell - Producing products deemed essential to combat the COVID-19 virus is the focus of operations at the Domtar Mill in Espanola.

Regional Public Affairs Manager Bonny Skene says their production lines continue running since many of their products are deemed essential in the fight against the virus, including pulp used for tissue products, materials for personal hygiene products and paper products for sanitary, single-use food services.

She adds there are a number of procedural changes in place to protect the workers in their comprehensive Pandemic Response Policy including physical distancing between workers, constant sanitizing of equipment, restricted access and screening contractors.

Skene says where possible, employees are working out of their homes and using teleconferencing to ensure a smooth dayto-day operation at the mill.

Espanola Municipal Budget Increase Reduced

Before the COVID-19 protocols were put in place, the first draft of the Espanola municipal budget was presented to council with an increase of just over six percent but that has been substantially reduced.

Back on January 22nd, Espanola CAO Cynthia Townsend presented the 2020 budget to council which included an increase of 6.14% in the tax levy. But, council asked for the departments to review their budgets and bring those increases down, which Townsend says now sits at a proposed increase of 2.29%.

The average increase to a home

owner with an assessment of \$100,000 will be about \$45.74. Townsend says due to the COVID-19 protocols, no meetings are being held, but council is putting together a protocol to take care of important matters while still meeting physical distancing requirements.

She adds the date set to pass the budget is April 14th.

Townsend says the budget will see a decrease in the Ontario Municipal Partnership Fund grants, and increases in health unit funding, bylaw enforcement increase, fire and complex budgets and Care Van funding.

EACOM Protecting Workers While Continuing Operation

Protocols are in place to deal with COVID-19 at EACOM Timber Corporation's Nairn Centre Sawmill, the second-largest industrial company in the North Shore.

EACOM President and CEO, Kevin Edgson, says the recent border closure with the United States excludes lumber as it is considered a critical good and it must continue to be supplied. That said, Edgson says they have response teams in place at all their operations, including Nairn Centre, who will deal with the day-to-day decisions based on what is best for employees.

He adds they have also been working closely with local health authorities to ensure all recommendations are in place, including sanitization stations and physical distancing.

We are following official recommendations, some of which include:

- Suspending all business travel (including upper management and inter-mill travel):
- Requiring employees to self-isolate if they meet any of the risk factors or present symptoms;
- Secure procedure for

our inbound and outbound truckers:

- Restricting site visitors to those with a valid business reason and requiring visitors to sign a self-declaration form;
- Safety Tool Box meetings every day to review best practices and new measures;
- Enhanced cleaning protocols for all common areas and deployment of hand sanitizer;
- Emphasizing social distancing and proper hygiene, as prescribed by the World Health Organization; and
- Implementing workfrom-home arrangements, conference call meetings, the elimination of group gatherings, and staggering breaks where possible.

"This situation is unprecedented in living memory, things are changing rapidly, and we are communicating with employees frequently. To get through it, we are counting on our team members to work together, look out for each other, and be thoughtful of their actions," adds Edgson. "EACOM is committed to keeping our employees safe while maintaining our operations and continuing to be a vital economic driver in our for communities."

Espanola & Area COVID-19 Assessment Centre

Espanola & Area COVID-19 Assessment Centre **hours have changed.** The COVID Assessment call line will now be open 7 days a week from 8am – 4pm. The centre's purpose is to assess and, only where appropriate, swab people who may be infected with COVID-19.

Espanola Regional Hospital has added a drive-up testing centre in addition to the Mobile COVID Paramedicine Response Team to meet the needs of our community.

The goal of this response team is to minimize the significant number of patients presenting themselves to Primary Care or the Emergency Department.

appointment only.

Individuals with general questions must not call the Espanola COVID-19 Assessment Centre

Individuals will be referred after screening is done by your community health provider, telehealth, public health unit, Sagamok Wellness Centre, Birch Island Health Centre or the Domtar employee screening program.

Individuals must meet the following criteria for an Assessment Centre appointment:

1. Symptoms:

Fever (over 38 degrees Celsius) and/or cough (new or worsening) and/or shortness of breath

You can expect to be asked about:

- 2. Exposure History within the last 14 days prior to onset of symptoms:
- a. Travel outside of Canada
- b. Had close interactions with a confirmed or probable case of COVID-19
- c. Had close interactions with someone who has symptoms of COVID-19 who recently travelled outside of Canada

The Emergency Department is open 24/7 We ask anyone with mild/minor issues to seek care with their family provider or contact Telehealth for further direction.

COVID-19 safety protocols are in place for a major capital school construction project in Espanola.

Huron-Superior Roman Catholic School Board Manager of Plant Services Steve Brown says at this time the new double school build in Espanola is advancing, with precautionary measures in place.

This includes physical distancing and sanitization stations.

He adds they are hopeful the

project will be completed for September move-in, barring any future shut-down order issued by the Ministry of Labour.

The double school will house French Catholic and English Catholic students in a shared environment.

Service Canada Offices Being Shut Down

The federal government is shutting down the network of in-person Service Canada centres over COVID-19 concerns.

Locally, the Espanola site, which services Manitoulin Island and the North Shore corridor has been closed since last week.

The Elliot Lake centre is now closed.

The Liberals say the move,

announced last Thursday, shouldn't affect most unemployed workers who seek employment insurance benefits since the vast majority of applications are done online. And a new benefit for those who don't qualify for EI but see their income dry up due to COVID-19 will be available through an online application. The web portal is targeted for opening early next month.



Recipe

My sister made these bagel balls with her kids the other day and recommends I try them. She said they were really easy to make and super delicious. I picked up the ingredients and am anxious to make them this



weekend. Thought I'd share the recipe so you can try them too.

I Stuffed Bagel Balls

- 1 cup unbleached all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder (make sure it's not expired, or it won't rise)
- 3/4 teaspoon kosher salt (use less if using table salt)
- 1 cup Greek yogurt (not regular yogurt, it will be too sticky)
- half package cream cheese, cut into 8 cubes
- 1 egg, beaten
 - optional toppings: everything bagel seasoning, sesame seeds, poppy seeds, dried garlic flakes, dried onion flakes

Preheat oven to 375F. Place parchment paper or a silpat on a baking sheet. If using parchment paper, spray with oil to avoid sticking. In a medium bowl combine the flour, baking powder and salt and whisk well. Add the yogurt and mix with a fork or spatula until well combined, it will look like small crumbles.

Lightly dust flour on a work surface and remove dough from the bowl, knead the dough a few times until dough is tacky, but not sticky, about 15 turns (it should not leave dough on your hand when you pull away). Divide dough into 8 equal balls. Flatten each ball into circles, then place 1/2 tablespoon cream cheese on each. Fold the dough over the cream cheese and roll into a ball. Repeat with the remaining dough. Top with egg wash and sprinkle with seasoning of your choice if desired. Bake on the top rack of the oven for 25 minutes. Let cool at least 10 minutes before eating.
