Out-Of-The-Box Entrepreneurism Thrives Amid The Pandemic Chaos

With the economy's hands tied behind its back, entrepreneurs are entrepreneuring like never before. There's already an app to track the COVID-19 virus with an app to test it on the way. There are kits to grow green vegetables at home; remote-care telemedicine has taken a great leap forward.

'Work at home' business models are boosting productivity while driving down costs. In need of a social service from an exhausted government agency? No problem – call Aunt Bertha, a networking start-up company that can lead you through the bureaucratic maze.

Companies that used to make gin have switched their production lines to producing hand sanitizers... something I disagree with very strongly.

Then there are the real hard-core entrepreneurs, those who dare to go where no starter-upper has ever gone before.

Spotting a terrific business opportunity when casinos closed down, Wei Wei and his wife Xiang Yue Chen simply started their own. They converted their lavish \$9-million stone mansion in Markham, Ontario into an extravagant gaming club complete with mah-jong tables, baccarat and slot machines. Their croupiers wore tuxedos.

Ignoring the casino's "By Invitation Only" policy, 92 York Regional Police officers raided the 20,000-square-foot fortress and confiscated eleven firearms, \$1 million in cash and \$1.5 million in

Now, to reduce the threat of a virus breakout at their foreign destinations they've created a very nice, \$3580 sky excursion that doesn't go anywhere at all. They just take off and fly around for a few hours gazing at the countryside and return to where they started. If they don't call this the "Boomerang Express" I'm no judge of marketing minds. Air Canada is just dying to take you nowhere for several thousand dollars but so far they can't figure out how to lose your luggage.

At no time in the last eight months has innovation made a greater impact than within the walls of food and drink establishments.

While many restaurants have thrived by delivering dinners from on-line orders, Germany's pro tennis player Laura Siegemund ordered her meal 'on-court!' In the middle of her match against Spain's Paula Badosa, she forked down a plate of

Dominion Command Plans For Remembrance Day/Poppy Campaign

Royal Canadian Legions across Canada will host different Remembrance Day ceremonies this year due to COVID-19.

Dominion Command has put out a protocol for Legions to follow in marking November 11th, which include for the first time ever, spectators will be discouraged from attending in person, due to the limited space and requirement to physically distance.

The head office is also stating there will be reduced colour parties, no parades and wreaths will be pre-positioned rather than laid out by participants.

Vandalism Literally Takes Food Out Of The Mouth Of Families

The Food for Families Program was introduced for the first time in Espanola this Spring, but vandals destroyed the final crop.

Volunteer Ruth Steedman says the Espanola Community Garden on Algoma Street was vandalized on Friday, September 19th with produce trampled, pulled out and some consumed by whoever did it.

Six families in need have now lost out on the final crop of the season.

She says a report was made to the Manitoulin OPP and

the group of volunteers who oversee the program will be approaching the Espanola council to give them an update on the activities on site.

In regards to funding, they are looking at various funding sources that would be available for community gardens.

Steedman adds this was the first year for the program, which had good success throughout the last few months, but stakeholders will be working over the winter to ensure enhanced security will be available for the 2021 planting season.

Missing Person Case Remains Open - New Info Being Sought – Meagan Pilon

A missing Sudbury woman with strong ties to Espanola would be 23 this month. Greater Sudbury Police Constable Kaitlyn Dunn says the police agency is seeking new information about

Meagan Pilon. She says September marked seven years that Meagan has been missing adding she was 15 years old when she disappeared and this month would have been her 23rd

birthday.

Dunn says Meagan was last seen by her father, Marc Pilon, on September 11, 2013 in the New Sudbury area.

Pilon and her family have close ties to Espanola and the initial searches involved the Espanola and Manitoulin Island area.

Dunn says the investigation has been active over the past seven years and police remain committed to finding answers in relation to her disappearance.

Dunn says they have released an age-enhanced composite of Meagan and are urging individuals to come forward with any new information, no

matter how small or irrelevant they feel it may be.

Meagan is described as 5'10" tall, around 140 lbs., with dark hair and hazel eyes. Meagan has a small scar on her right upper lip area.

We enlisted the assistance of a Forensic Artist with the Ontario Provincial Police and we are releasing an age-enhanced composite of what Meagan may look like today at the age of 23. Tips to Reduce Food Waste

Did you know that 30-40% of our food supply becomes food waste?! When we consider the land, water, labour, energy and other inputs used in producing, processing, transporting, preparing, storing, and disposing of this discarded food - PHEWF! - the impacts are astronomical. Not to mention that food waste is the single largest component in municipal landfills, generating the third largest source of methane in North America. So what can we do to help? Here are a few tips:

1. Take stock of what you have before heading to the grocery store. This way you can avoid buying things you might already have hiding at the back of your cupboard!
2. Store products correctly by using your humidity-controlled produce drawers in your refrigerator, keeping counter produce out of direct sunlight or heat, and storing bread in airtight containers.
3. Preserve what's in season by freezing, drying, canning, or pickling fresh foods! Grew more cucumbers than you can eat? Pickle them! Blueberries growing in your backyard? Freeze them for future muffins and smoothies.
4. Grow your own herbs at home to avoid buying plastic packaged ones that tend to spoil before you use them all.
4. Compost food scraps to avoid sending them to the landfill and to create a nutrient rich soil for your gardens.

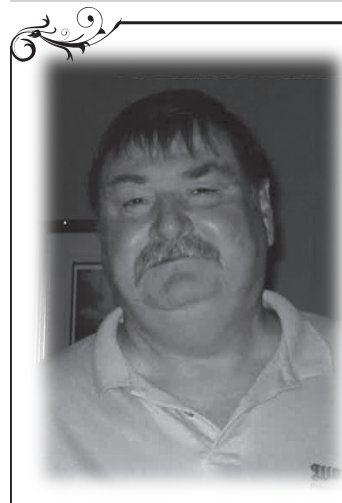

They then moved to a small farm near the quaint little town of Massey, where Carl would marry his life-long companion, raise his family and make lasting friendships. Carl spent the first 9 years of his working career as a milkman for Farquhar's Dairy in Elliot Lake. He then worked briefly in Espanola at the local paper mill (now Domtar), but his love for animals and working the land drew him back to farm life. He spent the remainder of his working career in dairy and beef farming. Like his father, he had a fondness for horses and enjoyed harnessing up his team to take his family and friends for sleigh rides. Carl was very dedicated to church and community service and served on a wide variety of committees, boards and councils, both locally and provincially. In the latter years he would often be found in his wood working shop making treasures for his family. He also enjoyed his getaways to camp, where he spent lots of time relaxing on the deck enjoying the view of the water. For those who knew him best, he will be fondly remembered for his warm smile, his soft and caring heart, his joy in helping a neighbour, his many captivating stories and his natural ability to be witty and humorous. Recipe

I'll admit I was skeptical. I've been making the same meatloaf recipes for years, but the reviews on this recipe were great and I was looking for something easy to make for supper. I'm here to tell you, I was pleasantly surprised. The seasoning in the dressing mix adds a delicious flavour and the breadcrumbs add just the right amount of moisture. This recipe is definitely a keeper.



Stove Top Meatloaf

- 1 box of Stove Top Stuffing (any flavour)
- 1 pound of ground beef
- 2 eggs
- ½ cup of ketchup, or more according to your taste. divided
- ½ cup of water OR ¼ cup milk and ¼ cup water (which I prefer)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees and grease a medium casserole dish or a loaf pan. In a bowl, mix together the stuffing mix, ground beef, eggs, ¼ cup of ketchup (save the rest to brush on the top) and water. Shape mixture into a loaf. Spread loaf with remaining ketchup. You can also use barbecue sauce or a mixture of both. Bake for 45- 60 minutes depending on your oven. Remove from oven. Drain off the fat. Let sit for a couple minutes, slice and serve.
