Opening Of New Joint Educational And **Childcare Facility In Espanola In Spring**



Conseil scolaire catholique Nouvelon (CSC Nouvelon), the Huron-Superior Catholic District School Board (HSCDSB), and Our Children, Our Future/ Nos Enfants. Notre Avenir (OCOF/NENA) wish to inform all families that Espanola's long-awaited new educational and childcare build will be available for occupancy in the spring of 2021. The new joint facility, located at 301 Church Street on the site of the former Sacred Heart Catholic School and former St-Louis de France Catholic Church properties, will house École catholique La Renaissance, Sacred Heart Catholic Elementary School, and Our Children, Our Future Daycare / Garderie Nos Enfants, Notre Avenir According to the latest information, the new building may be substantially completed by the end of February 2021. 
I had this delicious brie appetizer on the weekend and had to find the recipe and share it with you. The apple crumble topping is the perfect accompaniment
