A Brief Update on Environment Emergency (E2) Information

The federal E2 regulation was recently updated and now requires any operation using or storing specific hazardous substances to proactively inform the public about possible risks. This includes chlorine dioxide, a chemical produced and stored at Domtar for use in the pulp making process. Chlorine dioxide is classified as an inhalation hazard that can cause mild to serious effects, depending on exposure. A key objective of the E2 regulation is to reduce the risk posed by hazardous substances by ensuring rigorous and effective management programs are in place.

Prevention, Preparation and Response

The Espanola pulp and paper mill has safely managed chlorine dioxide for decades and we are working diligently to stay that way. Environmental emergency prevention, planning and safety management systems have always been a part of the Espanola mill and we want you to know what we are doing, with the support of Espanola emergency services, to prevent, prepare for and respond to an environmental emergency.

What if an environmental emergency were to occur?

You will be notified by the Town of Espanola emergency services, working closely with Domtar and given instructions—such as stay inside with the windows closed. Please listen carefully and follow the directions provided. 9-1-1- remains the contact number for medical assistance for any health concerns.



Espanola Council Approves Hiring Of New Building Inspector

It was a back and forth discussion with Espanola council on filling another job vacancy, this time a building inspector to service the town and the three outlying municipalities.

Back in 2017, the town entered into an agreement with Baldwin, Sables-Spanish Rivers and Nairn & Hyman townships.

Mayor Jill beer says the full cost recovery Shared Services Agreement for the enforcement of the Provincial Ontario Building Code would remain the same, meaning a full cost recovery for Espanola.

She adds there is also a 15% administrative fee to cover a portion of the time as required for certain inspections, supervision and other admin costs.

However, some councillors did not see the value in filling the position since Espanola already has a building inspector in place. Beer disagreed stating it was a diplomatic way to assist the surrounding communities without costing Espanola anything.

In the end, she voted in favour of the hiring breaking the tie between the councillors.

Is Your Child Taking A Bus To School? Registration Required

Your child will no longer be automatically registered to take the bus this year due to COVID-19 protocols.

The Sudbury Student Services Consortium is in the process of coordinating all its bus services and executive director Renee Boucher says this year parents must sign up for the child to travel on the bus.

She says seats will be assigned and all students from Grade 4 to 12 must wear masks with younger riders encouraged to also do so.

She says every bus will also be sanitized twice a day, and drivers will wear a mask, but are unable to wear face shields while driving.

Boucher says parents are to call the consortium as soon as possible so buses can be assigned for the children in time for the first day of school, Tuesday, September 8th.

The Sudbury Student Services Consortium provides student transportation for the Rainbow District School Board, the Sudbury Catholic District School Board, the Conseil scolaire catholique du Nouvel-Ontario, and the Conseil scolaire public du Grand Nord de l'Ontario. It also provides transportation services for the Huron Superior Catholic District School Board and five area First Nations.

Those buses run through much of northeastern Ontario, including Sudbury, Espanola, Manitoulin Island, along the north shore corridor and Elliot Lake.

More than 20,000 students on 397 buses are transported daily at a cost of over \$28 million per year.

Boucher says this year, "Parents can opt in by giving us a phone call or sending us an email with their children's information. We are also strongly encouraging parents to sign up for our online portal, where they will be able to manage all of their children's information throughout the school year. The way it works is you create an account and add your children to the account. To sign up, you will need your child's OEN number."

Every child in the school system receives an Ontario Education Number that is assigned by the Ministry of Education to all elementary and secondary students across the province. For parents whose children are already attending school, you should be able to locate their OEN number on a former report card.

Children starting JK will not yet have an OEN number — the organization is contacting parents directly in this case. Once parents have created an account on the portal, they will be able to update their information as required throughout the school year.

Recipe

I'm so happy that I have friends and family that like to cook and bake and are kind enough to share their favourite recipes with me. My friend just made this



recipe and says it is delicious. It's a fantastic way to use peaches that are in season right now. It's a different take on a peach pie with a shortbread crust, a creamy peach filling and a crumble topping.

Peaches and Cream Bars

Crust and Topping

- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/2 cups (3 sticks) unsalted butter, chilled

Filling

- 4 large eggs
- 2 cups sugar
- 1 cup sour cream
- 3/4 cup all-purpose flour
- pinch of salt
- 2 pounds peaches, pitted and sliced thin*

Preheat the oven to 350°F. Grease a 9×13-inch pan with cooking spray; set aside. In the bowl of a mixer, combine the flour, sugar, and salt. Mix with the paddle attachment until combined. Cut the butter into small pieces and add in a few at a time. Mix until the butter is evenly combined, and the mixture appears crumbly. (This can also be done by hand with a pastry cutter or with a fork.) Take out 1 1/2 cups of the mixture and set aside. Press the remaining mixture into the prepared pan. Bake in the preheated oven until golden brown, 12 to 15 minutes. Let cool for at least 10 minutes. In a large bowl, whisk together the eggs and sugar. Add in the sour cream, flour and salt. Fold in the sliced peaches. Pour over the cooked crust. Take the remaining 1 1/2 cups of the dry mixture and sprinkle over the top of the peaches. Bake until the top is lightly browned, and the filling is set, 45 to 50 minutes. Cool at least 1 hour before cutting into bars. (These slice much better after they have been refrigerated for a couple of hours.) Store in the refrigerator.

Manitoulin OPP Hosts Opening Of New Detachment



The Manitoulin OPP has a new state-of-the-art detachment.

Originally, a grand opening of the new Manitoulin OPP detachment located on Boosneck Road in Little Current was to be held, but with COVID-19, a soft opening was held Tuesday, August 18.

Outfitted with advanced technology and state-of-the art policing equipment, the new \$20 million facility will ensure local OPP personnel have the tools and space needed to deliver policing services. It has nearly 18,000 square feet of space, a modern infrastructure design to support ever-changing technology requirements, five holding cells, secure evidence areas, as well as closed-circuit television technology and other advanced security features.

The new detachment replaces the one located at 12 Campbell Road East, which closes today.

Other satellite offices, including the Espanola detachment, will continue to be maintained.

Road Remediation A Priority – I.E. Espanola

As part of last week's discussion by Espanola council on approving a draft plan for the Queensway intersection, council also had a discussion about road congestion. Last Tuesday, Polly Investments plan was approved for reconstructing the Queensway Motel, the construction of a sixunit mini-mall and the building of a new entrance further away from the main intersection of the Queensway Avenue and Highway 6.

Council is concerned about further traffic congestion, so members discussed possible traffic lights.

On Friday, the Ontario and federal government issued a release they are seeking applications for road reconstruction.

Town CAO Cynthia Townsend told Around&About they will be applying for funding to reconstruct the Highway Six – Centre Street from McDonalds south to the Second Street intersection.

Townsend adds she will be bringing up the application with council for approval to move ahead with applying for the project, which will include addressing the potential traffic congestion.

For example, Espanola will receive just over \$311,000, Sables-Spanish Rivers township,

just over \$229,000, Naim & Hyman Township \$35,500 and Baldwin Township, \$43,000.

Northeastern Manitoulin and the Islands will receive nearly \$267,000, Gore Bay \$53,700, Elliot Lake nearly \$872,000 and Blind River just over \$303,000 The funding is to assist municipalities in delivering critical public services, such as public transit and shelters and help address operating pressures related to the COVID-19 pandemic through the first round of emergency funding.
