#### WE Charity And The Trudeaus-Have Fame And Will Profit

Looking back and okay, gloating-I might very disappointed author looking out at an just be that stable genius Trump keeps laying claim to or at least one smooth-talking SOB because--I got both Margaret Trudeau and Alexandre Trudeau to speak at my event... for \$250 a piece!!!

Caught in the consequences of yet another bonehead decision, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau is apologizing profusely for his close association with WE Charity which resulted in his mother and brother receiving \$300,000 in speaking fees. In turn he awarded the charity a \$900 million volunteering grant program for summer students from which WE would have been paid \$19.5 million to operate the project.

For twenty years, from 1994-2014 I organized and hosted Reading At The Roselawn at Port Colborne's precious little theatre by the same name. I brought in about ten Canadian authors each season, some like Margaret Atwood, Pierre Berton, Farley Mowat, Mordecai Richler and Rohinton Mistry the cream of the crop. Sold-out at 300 subscribers per year and at one point with a waiting list of 150 people trying to get tickets I wouldn't say it was the best author series in Canada..but Doug Gibson did. Editor of literary stars like Alice Munro, Alistair MacLeod and W.O Mitchell, Gibson wrote in his book Across Canada By Story: "William persuades them to come, even if (perhaps especially if) they don't know where the hell Port Colborne is. And somehow that little town of roughly 20,000 has created the best speaking series in Canada.'

Okay, gloating over, without great sponsors and 300 enthusiastic fans of literature living in Welland, Fonthill and Port Colborne it would have been me, my dog Jake and a

empty auditorium.

In May of 2007, my last speaker was 'Sacha' Trudeau who had reintroduced Two Innocents In Red China, a book written by Pierre Trudeau and Jacques Hebert about their daring travels through the 'Sleeping Giant' during the dark days of Chairman

At the microphone the 34-year-old documentary maker was at first shy and awkward and then rambling, and finally verbose. Still, famous and personable, Sacha was good value at \$250. Not so much, I'm guessing at the \$32,000 WE Charity paid him for eight appearances.

In 2011 Margaret Trudeau's book Changing My Mind was published and I was all over it. Her publicist at Harper Collins dismissed Readings At The Roselawn as too small an event for such a large personality so I went 'big.' I organized five author events in Niagara for our once 'first lady'--one at the Inn On The Twenty in Jordan, another at Ridley College, a third at Marynissen Estate Winery in Niagara -on-the-Lake and a double feature at the Roselawn. Trust me, this is an author's dream: five soldout appearances in two days in front of adoring fans, all expenses paid and \$1250 honoraria to boot. Normally authors eagerly do book tours at no charge and many wind up speaking to 20 people sitting on folding chairs in a guild hall.

As a huge fan of Pierre Trudeau it really bothered me that Margaret so easily dismissed her reckless behaviour in the 70's, shacking up with The Rolling Stones and dancing at Studio 54 in New York while her husband Pierre Trudeau was fighting for

his political life with--oh, I was misdiagnosed.

Still in all she was Margaret Trudeau, famous, somewhat glamorous and still much loved by Canadians for her toughness in surviving mental illness, the public disintegration of her marriage to a prime minister and the tragic death of her young son Michel.

So it all went well until we got to The Roselawn on the final day where Margaret suddenly lost it. She turned on me in front of my volunteers. "You booked me into too many events, Bill. I didn't agree to all this. I can't do it!"

I looked at her publicist, Rob Firing who had gleefully agreed to the five-event tour of Niagara with an eye on record book sales. Rob looked at his shoes.

I was tempted to remind Margaret that a lot of people may have looked at the agenda before boarding the plane from Montreal to Toronto. I took the bullet, tried to console her and moved on as best I could. And it all worked out quite well, considering. Margaret Trudeau became charming and relaxed by the end of the two-day whirlwind tour...but she still wasn't worth \$250,000.

I couldn't help but notice that exNHL'er Theo Fleury waded into the controversy, miffed that he was invited to speak at a WE Charity event...for free. That's rich. I chased Fleury for a week trying to get him to the Roselawn with his newly published book Playing With Fire, offering the \$250 honorarium, overnight accommodations and help with transportation. I kept reminding his agent that authors normally do book tour events for free, you know to promote book sales! She kept reminding me that Mr Fleury's minimum fee for a speaking engagement was \$6,000. Shocked, I wanted it to be made clear--I just wanted him to speak, not play.

This whole WE scandal reeks of greed and entitlement, every bit as bad as Trudeau's"free" vacation for family and friends to the private Bahamian island of megarich lobbyist Aga Khan. This moneygrubbing of the Trudeau clan is tarnishing the reputation of one of Canada's greatest prime ministers. Very sad, indeed.

#### **Nominations In Place** For Two First Nation Communities

Two Nations. Sagamok-Anishnawbek and Wiikwemkoong will have their final nominees in place for Chief and Council finalized.

Electoral Officer Vaughn overseeing Johnson is both elections and is in the process of finalizing the lists since nominees are provided the opportunity to withdraw their names from the lists.

As of last week, Sagamok

has eight people running for chief, 81 for council and Wiikwemkoong has six nominated for chief, 52 for council.

Both councils have one position of chief available, 12 for council.

Sagamok's election be held on Wednesday. August 12th while the Wiikwemkoong election is set for Saturday, August 15th.

#### Espanola Council Takes Away Mayor's **Prerogative For Appointing Committees**

In the past, the mayors of Espanola have had the power to appoint councillors to committees, but that is changing in Espanola.

Last Tuesday, Councillor Ken Duplessis tabled an amendment that a clause in the proposed procedural bylaw that the decision as to who sits on municipal committees be a council decision and not made just by the mayor.

He says it would be a progressive move and help council work together more efficiently.

In a recorded vote, Mayor Jill Beer, Councillors Sandra Hayden and Bill Foster voted against the amendment.

Duplessis, Ray Dufour, Maureen Van Alstine and Heather Mallot voted in favour, so the motion carried.

Council then passed the bylaw to adopt the procedural bylaw.

#### **Keeping And Feeding Wildlife Bylaw** Passed By Espanola Council

A new bylaw that outlaws feeding wild animals also includes what kind of pets can be kept by people in Espanola. Councillor Heather Malott brought the matter to the council's attention last month when several neighbours related concerns about the feeding of pigeons and squirrels on a site on Tudhope Street. She told council that since then, the property has been cleaned

up and there is no longer an issue.

The detailed proposed statute was recommended by the bylaw officer and also deals with the keeping of a wide range of animals, including exotics, such as snakes.

The proposal stipulates the only exception in feeding wildlife will be bird feeders and the feeding of domesticated cats and dogs.

First Nations across the North have won another round in their fight for equitable annuities of more than \$4 a year.

On June 26 th Justice Patricia Hennessy issued her ruling in Sudbury court on the second of three phases in the lawsuit. The original treaty contains a provision that states annual payments should be increased as the value of materials extracted from the land increases, a provision that has been ignored over the decades. In phase two, the province and Crown argued that there is a statute of limitations and the Crown is immune from being sued.

However, Justice Hennessey did not agree and the trial will now advance to the third, final stage set for January, 2021 to see how Ontario and Canada will share

the obligations and decide how much is owed.

Every year, First Nations members receive an annuity of \$4 each as part of the Robinson-Huron Treaty.

The payments began in 1850 starting at \$2 and were doubled in 1874, that's 126 years.

#### Recipe

Thank you again to my 'recipe friend' for sharing another delicious recipe with us.



#### Banana Bread Crumb Cake

- 2 cups of flour
- 3 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp salt
- 3 ripe bananas
- ½ cup butter, softened
- 2 cups granulated sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 1 cup milk

#### **Crumb Filling and Topping**

- 1 cup cold butter, cubed
- 2 cups light brown sugar
- 2 cups flour

#### **Optional Glaze**

- 1 cup icing sugar
- 1-2 tbsp milk
- Cinnamon, optional

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray a baking dish with cooking spray. In a medium bowl whisk together flour, baking powder and salt; set aside. In a large bowl, mash bananas until liquefied. Mix in butter until combined and then add the sugar, eggs and vanilla. Stir in milk and then flour mixture until combined. Prepare your crumb filling by combining all ingredients together and cutting them together with a fork or pastry cutter until coarse crumbs form. Pour ½ of the batter into the prepared pan. Top with 1/2 crumb mixture. Cover the filling with the remaining batter and top with remaining crumb mixture. Bake for 45-55 minutes, depending on your oven, until the center is set and a toothpick comes out clean. Cool for 10 minutes. If you like, mix powdered sugar, milk and optional cinnamon and drizzle on top.
