Indigenous Minister Tours Birch Island



The First Draft Of The Municipal Budget For Espanola

The initial draft of Espanola's municipal budget shows an increase of 6.14% but that is likely to go down following further line-by-line review by council.

Town CAO Cynthia Townsend says some of the increase can be attributed to police transition

She says Espanola is in year two of the transition process from municipal to OPP policing.

Townsend adds another reason is the reconstruction of a section of Highway 6 and the replacement of the main trunk line from the water treatment plant into town.

The projects are to be completed this summer.

Council will be meeting throughout February to find ways to reduce taxes with a final budget in place by March.

Sagamok-Anishnawbek First Nation Withdraws From UOI

Sagamok-Anishnawbek First another layer of bureaucracy Nation has withdrawn from the Union of Ontario Indians. In a notice to the community, chief and council have made the decision to withdraw from the organization for two reasons: Sagamok has its own political authority to deal with the Crown through the Huron-Superior Treaty of 1850 and they state they don't need a middle man to handle their affairs.

The notice states while the union's original function was to act as a body for political advocacy, it has become that siphons off funding it gets for First Nations.

While other First Nations are in the process of working on self-government agreements with the federal government, Sagamok council does not believe it needs one because the right to self-governance is part of the treaty, so council has also withdrawn from that process as part of dissolving their relationship with the union.

The union has not responded for comment.

Two Wiikwemikoong Women To Be Honoured Nationally



women Wiikwemikoong Unceded First Nation on Manitoulin Island will receive the highest honour bestowed on Indigenous peoples.

Wiikwemikoong Chief Duke Peltier says the community is honoured that two of their own will receive an award at the 2020 Indspire Awards.

He says Marian Jacko will receive the Law & Justice Award as the first female children's Indigenous lawyer in Ontario and her advocacy for children, youth and family. Peltier adds Jeanette Corbiere Lavell, a member of the Order of Canada will receive the Lifetime Achievement Award for her long-time advocacy of culture and as a human rights advocate.

Peltier says the two will be presented with their award at the 2020 Indspire Awards at a ceremony at the National Arts Centre in Ottawa on March 6th.

Principals Want To Cancel EQAO Testing

School principals in Ontario are asking the government to delay the "Education Quality and Accountability Office" literacy test set for March 31st, because of on-going strikes by teachers across the province. The principals are suggesting the E-Q-A-O test be put off for

a year, with a double cohort

taking it at that time.

They say students may not be sufficiently prepared for the test because of the teachers' job actions, and holding the test on the appointed day may not be possible.

So far, there's been no response from Education Minister Stephen Lecce.

Federal Government Testing Seat Belts On School Buses

The federal government has introduced a pilot project to install three-point seatbelts to new school buses.

The federal task force is launching the project in Sudbury and later this spring will select a test site in British Columbia.

Sudbury was chosen due to the interest shown by the Sudbury

Student Services Consortium, a partnership between the four school boards to share busing in the district, as well as Espanola and Massey.

The project will get underway with a limited number of new buses getting seat belts installed. It's estimated 2.2 million Canadian children take a bus to school.

Recipe

Everyone has a chocolate chip cookie recipe; I actually have many. But this recipe promised that these were the "best". So, I tried it, and they are pretty



darn good; my mom even asked for the recipe. The middle of the cookie is nice and soft, and the outer edge has a little crispiness. Of course, with any cookie recipe, baking time can be less or more depending on how crispy or soft you like your cookies.

Best Chocolate Chip Cookies

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 cup butter barely melted. (You want to melt it in the microwave, but not over melt it, leave some small, solid pieces in in), and be sure to let it cool a bit before putting in with the other ingredients.
- ³/₄ cup light brown sugar, packed
- ²/₃ cup granulated sugar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon apple cider vinegar
- 1 large egg
- 2 cups semisweet chocolate chips

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

In a medium bowl mix together the flour, baking soda and the salt: Set aside.

In a large bowl beat together the butter, sugars, vanilla extract and the vinegar until smooth. Beat in the egg just until combined. Mix the flour mixture into the wet mixture just until combined. Stir in the chips. Using a large cookie scoop (about 2 rounded tablespoons) drop about 3 inches apart onto cookie sheet. Bake for 8 to 10 minutes, they will look light brown around the edges and will look underdone in the center. Allow to sit on the sheet for 10 minutes before moving to a rack to cool.

This week I've got a quick and easy recipe for your next Meatless-Monday! These quesadillas

are super yummy and will have you forgetting that they're vegetarian after the first bite.

Sweet Potato & Black Bean Quesadillas

Ingredients:

- 4 Medium flour tortillas
- 1 large sweet potato
- 2 avocados
- 1/2 cup black beans rinsed and drained
- 1/4 cup of corn
- 1 red pepper
- 1 orange pepper
- 1 tbsp taco seasoning
- 1 cup cheddar cheese
- 1 tbsp butter

Prepare Filling

- Use a fork to poke several holes into the sweet potato and microwave for 8 minutes or until very tender.
- Add diced peppers to a large pan and cook until tender. Add black beans, corn, and taco seasoning and stir to combine, cooking another 3 minutes. Pour into a bowl and set aside. Assemble the Quesadilla
- Lightly spread butter over one side of the tortilla. On the other side spread about 3 tbsp of sweet potato over the tortilla. Next mash half of an avocado over the sweet potato. Add about 1/4 cup of the veggie/bean filling over the top of the avocado. Finally sprinkle a generous amount of cheese over top.
- Place the butter side of the tortilla down on the warm pan and cook over medium heat until tortilla is browned and cheese is melted. Carefully fold tortilla in half on to itself using the spatula. Repeat until all tortillas are filled and cooked. Slice and serve warm with salsa, sour cream, or guacamole!
