Espanola Therapeutic Park Open For Residents



Chi-Cheemaun Will Sail Lake Huron

Ferry services between Tobermory and South Baymouth on Manitoulin Island are set to begin, but not for regular tourist travel.

The Owen Sound Transportation & Pelee Island Ferry Service will begin its spring season on June 1st with the MC Chi-Cheemaun, but with strict conditions.

In a release, the service says a Transport Canada Interim Order Respecting Passenger Vessel Restrictions due to COVID-19, only commercial and or/through travellers will be allowed on board.

Ferries that provide most practical means to give passengers access to their domicile, residence or their place of employment, access to essential goods and services, transport cargo to resupply communities, business industry, or provide other essential services, are permitted to operate.

It further states the restrictions are to reduce the spread of

COVID-19 on vessels carrying more than 12 passengers and prohibits operations such as tourism and recreation-related activities until at least June 30.

The 'big canoe' as it is commonly known will provide service for a limited number of commercial and through travellers from June 1 to June 30.

This early service is in support of the many commercial carriers who normally use the ferry to transit between regions of northern and southwestern Ontario and customers where the ferry is the most practical means of accessing their owned residences. The ferry service also provides an important second point of access to and departure from Manitoulin Island currently served only by the historic wooden single-lane bridge at Little Current. Ferry service will not be available for passengers engaging in tourism or recreational activities for the duration of the Interim Order.

In addition, all passengers will be required to bring and wear face coverings for the duration of the crossing and must maintain a physical distance of two metres between themselves and other passengers and crew while onboard.



Schools Out Until September, Virtual Learning Continues

Premier Doug Ford says he's not going to risk it.

He's announced that publiclyfunded schools will remain closed for the rest of the school year due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

On-line learning by teachers will continue, with every student receiving a report card for the year.

And Ford says high school

students who were on track to graduate before schools were closed in mid-March will be able

Education Minister Stephen Lecce says classes will resume in September, but our schools won't look the same.

He says protections will be in place such as physical distancing by the end of June.

SNOLAB Scientists Working On A Simple Emergency Ventilator

SNOLAB scientists in Sudbury have partnered with international peers to design software for an alternative to the standard mechanical ventilator in response to industry shortages and international need due to COVID-19.

The project began when Italian physicist Dr. Cristiano Galbiati was quarantined in his home by the pandemic and quickly realized the need for additional ventilators.

He says the Mechanical Ventilator Milano is a simpler form of artificial respirator that uses pressure management rather than a standard motor.

As part of the project, SNOLAB is working on the software for the new ventilator. He adds its open-source design is currently undergoing testing for final verification to achieve medical certification in the USA, Canada, and Italy, with production expected once approvals are finalized.

The idea was to create a simplified, more affordable design relying solely on the

medical air or oxygen available in Intensive Care Units as well as an external power source. To make it easier for countries to reproduce the product within the constraints of their existing supply chains, it was also designed using offthe-shelf-components, meaning those already being produced. Canada became involved in the project by late March, through Galbiati's pre-existing relationship with fellow member of the Global Dark Matter Collaboration, Nobel laureate and former director of the Sudbury Neutrino Observatory, Dr. Arthur B. McDonald.

McDonald rallied the efforts of Canadian physicists behind the cause, including representatives of the SNOLAB, Chalk River Laboratories, Canadian Nuclear Laboratories and the TRI-University Meson Facility.

In addition to sitting on the international committee, SNOLAB has also taken leadership in facilitating communication between the groups as well as sharing information on the project.

Ontario Northland Bus Service Introduces A New Route

While there is still reduced bus service throughout the North, Ontario Northland has scheduled a new route.

Communications director Renee Baker says the new route from Sault Ste. Marie to Thunder Bay, and then onto Winnipeg was slated to start in mid-April but was delayed due to COVID-19. She says two buses arrived in Thunder Bay Tuesday, May 12, from Sault Ste. Marie as part of a

training program from staff.

This is the first time the company will provide busing outside of the province.

Baker adds the first bus left Thunder Bay for Sault Ste. Marie at 2:00 pm on Sunday, May 17th, with a return trip scheduled to arrive in the city the following morning.

Recipe

This recipe is extremely easy to make and is the perfect side dish for all your Mexican meals. I make it to accompany fajitas and tacos. It doesn't contain



any extra fillings, so even picky kids will like it.

Easy Mexican Rice

- 2 tablespoons vegetable or canola oil
- 1 cup uncooked long-grain white rice
- 1 1/2 cups chicken stock or broth
- 8 oz. can tomato sauce
- 1 teaspoon chili powder
- 1 teaspoon garlic salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cumin



Heat the oil in a 4-quart saucepan over medium-high heat. Add the rice and cook until translucent (somewhat clear) about 3-4 minutes; stirring frequently. Add the rest of the ingredients and bring to a rapid boil over high heat. Cover, turn the heat down to almost low (a little less than medium low) and cook for 25 minutes. Remove cover and let stand 2-3 minutes before fluffing with a fork.

As much as I love the budding trees and seas of green in my

backyard, I do NOT love the black flies that come along with them. Working in my garden has been almost impossible and not to mention, very itchy! I've been testing out some options for natural bug repellent and here's what I've found:

- To no surprise I've found citronella essential oil to be quite effective. I combine about 5-10 drops with coconut oil and rub it on all exposed skin. Smells delicious too!
- If you have a spray bottle on hand, try mixing 30 drops citronella oil, 20 drops lemon eucalyptus oil, 20 drops lavender oil, 10 drops rosemary oil, 1 tbsp vodka or rubbing alcohol, ½ cup vinegar, and ½ cup witch hazel or water. Mix and spray generously!
 - Lastly, if you're dealing with pesky flies in your house or camping tent, try sticking 10-20 cloves in half a lemon and place them around entrances. Flies can't stand the smell of this combination.
- *Note: these natural options won't last as long as their chemical alternatives. So reapply often and liberally!
