

PROTECT: Heightened Infection Control Measures in Place to Protect Patients and Staff



Procedural (Surgical) Masks are to be worn at all times throughout the facility and hand hygiene is strictly enforced. No Exceptions!

No cloth masks are permitted.

Those wearing a face shield must still wear a procedural mask.

Visitor Restrictions are as follows for Hospital Patients:

Acute Care: 1 dedicated care partner (DCP) will be permitted for all admitted patients and the hospital screeners will be provided with that information. All visitors will be have to be identified on the list to access patients.

Emergency Department: 1 dedicated visitor per patient in the Emergency Department. Patients and visitors are not to be in and out of the department and must remain in the ED.

Compassionate considerations for palliative or critically ill patients will be the exception to visitor restrictions and at the discretion of the department staff.

Adapting To Climate Change With Laurentian University



Canada is investing in adaptation to climate change, to ensure that families and communities remain strong and safe.

Sudbury MP Paul Lefebvre, and Nickel Belt MP Marc Serré, announced an investment of \$841,000 to Laurentian University to build climate change adaptation capacity among Indigenous communities in Northern Ontario.

Lefebvre says Indigenous communities, particularly in the North, are having to adapt to unprecedented environmental changes that are increasing in speed and severity.

Serre adds through knowledge sharing workshops and tools, this project will help these communities deal with the impacts of climate change today while building capacity to prepare and adapt for the future. The project is co-led by Grand Council Treaty 3 and the Tribal Councils of Mushkegowuk, Matawa, Nokiiwin, Shibogama, and Keewaytinook

Okimakanak. It provides funding for each Tribal Council to recruit a climate specialist who will connect traditional Indigenous knowledge and Western science on matters related to climate change.

The project will also involve community engagement the sharing of knowledge with First Nations communities across the country.

The project is funded through Natural Resources Canada's Building Regional Adaptation Capacity and Expertise (BRACE) Program, a five-year, \$18 million initiative under the Adaptation and Climate Resilience pillar of the Pan-Canadian Framework on Clean Growth and Climate Change.

The BRACE Program works with provinces to support training and knowledge-exchange that increases the ability of organizations, businesses and communities to adapt and accelerate their climate resilience.

Esc La Renaissance Student Presented Governor General's Academic Medal

École Sainte-Anne Students Travel To A 17th-Century Indigenous Village



Students at École Sainte-Anne in Spanish recently traveled through time and discovered the experiences of Canada's first explorers when they visited 17th-century Aboriginal people.

Board communication director Paul de la Riva says in social studies, students in grades 4, 5, and 6 studied the Ojibway peoples and the early explorers.

He adds with this knowledge, they built an interactive trail to represent an Ojibway community and each student built a tipi.

Espanola PUC Wants To Hear From You

Electricity rates are a priority for residents and businesses alike and to that end, Espanola PUC has developed a survey for public input.

Katie Elliot, the utility's corporate communications manager says Espanola Regional Hydro is undertaking its Cost of Service application with the Ontario Energy Board. She says it is a priority since the application, which usually takes place every five years, determines what each local distribution company charge for its distribution rate. She says Espanola has not gone through the process since 2012.

Elliot adds the survey is part of the application, so hearing from the public is important since it will be shared with the OEB.

She adds anyone can take part in the survey in providing feedback on a proposed rate increase.

Recipe

Several years ago, I got this recipe from a cooking show on tv. I like onions in my salads, but sometimes find them strong and overpowering. Marinating



them in a brine, helps to mellow the flavour. They are also great in a sandwich or on a sub.

Ouick Pickled Red Onions

- 2 large red onions
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup red wine vinegar or apple cider vinegar
- Salt and pepper, to taste

Slice onions thinly. You can leave them in rings or cut into half circles. Stuff them into a medium mason jar. In a small pot, combine sugar and vinegar. Bring to a boil and simmer until sugar is dissolved. Add salt and pepper. Pour over onions in the jar until covered. Cover and chill overnight. Keep them sealed in the refrigerator for up to 2 weeks. Drain before using.
