Go Fund Me Set Up For Manitoulin Island OPP Officer's Children



By Rosalind Russell - The four children of slain Manitoulin OPP Constable Marc Hovingh are receiving funding to help them with their futures thanks to a GoFundMe campaign.

Ontario Provincial Police Association Branch 13 and team leader Scott Jacklin organized the campaign last Tuesday.

Hovingh was shot and killed in the line of duty while responding to a property dispute near Gore Bay on Manitoulin Island.

Jacklin says Hovingh and his wife Lianne have four children: Laura, Nathan, Elena, and Sarah.

He says all four are currently completing their post-secondary education or just beginning their lives on their own.

As of press time, nearly \$65,000 of a \$100,000 goal has been raised.

Integrity Commissioner Costs Are In For Espanola




Investigations by Espanola's Integrity Commissioner and other investigative fees will see taxpayers paying just over \$81,000.

The last year has been a busy one for Integrity Commissioner Robert Swayze, who was called in to investigate several complaints with some sanctions being made.

In the end it is the taxpayers who will pay just over \$74,000 to Swayze for that work, and another \$7,300 in legal fees to Crawford, Chondon and Partners for representing the town.

Espanola Mayor Jill Beer is the only member of council who had a comment to make about the payments stating it is a substantial amount of money the town has had to pay out for that (process).

Commercial Subsidy For Businesses

Applications are now open for the Canada Emergency Rent subsidy, for businesses hardpressed to pay the rent on their stores.

The program replaces an earlier federal support system which relied on commercial landlords to make the application.

The landlords would have been forced to swallow a 25

per cent loss in rent under that program.

The new program covers up to 65 per cent of commercial rent or mortgage interest, depending on how serious the downturn of business has been at a shop.

An extra 25 per cent subsidy is available to those businesses that have been hardest hit.

Rainbow Board And Early Childhood Educators Reach Tentative Agreement

The union representing designated early childhood educators and the Rainbow District School Board has reached a tentative deal.

Board Chair Doreen Dewar says the deal is between the board and the Elementary Teachers' Federation of Ontario, which represents the educators.

She says the new deal is retroactive to September 1st, 2019, and expires August 31st, 2022.

She adds the deal affects educators serving the Sudbury, Espanola, and Manitoulin area.

Dewar says she expects ratification to take place within the next couple of weeks.

Recipe

I got this recipe from my sister years ago and recently discovered it in my recipe book. I made it for supper the other night and suddenly remembered



how much I like it. I had forgotten how good it is! The sweet, buttery sauce is delicious on chicken and also poured over rice. Adjust the curry powder to your liking. I love curry and use the whole 4 tsp's and omit the cayenne pepper because I like it mild.

Honey Curry Chicken

- ½ cup liquid honey
- 1/4 cup butter, melted
- 1/4 cup Dijon mustard
- 2-4 tsp mild curry powder
- Pinch of Cayenne pepper (optional)
- 3 lbs of chicken, any cut (I usually use bone in chicken breasts)
- Salt and pepper

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Whisk honey, butter, mustard, curry powder and cayenne pepper together. Salt and pepper the chicken and place in a casserole dish. Reserving ½ cup of the honey liquid mixture pour the remaining over the chicken. Cover and bake for 30 minutes. Uncover and pour on the remaining honey mixture, basting the chicken. Bake for another 15-30 minutes depending on the cut of the chicken, until cooked through and juices run clear.
