









Signs, Signs, Everywhere A Sign. Blocking Out The Scenery, Breaking My Mind

So said the Five Man Electric Band, OF AN IDIOT." prophetically.

As civil disobedience sweeps across America and spills over into Canada, as toxic politics paralyze the United States and creep into our elections--I am seeing more hand-held protest signs than ever before. They're everywhere--in newspapers, on TV, all over the Internet. Shockingly, it was just a year ago that the alt-right "Patriots On Guard" were parading at the end of my street with hateful signs aimed at our prime minister and immigrants.

These are not the "Love It Or Leave It" signs of earlier times during protests of the late 60s and 70s. These are not merely public messages that widen the gap between verified truth and alternative facts. These are not only symbols that put more miles between liberals and conservatives. These are hand-written rohr shock test results that say an awful lot about the people shouting and standing under them.

Last week a Canadian Press photo showed a police officer trying to push back an antimask, female protester in Vancouver who was holding a sign that read: "NO. I WILL NEVER WEAR A MASK!." If I'd been standing opposite her, my sign would have read: "OKAY, THEN HOW ABOUT A RESPIRATOR?"

Yet another read "MASKS VIOLATE MY RELIGIOUS FREEDOM." That could be countered with "BUT WHAT ABOUT MY RIGHT NOT TO DIE BY THE BREATH

Cynically, America's most foolish are now burning surgical masks like marshmallows in protest and wearing crocheted masks while smiling through their gaping holes.


One woman wearing a "MuzzleMeNot" T-shirt held a sign that read: "Protect Our Children." If you can figure that one out you're probably higher than Donald Trump Jr was last night while delivering his Republican convention tirade.

Similarly in Madrid, a news photo showed a young woman in sunglasses holding up a sign that reads: "NO VACUNA. NO 5G. NO MASCARILLA."

Loosely translated this means "I will not take the vaccine because it's a trick to plant microchips in my body so that at the next binge-drinking Sangria party, somebody will whisper "Sweet Nothing" in my ear and I'll start dancing like Joe Cocker and barking like a dog. I will not use any 5G mobile networks because that's how China is spreading the virus in order to kill us all and replace our cattle herds with panda bears. I will not wear a mask because statistics show they don't work and also I have the God-given right to infect and possibly kill old people who should be wearing masks to cover up all those wrinkles."

For the record, masks do work in diminishing the spread of the pandemic. Also garlic and hot peppers are not a cure for COVID-19 but when mixed with chunks of fresh tomatoes

and spread over small squares of toast, they can make a lovely little bruschetta.

Children are not immune to COVID-19 and some have died while pets can spread the virus but the incidence is miniscule. Contrary to President Donald Trump's supporters, the pandemic is not a hoax which will disappear after the November 3rd election but hopefully the man who fiddled and farted as 180,000 died from it...will.

As always, humour somehow manages to insert itself into the gloomiest of times. Last week the sign on the front of the Westwood Arena in Toronto read: "WELCOME, BE SAFE, MASKS MANDATORY, STAY 2 METRES FROM OTHERS." And then there are signs that are made to explain signage like "I'M SO ANGRY I MADE A SIGN" and "MY OUTRAGE CAN'T FIT ON THIS SIGN." The one neither side of the

protest can argue with is being held high by an old guy yelling: "MY ARMS ARE TIRED!"

Two signs that cry out frustration are "SO MUCH WRONG, SO LITTLE CARDBOARD" and "YOU KNOW IT'S BAD WHEN A STRAIGHT WHITE GUY IS MARCHING."

Even more exasperating is the photo of a little old lady pushing a walker with the sign: "I CAN'T BELIEVE I STILL HAVE TO PROTEST THIS S#*T!"

There's no political sign more poignant and right now pointing a finger at Belarus than "THE POWER OF THE PEOPLE IS STRONGER THAN THE PEOPLE IN POWER."

The one I like but don't get: "I'M MISSING WIMBLEDON FOR THIS? YOU TANGERINE WANKMAGGOT!"

Strangely, as someone who reads and watches way too much news and is angered by almost all of it, I have never attended a protest march. If ever I do I think one side of my sign would read: "I'M NOT WITH THESE PEOPLE" and on the other side "SERIOUSLY, STOP THE WORLD I WANT TO GET OFF."

was the construction of the new community centre, as well as overseeing the fight against amalgamation of the township, which he won.

He adds Golden was always outgoing, was very knowledgeable and an active volunteer.

Golden was also a veteran, active in his Legion and was especially proud to serve as a member of the Sgt. Charles Golden Rifle Team.

Gorham says a plaque and a tree-planting to mark Golden's passing will be held next month. Golden's cremation and celebration of life will also be held later in the year.

Golden died Sunday after a battle with cancer.

He was 70 years old.

Recipe

These blueberry muffins are buttery, soft, and moist. For that bakery style goodness, top with cinnamon brown sugar streusel. The batter is supposed to be thick, smooth and creamy. The high oven



temperature guarantees tall muffin tops. Thank you again Jo-Anne!

Best Blueberry Muffins with Streusel Topping

Streusel Topping

1/2 cup packed light or dark brown sugar, ½ cup chopped walnuts or pecans, 1 tsp cinnamon

Muffins

- 1 and 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter, softened to room temperature
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1/4 cup packed light or dark brown sugar
- 2 large eggs, at room temperature
- 1/2 cup sour cream or plain/vanilla yogurt, at room temperature
- 2 teaspoons pure vanilla extract
- 1/4 cup milk, at room temperature
- 1 and 1/2 cups fresh or frozen blueberries

Preheat oven to 425°F. Spray a muffin pan with nonstick spray or use cupcake liners. Grease/line a second pan with 2 liners because this recipe yields about 14 muffins. Set aside. Mix all of the streusel ingredients together. Set aside. Whisk the flour, baking soda, baking powder, and salt together in a large bowl. Using a handheld or stand mixer, beat the butter, granulated sugar, and brown sugar together on high speed until smooth and creamy, about 2 minutes. On medium speed, add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat in the sour cream and vanilla extract on medium speed until combined. With the mixer running on low speed, add the dry ingredients and milk into the wet ingredients and beat until no flour pockets remain. Fold in the blueberries. Spoon the batter into liners, filling them all the way to the top. Top each with streusel, gently pressing it down into the surface so it sticks. Bake for 5 minutes at 425 then, keeping the muffins in the oven, reduce the oven temperature to 350°F. Bake for an additional 18-20 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Allow the muffins to cool for 5 minutes in the muffin pan, then transfer to a wire rack to continue cooling. Muffins stay fresh covered at room temperature for a few days or in the refrigerator for up to 1 week.
